FIFTH REEL TO BE ADDED TO TAPE LIBRARY

About one year ago, the officers of the RHAC decided to increase the additions to the tape library from 3 to 4 reels. The tape librarian says that the tape rentals are still going strong and that we could probably do a fifth reel every month. Because of costs, it takes about 7 rentals "break even". Depending on the show, we average 4 to 6 months to break even. As long as the members continue to use the library, we should be able to offer 5 reels a month.

Donations of shows to the club library are always welcome. Full reels or partial reels will be accepted. However, all material is screened before it goes into the library. We will continue to maintain the library sound

quality at the highest level.

A MESSAGE FROM THE TAPE LIBRARIAN

We have members keeping tapes out for the full 30 days. This makes it hard for me to fill other member's orders. They order 10 tapes at a time and then mail or bring them to the meetings. I know that they have not just recorded them the day before the meeting. We provide a means to send back tapes when you finish them, in ones or two 's. For the people who want to keep all ten tapes for the full 30 days, we will put you on a restriction of 4 tapes out at a time. This is the only way we can be fair to all members of the club. With the influx of new members, we have had an increase in use of the tape library. You can order 10 tapes at a time, but send them back as you finish them.

When sending back tapes in groups of two, tape each box as you would when sending back one box, then tape each box together. Thanks for your support of the tape library.

Another hand has to be given to Dr. Frank Chorba (Director of Speech and Radio, Wichita State Univ.) for bringing this subject to light. Dr. Chorba wanted to know the available radio shows with Bela Lugosi. We

hecked our radio logs as we knew we would find many.

To our surprise, only four radio appearances could be found. They are as follows: Suspense-"Doctor Prescribed Death" from 2/2/43; a 1944 pilot show called Mystery House featuring "The Thirsty Death"; a 1947 Candid Microphone; and Tales of Fatima-"The Man In The Shadows" from 9/10/49. Dr. Chorba writes that he has a rare 1937 interview aboard the Queen Mary bound for Europe. Bela Lugosi was a very shy man and did not like to be interviewed for the public.

Bela Ferenc Dezsco Blasko was born on October 20, 1882 in Lugos, Hungary. He first entered acting in 1901 in Budapest. From 1912 to 1919 he worked with the Hungarian National Theater and traveled throughout Europe. He came to America in 1921 and took the name Lugosi from his hometown of

Lugos.

Bela Lugosi was right for the part of Count Dracula in Bram Stoker's novel and he appeared in the role on Broadway from 1923 to 1927 and went on to Hollywood to do the film version in 1931. Count Dracula made him an international star and he received as much mail as any other Hollywood star. Lon Chaney was scheduled to play the lead but his death prior to the filming gave the break to Lugosi.

A bit of irony should be inserted here in this story. Lugosi's birthplace of Lugos, Hungary is in the Transylvania area as is the story

setting of Stoker's novel.

Bela Lugosi never used makeup in any of his horror films and his careful, melodious speech, thick with menace and Hungarian accent, added chill to his acting ability. His film career ran from 1930 to 1948 and

'e was usually typecast in roles like that of Count Dracula.

The 1944 Mystery House series was designed to use Bela Lugosi as host and actor but no record can be found that the series got into production. The show listed above is the only show to be found. The 1949 Tales of Fatima series is not available at present with the exception of one show, "Time to Kill" from 5/28/49.

Bela admitted himself to a California hospital due to drug addiction

in 1955 and died a year later, penniless, on August 16, 1956.

A few words should be said about Count Dracula as everyone associates Bela as the vampire. The legend can be traced to ancient Greece. France, in the 6th century, passed laws against vampirism. By the 17th century the legend had spread throughout Europe. The first movie about vampires was "The Devil's Castle" by Alexander Dumas. It was made in 1896, a silent movie.


Stoker's novel, called "Dracula", was set in Transylvania, in the Carpathian Mountains in the 15th century. The novel was first filmed in Germany in 1922 under the title of "Nosferatu". The meaning of the title is "The Undead" and it featured Max Schreck as Count Orlock. Stoker's widow sued and received judgement for infringements of copyright. Most of the film prints were ordered destroyed.

In 1981, Germany again produced "Nosferatu". It is said to be the most

terror filled of any terror film.

National Public Radio has a revised version of Stoker's novel in production. "Count Dracula" will be aired this summer as will "Frankenstein". We will try to keep you posted of the broadcast dates. Credit must be given to Ralph Albi for the above information and to Dr. Chorba for the idea.

I'm still itching to get an exhibit going at a shopping center this summer. I would like to get our name around so that if anyone has OTR material they would like to pass along to us, they will know who to contact. We will need only a few hard workers to get it off the ground. Let me know if you want to help.
