CHRISTMAS PARTY WAS A BIG SUCCESS




ADDRESS LABELS




Hickok Was A Lousy Shot rehersal (1-r) Sam Edwards, Reid Hansen, George Salem and Tony Larson

CONVENTION NEWS

The RHAC will begin accepting your reservations effective immediately for the Old Time Radio Convention which will be held in Denver on June 7th, 1986. The price per person is \$12.50 and this includes all of the day's activities and a fine buffet dinner.

We are assigning numbers as the reservations and payments are received and those who sign up early will receive seating closer to the dias. We are asking you to commit yourselves to attend the convention this year. We are giving you a lot of advance notice and hope that you will adjust your plans to be with us. Those who were at the convention last year will agree that we all had a great time and this year looks even more entertaining.

If you sign up prior to May 15th the cost will be \$12.50. After that date the cost will be \$15. If you sign up for the convention and for any reason are unable to attend, you will be able to get a full refund up until May 15. If you cancel after that date we will only be able to refund that portion above what we pay for the dinner (Dinner =\$8.50, Refund =\$4.00).

We have done a lot of work already and sincerely hope that you will support our efforts. We have tried to keep the cost as low as possible so that more are able to attend; have planned a full day of great entertainment to make you want to be there; have given you plenty of notice to let you plan accordingly; and have arranged for out of towners to get a room discount if you are attending.

It would be helpful to get your reservations in early so that we can keep the motel informed of the room needed and how many are expected for the dinner. It makes it a lot easier in our planning.

Last year we contacted all those members locally who did not sign up for the convention. We plan on doing the same this year. If you know for sure that you will not be attending we ask you to drop a card to the address listed for sending payment for the convention. This will save us phone calls or mailings since we will be able to cross you off the list. PLEASE NO PHONE CALLS. With all the work that we have to do that would be one small courtesy on your part to save us some time and effort.

The convention is going to be a fantastic day. There will be panel discussions, live dramas, recreations of famous radio skits, trivia quizzes and door prizes (donated), exhibits, buffet dinner, picture and autograph sessions, movies and much more nostalgia. If you missed last year you missed a wonderful time but if you miss this year you will be missing a really great event. There is no guarantee that we will be able to do this every year so you won't want to miss this one.

We will be setting aside some seating for senior citizens, visually impaired OTR fans, complimentary guests and media so you better order your seats early or wind up behind the water cooler if you wait too long.

The RHAC has committed itself to provide you with an exceptional convention and we hope that our members and friends will commit themselves to support it. Those who will be here to entertain you and those who will be working hard behind the scenes deserve your support.

For those of you from outside the Denver area, the Quality Inn Downtown has given us convention rates of \$35 per night. We hope that you might plan your vacation in the Rocky Mountain area and start it off by attending our convention. We do not have the manpower to assist you in your hotel reservations or transportation but you can contact the Quality Inn at (303) 433-6677. Please be sure to tell them you are attending the convention and are with the RHAC to get the discounted rate. Once you are sure you will be able to attend you may want to make your hotel reservations since it is a popular motel and summer vacations will be starting. By the way, the hotel has a wonderful balcony right off the ballroom with a great panarama of the city so bring your camera.

TUNING IN . . . Colorado Springs

A few days ago I received the disappointing news that The Old Time Radio show, hosted by Kevin Shields on KRCC for almost six years, will be cancelled in January. Kevin had been host of the show since February, 1980 and over the years OTR in Colorado Springs had attained a wide listenership. The reasons for the show's cancellation (according to the management) had to do with "not enough support" for Old Time Radio. From my knowledge of the KRCC management's modus operandi, not enough support means that during the last "membership drive" (i.e. fund-raising marathon broadcast), not enough pledges were called in during the OTR program, and in the final count, not enough money was donated in the name of Old Time Radio. In addition, KRCC's overall goal of \$30,000 was not reached in the allotted time (three weeks). I highly suspect this figured into KRCC's decision to dump Kevin's show.

One source of daily bread for public radio and television stations exists in contributions to those stations by listeners and viewers. Make no mistake about it, folks, that's a hard and heavy fact of broadcast life. Other sources of income for broadcasters are foundation grants and individual underwriters. We, however, by our generous donations, do our part to help pay the station's bills. If we don't donate enough, some of what we listen to (or watch) goes down the tubes. I've seen it happen at various public radio stations over the years. OTR in Colorado Springs will be one of the victims of this circumstance.

There is hope, however: Another station I know of could, perhaps <u>may</u>, rescue Old Time Radio and Kevin Shields from becoming total radio history. I'm not at liberty to give details yet, but . . . let us pray.

Marilyn and I totally enjoyed the RHAC Christmas party at Brandy Chase on Saturday the 14th. We had the Colorado Springs Chapter Christmas party at our house the following Tuesday. One reason to be jolly in this season of jollity is the RHAC catalog for the visually impaired (a.k.a. the Readers Catalog For Blind Members/on cassettes) is completed at last and ready to copy for RHAC members in need of this information.

The coming year, 1986, promises to be an eventful one for our chapter. Watch for more details as the months pass. A happy and fruitful New Year to one and all in RHAC.
