BRYAN: Listen to Benny Goodman...the King of Swing...

PEARSON: D'ya like to smoke?

BENNY:

GOOD EVENING AND WELCOME TO THE SATURDAY NIGHT CAMEL
CARAVAN WITH A SPECIAL "HELLO" TO YOU PEOPLE WHO ARE
STAGING NEW YEARS EVE CELEBRATIONS. TONTOHT WE'RE
GOING TO REVERSE THE USUAL ORDER OF THINGS. USUALLY WE
INVITE YOU TO SIT AROUND THE MICROPHONE. TONIGHT WE'RE
GOING TO ASK YOU TO INVITE US TO YOUR PARTY. HOW ABOUT IT?
(PAUSE)

DO YOU HEAR ANY ANSWERS TED PEARSON?

TED:

Yeah, boy. I hear a lot of them Benny. And now that we're all guests at parties from Coast to Coast, Benny and the boys start their contribution to the fun with a Fletcher Henderson arrangement of Irving Berlin's "Blue Skies".

(BAND: _._._."BLUE_SKIES")

(APPLAUSE)

PEARSON:

Of course when we moved in on your party tonight we brought our sweeter than sweet Mildred Bailey. Along.

And in appreciation of your hospitality - Mildred sings a little biographical sketch, written especially for her.. It's called "Born to Swing."

(BAILEY AND BAND: "BORN TO SWING" . . .)

(APPLAUSE)

(PREVIOUSLY APPROVED FOR NOVEMBER 25 BUT NOT USED)

BRYAN: : When a product becomes a favorite there must be some reason why it rates the number one position. Take the cigarette field, for example. Why do smokers prefer Camels to other cigarettes?

(APPLAUSE)

PEARSON :

MISTER B.G. -- it's time you introduced the sextette to all

those people who are giving parties tonight.

BENNY:

THE BOYS ARE KINDA BASHFUL ABOUT TALKING, SO THE SEXTETTE

WILL MAKE ITS BOW IN A MUSICAL WAY. BUT BEFORE WE PLAY

I'D LIKE YOU TO MEET THEM:

LIONELL HAMPTON, ON THE VIBRAHARP

CHARLIE CHRISTIAN, GUITAR

NICK FATOOL, DRUMS

ARTHUR BURNSTEIN, BASS

AND OUR NEW PIANIST, JOHNNY GUARNIERI.

(APPLAUSE)

BRYAN:

BENNY: I CERTAINLY DO, TED.

PEARSON: You know, folks, each year "Down Beat" - a trade magazine for musicians has a popularity poll. The voting just finished a few days ago - and at the top of the list was Benny Goodman!

(APPLAUSE)

BENNY: AND MY MOST SINCERE THANKS TO ALL YOU FANS WHO VOTED FOR US. THE BOYS AND MYSELF SINCERELY APPRECIATE IT.

PEARSON: In fact, the Camel radio bands did very well in the voting. Benny Goodman placed <u>first</u> and Bob Crosby, <u>third</u>!

THIS TIME IT REALLY IS "GOODBYE". TONIGHT'S BROADCAST.

S'long Geedbys, Benny -- and the best of Rusk to you! Thanks for the privilege of working with you. Remember folks -- Next Saturday, at this same time, listen to Bob Crosby and his band with Mildred Bailey. And Bob will have a guest -- none other than his brother Bing Crosby. This is Ted Pearson saying -- "Goodbye."

BRYAN:

Next Monday night, listen to Blondie -- the Bumsteads are having a little party at their home and you're invited.

And next Saturday, at this time, on this station, hear Bob Crosby and Mildred Bailey -- and Bob's special guest this is theory. Bryan paying -- his brother Bing. And remember, too, that for cooler, milder smoking -- it's Camels. Penny for penny, Camels are your best cigarette buy.
