Recently, at Madison Square Garden, New York, Tilden made headline news. From the West came twenty-two year old Ellsworth Vines, former National champion and Davis Cup star, to appear for the first time as a professional. Facing Vines was Tilden, nearly twenty years his senior. Few doubted the young California athlete's ability to defeat the older man. Nevertheless an audience of sixteen thousand people gathered to watch the play. This was the biggest crowd ever to witness an American tennis match. What happened? Let us picture it for you.

but to us it sounds as though she knew her tennis.
For Tilden's game that night in Madison Square Garden
was a truly amazing exhibition of stamina, skill and
nerve. Refusing to bow to the youthful strength of a
brilliant rival, the 41 year old tennis master proved
his right to be called one of the greatest iron men
