PROGRAM: SMOKE RINGS

SORRY:

So do I...Listen Mr. O'Kiffy...the present situation is not to my liking...I'm a jake of all trades...working my fingers to the bone...to the helbow...nobody helps me...

CHUCK:

Mac, I'd like to help you but I can't help it if I'm lazy... Y'see, I take after my father...my father won't work...he refuses to go to work...he WILL NOT work...It's really wonderful the will power that runs in our family....

SORRY:

So...you're a chip off the old blockhead, eh?...

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MAC:

Yes sir...Mac...he's a lazy man...My father believes that no man should ever get up and go to work as long as he's got the strength to lie in bed...

SONIA:

So that's just like my own father...He won't work either...

OLIVIA:

How long has he been out of work?...

SONIA:

I don't know exactly...we lost his birth certificate...

OLIVIA:

Well Mac...there's only one man in our family who works hard...That's Uncle Time...Uncle Tim will be a great help to you here in the tourist camp...He left New York two days ago...He should be here any minute...

BEE:

TELEPHONE RINGS

OLIVIA:

Hello?...Chateau Hamburger...Oh, it's you Uncle Tim... Where are you?...I know you're standing up at the bar... but never mind the details...What town are you in...What town?...Listen...take that salami out of your mouth...I can't understand you...

SONIA:

Plizz...I'll talk with him the directions...Hullo hullo... Uncle Tim...Look...find Route 27...and you'll see the sign... OUR sign...the Chateau Burger...Burger...

OLIVIA:

No Mac...not Burger...HAMburger...

SONIA:

Plizz Plizz...who's talking about ham...Look Uncle Tim... you've got to make the beds in the cabins...I've done everything else...Where are you...Oh...Boston...So I'll make the beds...Goodbye...

BEE:

PHONE CLICKS

SOUND OF AUTOMOBILE MOTOR APPROACHING...HORNS



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SCHEP: Hey, Mr. O'Kiffy...look...here comes a customer...

CHIEFF: That's not a customer...that's Ted Husing...

HUSING: (VERY GAILY) Hello Walter...

CHIEFF: Hello Ted...

HUSING: Well Walter, I heard all about your auto camp here...I heard you've got a hundred acres, a thousand cars a day drive in, you've got twenty cabins, and you're making five hundred dollars a week...

SCHEP: Yes...that's right...but you got the details a little mixed...It isn't a hundred acres...it's one acre...and it isn't a thousand cars a day...it's five hundred...it isn't twenty cabins...it's four...and it isn't five hundred dollars a week...it's two hundred...

YOU OPENED MY EYES (ANNETTE HANSHAW)

(O'KEEFE AD LIBS INTRODUCTION OVER MUSIC)

HUSTON:

TO BE INSERTED

MUSIC:

LOVE IS THE THING (ORCHESTRA AND HUNT)

VON ZIEGL:

and now, ladies and gentlemen...we return you once more to
Walter O'Keefe's tourist camp...the Chateau Hamburger on
Route 27...you can't miss it...

RIZ:

MENDELSON'S "SPRING SONG"...COWS MOO...

HORN HONKING...MOTORS WHIZZING BY AS ON HIGHWAY...

SORIN:

(SINGING)

Just a hecho...Yoo hoo...

In the valley...yoo hoo...

But it's thrilling me to pieces...how's wit you?

Just a hecho...yoo hoo...(ECHO GOES SOUR)



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WILLIAM ESTY: McGillicuddy you're all right but the echo is off key...
Well Mac...another day is past and the stables still need
grooming...

WILLIAM ESTY: Well Huncle Tim...now there's a groomer for you...Uncle
Tim will be here any minute...I think I hear him coming
down the road...

WILLIAM ESTY: TELEPHONE BELL RINGS

RECEIVER LIFTS ON HOOK

WILLIAM ESTY: Chateau Hamburger...What?...Guess who this is?...Guess?...
Well I recognize the voice but I can't place the hiccup...
Oh, it's you Uncle Tim...Where are you?...What?...Take
that road map out of your mouth...I can't understand you...
Oh, you're in Hartford, Connecticut...In the Public
Library...Ummh...Well pick up that book you just spilled...
Tell the librarian to give you one more beer and hurry up...
It's still Route 27...You can't miss it...Goodbye...

O'KEEFE:

Hey McGillicuddy...look out for those dishes will you?...

DOWN:

Well, don't blame me...Uncle Tim was supposed to wash the dishes...

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Never mind about Uncle Tim...he just telephoned and he was only two miles away...Hey McGillicuddy, give that guy at the counter a check for his hamburger...

JACK: (FADING IN) Hey look, wise guy...nobody ain't giving nobody no check for nuttin'...seeeee?....

O'KEEFE: Ah...a college boy, eh?...

JACK: No...I'm one-round Hogan...the Hackensack killer...the Hoboken hurricane...two hundred pounds of fightin' fury... want to make anything of it?...

O'KEEFE: Heeee...Listen Dracula...You can't scare us...we're not afraid of you, are you McGillicuddy?...

DORIN: Please Mr. O'Kiffy...
