Say Von Zell....Harry...Listen..the baby....my baby ...
is four weeks old today and I gave him a bath....Boy...
did he get a thrill?.....

WON ZELL: A bath, eh? Well why don't you give yourself a thrill like that?....

O'KEEFE: You don't understand...I put him in the tub...and when he hit that water his little legs started kicking...he swung those powerful arms around...and you may not believe this Harry but he swam two inches...Was I proudi...and it isn't because I'm his father either...

VON ZELL: Oh no!!!

O'KEEFE: But he swam TWO inchesi.....Isn't that wonderfult.....

MAN 1; Did you ever see anything ---

MAN 2: Yay -- Pepper Martin! Martin!

(CROWD EFFECT AND AD LIB OUT SHARPLY)

HUSING: But there was more to come: the A's continue to threaten -the seventh inning rolls around -- Pepper Martin at bat -he singles cleanly, he then steals second base, burning the
path with amazing fleetness! He dashes to third on an
infield out! Then, Manager Street calls for the squeeze
play, a bunt is laid down, and Pepper Martin whirls over
the plate with the second run! Yes, that day Pepper Martin
ran the proud Athletics into the grounds And he continued
to do so throughout the big money match, which closed with
John L. Martin a co-holder of the all time World Series!
hitting record.

HUSING: (CONT'D) Pepper Martin still has that speed and staying power, as today's averages show, so on matters of wind and endurance he speaks with authority, And this is what Pepper Martin thinks about smoking, and keeping in condition:
