JANIS: YOU bet!...

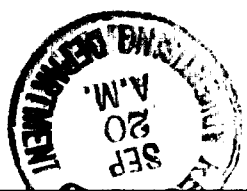

Wonderfull!

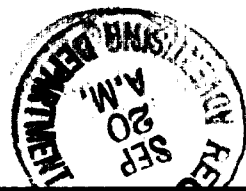
BIZ: **KNOCK ON DOOR**
