

One week from tonight. We'll be glad to see you in person if you're in the vicinity. And wherever you are along the network .. we'll be glad to have you listening to the Camel Caravan. Until we meet again, this is Vaughn Monroe .. wishing you pleasant dreams .. and .. won't you have a Camel?
