NELSON: Let's say hello to the singing star of our show!

APPLAUSE

MONROE: Thank you - and a warm welcome, to our Camel Caravan Christmas program. Here in New York, the avenues are lined with shop windows full of finery. Lights twinkle. Bells jingle. Young people, home from school, make Manhattan like a great college campus. And everywhere we look, we find - the Christmas tree. Tonight - we are

trimming our Christmas tree. With music!

NELSON: High up among its branches, Vaughn places first a song which has been associated with Caravan Christmas programs, and with Vaughn Monroe, for eight years. "Let It Snow."

MONROE:

Another string of colored lights - a little more snow - and we're ready for the next decoration on our musical Christmas tree. Wayne?

NELSON:

Coming right up out of the box, Pappy. And it's something for the children:

NELSON:

The background for a Christmas tree is always a matter for family discussion. We'd like to place ours- in your imagination - near a big open fireplace...where red stockings hang - and a Yule log burns. Into the firelight steps Vaughn Monroe with - "The Christmas Song."

MUSIC:

MONROE: When it's time to trim the tree at my house, I've noticed that each member of the family has a favorite ornament.

NELSON: The girls always like the delicate ones - the most fragile, the better.

MONROE: Right, Wayne. And here comes Sally Sweetland, true to form...with a dedicate touch for our musical tree.

Sally chooses "The Sandman Song" from Hansel and Gretel.
