- 10 NOLA: You know, that's the first thirty-word sentence I ever heard with 63 grammatical errors in it? I never would have believe---
- 11 SOUND: DOOR CHIME

- 1 FIB: COME IN!
- 2 SOUND: DOOR OPEN.
- 3 MOL: Well, for goodness sake... Doctor Gumble!
- 4 FIB: Hi, Patso.
- 5 MOL: Come in, Doctor.
- 6 DOC: Thank you, my dear. (DOOR CLOSE) Hello, Baldy.
- 7 FIB: WHELDYE MAN, "BALDY"? I got more hair 's I ever had in my life.
- 8 DOC: I was referring not so much to the outside of your head, egg face, but the inside, I'll bet it's as bare and shiny as a third rail.
- 9 FIB: Doctor, did you come into my little home merely to insult me?
- 10 DOC: Yes.
- 11 FIB: Good!! Set down and have a cigar and let's get at it. No don't! We ain't got time.
- 12 MOL: We're on our way to a party, Doctor.
- 13 DOC: At La Trivia's?
- 14 FIB: Yeah....how'd you know?
- 15 DOC: He asked me to stop by here and invite you.
- 16 FIB: YOU MEAN HE HAIN'T BEEN INVITED BEFORE, NO-ALRIGHT
- 17 DOC: That's it, Butterthumb. He's going to show his home movies that he took this summer, and he knew you'd want 'em, but he thought Molly might be around.

- 1 MOLA Oh, I'd love it, Doctor. Now that it's official, I'll

- 4 MOLA Mrs. J. Withers Potlock!....isn't she that wealthy woman
who raises horses just outside of town? The one that
gives so much to the Community Chest they can't close
the lid.
- 5 FIB: Yeah...she's got so much dough you'd think everybody'd
hate her....but everybody likes her.
- 6 DOC: Very nice woman...I've treated her for saddle blisters.
Well...see you at the party, children. Seven o'clock
and -
- 7 SOUND: DOOR CHIME.
- 8 MOLA Hm! I wonder who this is. COME IN!
- 9 SOUND: DOOR CHIME.
- 10 FIB: WELL....PUT A PAIR OF WHEELS ON MY STEIN AND CALL ME
ROBERT B. LEE! IF it ain't Tenny. COME ON IN, SIS....!!..
- 11 MOLA Hello there, Tenny.

1 DOC: Hello, Teeny.

2 TEE: Hi, Ma Ma...Hi, Doctor Gable. Gee, I guess maybe I
3 wasn't come in, I guess...you're all dressed up for a
4 party or some'n.

5 ~~SOUND:~~ DOOR CLOSE

6 TEE: Oh, we got a few minutes, kid. You know Doctor Gable,
7 eh?

8 TEE: Sure I do, I betcha. He was at our house when the stork
9 brought me.

10 DOC: I believe I was, at that, Teeny. I have kind of a
11 knack for being on hand for things like that.

12 TEE: Sure. But you slipped up the night the stork brought
13 Willie Toops. They had to take a taxicab over to the
14 hospital to find you.

15 DOC: Well, I always --

16 TEE: Hey...Doctor Gable....Hey.

17 DOC: Yes, Teeny?

- 1 TEE: Look. Howja like to make a deal?
- 2 FIB: Watch it, sis. I've made deals with this guy before.
You'll be lucky to come out with all our bicuspids.
- 3 MOL: Oh, McGee...
- 4 DOC: Pay no attention to him, Teeny. As the world's greatest
chiseller, he's never found out that a chisel is only
good when it gets hit on the head! What's the deal?
- 4 TEE: Well...(GIGGLES) Maybe it's kinda still,...maybe...but...
well, I've always wanted a lit-ul brother, so...well I'll
trade you my tricycle which all it needs is a little
fixing like two new wheels and one handlebar if you'll
bring me a lit-ul baby brother. Hm? Willja do it? Hm?
Willja? Hm? Please?
- 5 DOC: I...er...AWASHURGH...I...er. You wouldn't settle for
a sister?
- 6 TEE: (FIRMLY) Nope. Brother or nothing.
- 7 FIB: First deal.
- 8 MOL: If you want that tricycle you'd better get busy, Doctor.
- 9 DOC: I'll do what I can, Teeny. But I make no promises, you
understand. I'll have to find out what kind of a stork
the stork-keeper has in stock. You have to go now!

- 1 THE: Sure. I and Willie Toops are going to a birthday party tonight and I gotta go down to Kromer's Drug Store and get my costume back.
- 2 FID: Kromer been wearing your costume, sis?
- 3 THE: (GIGGLES) No. I left it there to be fixed, I betcha.
- 4 DOC: I didn't know Kromer repaired fancy dress costumes, Teeny.
- 5 MCL: What kind of a costume was it, Teeny and what's Mr. Kromer doing to it?
- 6 THE: Well...it was a devil costume....I wear on Halloweens and I got the tail tore off in a revolving door. (GIGGLES)
- 7 FID: What w'da you think Kromer's Drug Store would fix it?
- 8 THE: They got a sign up that says so. It says "WE REPAIR SPIRITS". I better go and see about it. So long, everybody.

9 SOUND: DOOR SLAM

10 SOUND: "THE BEST THINGS FOR YOU"

11 (APPLAUSE)

RED SPOT:

- 1 SOUND: WALKING ON SIDEWALK, PAISE INSIDE --
- 2 MEL: You say you've already seen those home movies that the Mayor is showing tonight, McGee?
- 3 FIB: Yeah...and boy, are they awful!!! Look like they ^hd been took thru a hole in a rubber boot from the back of a bouncing jeep.
- 4 MEL: Oh well....home movies and babies...if they're your own they're wonderful!
- 5 FIB: Yeah....La Trivia's no proof of 'em no if they were Darryl Zanuck's life work. And I'M gonna try to persuade him not to show 'em.
- 6 MEL: Why, for goodness sake?
- 7 FIB: Well, with the Governor here tonight, I don't think,....
Oh, oh! Here's La Trivia's house. Pretty fancy oh! Bet he put out more dough to keep that brass knocker shined than we do for FHA payments.
- 8 MEL: Well...he's independently wealthy, dearie. His family had money.
- 9 FIB: I always resent a politician with inherited money. Makes it too hard to accuse him of larceny. (FOOTSTEPS UP ON PORCH) Well....here we are.
- 10 SOUND: KNUCKLE...DOOR OPENS
- 11 BILL: (ENGLISH) Yeah? You wished?

- 1 MOL: No. We knocked.
- 2 FIB: Guests of the Mayor, Buster. Mr. and Mrs. McGee.
- 3 BILL: Oh, yes. Quite. I was about to suggest that you wipe your feet before entering...but as I have been requested to show you every courtesy, one foot a piece will be sufficient...thank you...please come in!
- 4 SOUND: DOOR CLOSE
- 5 BILL: Your hat and coat, ---?
- 6 MOL: Certainly they're his hat and coat. You think he just rents 'em for parties?
- 7 BILL: I was merely suggesting, madam, that I take his hat and coat...and your wrap, Madam.
- 8 FIB: Here you are, Jeeps. Give him your coat, kiddo. I'll take the checks.
- 9 BILL: Checks will not be necessary, sir. Follow me, please... Dinner will be served almost immediately.
- 10 MUSIC: SWEEP BRIDGE...INTO LAUGHTER...CONVERSATION...GLASSING...CLINK OF GLASSES...END...
- 11 FIB: Boy that was good cherry cobbler, wasn't it, Mrs. Petlock?

- 1 ELVIA: Don't know, Mr. McGee...never eat sweets. Thrown
me off my feed and I can't go the distance. Look
like you could use a few early morning work outs
yourself. Ever clock yourself for a quarter mile?
- 2 FIG: Nope. Just for short sprints. Like to the dinner
table and back. HEY, MOLLY....YOU MET MRS.
PEYLOCK? (CLINK OF DINNER AND CONVERSATION IN B.G.)
- 3 MEL: (SLIGHTLY OFF) Yes indeed...SHE'S invited us out to
her farm one of these days....and I'd love to go!

- 1 ELVIA: You do that, Molly. It's only about five miles and three furlongs past the old brewery. You and your groom come ' on out and put on the feed bag with me. Any day. About one o'clock is past time for the parade to the mayor.
- 2 FIB: Put us down as an entry, sis.
- 3 ELVIA: Spetkin' of eatin', Molly...I been watching your boy's performance tonight and I'd give him a 20 thousand colory handker. with no apprentice allowance. He busted out of the gate with a fork in each hand...moved over to the rail with knife and spoon...went into the back stretch with grey flyin' and come under the wire leadin' by three cherry cobblers!
- 4 MUSIC: ORCH...PRIZE BRIDGE...FACE INTO VOICES...LAUGHTER...
- 5 FIB: Hey, that was a wonderful dinner, La Trivia.
- 6 GALE: Thank you, McGee...I noticed you seemed to be enjoying it.
- 7 MEL: I'm surprised he didn't ask the butler to wrap up a few pieces of that cherry cobbler to take home for the dog, Mr. Mayor.
- 8 GALE: I didn't know you had a dog....
- 9 FIB: For that, I'd get one, boy. That cherry cob...HEY, LOOK... ABOUT THEM MOVIES OF YOURS, LA TRIV...take my advice and don't....
- 10 MEL: (FADE IN) SAY, MISTER MAYOR...You're wanted on the phone..

- 1 GALE: Oh...thank you very much, Wilcox...(FADE)...excuse me,
folks.
- 2 FIB: (GALE) Hey...LARRY...TAKE MY ADVICE AND DON'T...show
them movies because....
- 3 MOL: Nice party isn't it, Mr. Wilcox?...Moise...help Mr.
Wilcox set up the projector.
- 4 WIL: Oh no...thanks,.. Pal... I can handle it myself.
- 5 FIB: As lease give you a hand, Junior...there's very little to
know about a movie projector that I'M thoroughly familiar
with...here...I'll -
- 6 MOL: CAREFUL MOOSE...YOU'LL DROP IT!!!
- 7 FIB: Don't worry...I know what I'M --
- 8 SOUND: HEAVY CRASH.....
- 9 FIB: Boy am I clumsy!..(LAUGHS) Busted is it, Junior? Can't
show the movies?
- 10 WIL: No... no, it seems to be all right, Pal. These are very
sturdy machines. I better carry it myself though. You
plug this cord...into the light socket..even you can
handle that!
- 11 MOL: What odds are you giving?
- 12 FIB: How'd you get to be so expert with a movie projector,
Junior?
- 13 WIL: At the office. We show Pat Milk films to the audience
every week. Had a dandy double feature this afternoon.
The first one was titled: "YOUR CRASH", or, "YOU'LL GO
HAW ABOUT PAT MILK IN YOUR CUPPER".

- 1 MIL: Sounds like quite an epic. How did the critics rate it?
- 2 WIL: It was rated "Evsapo".
- 3 FIB: Evsapo - Rated! Oh brother!
- 4 WIL: And the other feature was called: "TREASURY AGENT," or, "THEY THOUGHT SHE HAD A HIDDEN INCOME BECAUSE SHE ALWAYS COOKED WITH DOUBLE-RICH PET MILK".
- 5 FIB: What was the picture about, Junior? Let's go all the way with this. Conditions are perfect; New sponsor... co-operative comedian...gabby announcer...short script... tell us, boy!

- 7 MCL: Well, plug in the movie machine, McGee. I'M anxious to
see the pictures.
- 8 FIB: I ain't. And if I could get a word in edgeways with
La Trivia about these movies, I'll bet....oh good...
here he comes!
- 9 MCL: Who's the distinguished man with his? With the red
ribbon across his chest and all the merit badges?
- 10 FIB: I dunno. I suppose he's...

- 1 GALE: (FADE IN) Ah there you are, McGee. Well, I don't think you and McGee have met the Flagerian Ambassador, Mr. Frawdopsky, Mr. and Mrs. McGee.
- 2 FIB: Hiyah, Mac.
- 3 MIL: How do you do. I'M sure.
- 4 FLAG: I take wery deep pleasure to say how you do. For case like this, waden I kiss the hand...(SMACK)
- 5 MIL: Oh...my goodness...that tickles!
- 6 FLAG: And for you, sir, I took your fist in my fist and we shook....da!
- 7 GALE: Mr. Frawdopsky is a great statesman in his own country. He is so beloved by his people they've only tried to assassinate him five or six times.
- 8 FIB: Don't sound to me like they were trying very hard. How are things back home, Buster?
- 9 FLAG: Back home in Flageria, sir, is things not so hot. Everything is aganet...nuything is fyor!!! For a every citizen in Flageria...we have watching him four secret police!! Pretty soon, if everything goes good...we have SEED police! for every citizen...then seven..then ten...then..NO citizens...EVENYBODY IS policemen!! Then I go back....run for president...shoot all policemen...then everybody is citizen again...and we start over. DA!
- 10 MIL: Very sensible. How do you like America, sir?

- 9 MOL: McGoo!!! What did you do?

1 FIB: (HASTILY) Looks like I musta blew a fuse, kiddo. (LAUGHS)
(UP) ALL RIGHT PEEPS!...DON'T BE ALARMED....JUST BLOW
A FUSE, WE'LL HAVE IT FIXED IN JUST A COUPLE OF HOURS...
(LAFFS)

3 ATTN:

- 1 GALE: All right, everybody...if you'll find chairs...we're about to show the movies...
- 2 SOUND: MURMUR OF VOICES...SCRAMBLE FOR CHAIRS...
- 3 FIB: Look, La Triv...willya listen to me a minute?
- 4 GALE: Certainly, NoGee. What is it?
- 5 FIB: I don't think you oughta show these pictures because -
- 6 GALE: Wait a minute...Governor Argabrite doesn't seem to be able to find a chair (PALE) BE RIGHT WITH YOU, GOVERNOR!!...
- 7 MOL: You don't seem to be having any luck talking to the Mayor, dearie.
