2 SOUND: SMALL TINKLING NOISES, BEHIND

3 FIB: (HAPPILY) Boyoboy, this clock is comin' apart just swell!
Hand me the big screwdriver, Molly!

4 MOL: (PLEADING) No, McGee - Please let that poor little clock
up! It hasn't done anything to you! Take your knee out of
it's face!

5 FIB: Ah-ha, don't you worry, kiddo. Lemme see now, if this
rinkus holds the mainspring, then this flumpus here must
be -

6 SOUND: WHANGOO! ...BUEE...CLATTER!

7 MOL: Oh dear...

8 FIB: (HAPPILY) Yes sir, by George, I was right. That WAS the
flumpus that held the rinkus to the mainspring...Well, I'll
put that aside for now. Put it back together again later.
What else is there to be fixed?

9 MOL: NOTHING!!!

- 1 FIB: where's the card table Aunt Sarah sent us for
Christams! The one that the legs on it work so good,
that if I loosen 'em up a little they'll work even better?
- 2 MCL: I hid it!!!
- 3 FIB: where?
- 4 MCL: You'll never know, Mr. Fixit. Not t'll it really NEEDS
fixing.
- 5 FIB: Awaw come on, kiddie - that ain't the right attitude.
Here I am with a handful of tools and nothin' to fix.
Gee whiz, I -
- 6 SOUND: DOOR CREAKS
- 7 MCL: COME IN, THANK GOODNESS!!!
- 8 SOUND: DOOR OPENS
- 9 TEE: Hi, mister McGee - Hi, Mrs McGee.
- 10 FIB: Oh hello there, Teeny.
- 11 MCL: Come on in, Teeny.
- 12 FIB: Well, nice to see you, sis - haven't seen you since
Christams. Santa Claus good to you this year?
- 13 TEE: Sure, he was wonderful to me, I betcha - but gee am I
ever glad Christams is over! I was just worn out!
- 14 FIB: Worn out? From shopping?
- 15 TEE: No - from bein' good for two whole weeks! It was
awful!..... I was so glad when Christams was over, I
went out and broke every window in our garage.

- 1 FIB: You did, eh? Well, whadja got for Christmas, Teeny -
lotta nice stuff?
- 2 TEE: Oh sure - ... I gotta new doll buggy ...anda lotta books
anna kiskey mouse rickwatch anna lil bott-le of
perfume from Willie Toops that my daddy says three
drops of that would eat the lock off the county jail
anna sled anna - HEY, THAT REMINDS ME!
- 3 FIB: What reminds you of what, Teeny?
- 4 TEE: My sled. It reminds me of you.
- 5 FIB: Yeah...I can see where it would...I been going downhill
for sometime now and -
- 6 TEE: No, no, no...I mean on account of you're so wonderful
at fixing stuff, and gee the way you fix us kids toys
when they get busted is just WUNDERFUL, and you're so
nice to lit-tul children, and I betcha you're the best
fixer in the whole world and Hey will you fix my sled,
sister? It don't run good.
- 7 FIB: (HEARTILY) WHY SURE, SID - SINCE YOU PUT IT THAT WAY!
BE GLAD TO! YOU KNOW ME, HANNY WITH TOOLS! GOT A
KNACK FOR IT!
- 8 TEE: Sure you have, I betcha.
- 9 FIB: BRING IT IN! WHATEVER IS WRONG WITH YOUR SLED, OLD
UNCLE FIBBER WILL STRAIGHTEN IT OUT GOOD AS NEW!
- 10 TEE: Okay. (GIGGLES HAPPILY)
- 11 SOUND: DOOR OPEN...FIB STOPS AND TEND...DOOR CLOSE
- 12 TEE: There!

- 1 FIB: (PAUSE) You mean that was a sled?
- 2 MEL: It looks like a roll of chicken wire from a sunken ship.
- 3 FIB: How...how did it get like that, sis?
- 4 TEE: Oh some of the kids borrowed it and left it on the street car tracks and I guess a street car musta run over it. A couple times, at least. Gee, thanks for wanting to fix it, mister ..you're just WONDERFUL to us kids.
- 5 FIB: Yeah, but look...I don't think anybody could -
- 6 TEE: I'LL BE BACK FOR IT THIS AFTERNOON, MISTER. THANKS EVER SO MUCH! BYE, MIZ MOGIE!
- 7 MEL: Bye, Tony.
- 8 SOUND: DOOR CLOSE
(PAUSE)
- 9 MEL: Were you the fellow who was looking for something to fix?
- 10 FIB: Yeah. Well, this won't be so tough tootsie...I can handle this! With my knack for fixin' stuff, I -
- 11 SOUND: METAL BOUNCES UNDER:
- 12 FIB: Hm. I wonder which was the front end of this thing? This looks like a runner here - So that must go on the bottom - although -
- 13 SOUND: DOOR CHIME:
- 14 MEL: COME IN!
- 15 SOUND: DOOR OPEN:
- 16 MEL: Well, if it isn't the good Doctor...Hello, Doctor Gamble.
- 17 DOC: Hello, my dear...and good day to you, Clabbertrain.

- 1 FIB: Hiyah, baby-slayer. Why are you walkin' the streets today? Kickin' the ashes off the slippery sidewalks to build up a little fracture trade?
- 2 DOC: The fracture trade, as you so crudely put it, Eggface, is already a little larger than I can handle. However, as long as people will drink anything that's handed to them, at a party and then try to drive home, they mustn't be surprised to wake up in a little white bed with a nurse saying, "drink this", too! Sometimes, I think the human race is - (PAUSE) Well! speaking of wrecks, Flagon-head, what's this? New Year's gift from Joe's Junk Yard?
- 3 MOLA: That's a sled, Doctor. Or was. Little Teeny from across the street left it for McGee to fix.
- 4 FIB: Needs quite a bit o' straightening out.
- 5 DOC: Look, Tinker-Boy - do you honestly think you can repair this thing?
- 6 FIB: Certainly I can, longbelly! Just because you were born with ten thumbs, and can't turn a doorknob without somebody explaine it to you, don't think I can't!
- 7 MOLA: He has to, Doctor. He promised.
- 8 DOC: Well, I wish you luck, Snakeant! And look, if you do get it fixed, let's take it out to Dagan's Hill and try it out! Just you and me.
- 9 FIB: Yeah? Okay, swell, Doc.

1 DOC: I'll shove you down the hill on it and you can coast clear
out on the lake! Be a lot of fun for both of us!

2 MOL: I can see where it would be fun for NoGee - but where
does your fun come in, Doctor?

3 DOC: At the bottom of the hill, my dear - the lake isn't
frozen! (CHUCKLES) So long, kids.

4 SOUND: DOOR SLAM

5 FIB: A guy could get drowned that way!

6 OREN: "I'LL GET BY"

7 (APPLAUSE)

SECOND SPOT:

- 1 SOUND: INTERMITTENT BANGING AND SCREECHING
- 2 FIB: (SINGS) OHUH, I started off the New Year, as gentle as a lamb...But every time I hit my thumb, I wanta holler
(THUD) OMAAAW!!! DAIRAT THE DAIRATED --
- 3 MOL: Ohh dear! Hit your thumb again?
- 4 FIB: (THUDS IN HIS MOUTH) Nope. Hit my kneecap this time.
- 5 MOL: Then why are you sucking your thumb?
- 6 FIB: Can't get my knee in my mouth...Just grazed it, though - it don't hurt much.
- 7 MOL: Ky, that's a horrible looking mess, McGee - you'll never get that thing back in shape.
- 8 FIB: Ahh, don't you worry - I'll get it fixed okay.
(LINGERING NOISES) Reason I know how to fix sleds is because I had me a job at one time as a sled tester up in Westchester.
- 9 MOL: I didn't know you ever worked on sleds, McGee.
- 10 FIB: I NEVER TOLDJA ABOUT THE TIME I WAS HEAD TESTER FOR ED BAYTON AT THE WESTCHESTER SLED WORKS!!!

- 1 MOL: You never did!!
- 2 FIB: Well, baby, I will! You see, as Head Sled Tester with Spector and Rector, I was the best-known tester in all Watchchester - and the sleds I tested were never bested by any other sleds! We had a slick slide on the south side of the sled shed - and I slid sleds down that slide all day. I built myself a sled out of lead - and painted it red - and that little red sled really sped, because when you got a sled that's loaded with lead, the lead makes the red sled slide, see? I tested every kind of sled, from low sleds and snow sleds to high sleds but my sleds were the best sleds and when I slid down the slide and sped past the shed with the red of my head matching the red of my sled, I set a world record that still stands for the most fractured ribs!! Hand me the banner, willya?
- 3 MOL: Gladly!
- 4 FIB: If I can just get these runners straightened out - then I can start on the wood part of the sled and -
- 5 SOUND: BANGS VIOLENTLY INTO DOOR CHIME
- 6 MOL: Hold it, darrie! COME IN!
- 7 SOUND: DOOR OPENS
- 8 MOL: Oh, it's Ole, from the Elite Club. Hello, Ole.

- 1 FIB: Hi, Ole.
- 2 SOUND: BANGS VIOLENTLY ON THE SLID RUNNERS
- 3 OLE: Hello Missus. What you mad at the sled for, McGee?
Somebody won't let you ride on it?
- 4 MOL: Oh no, he isn't mad at it, Ole. Not yet.
- 5 OLE: Then why does he bust it up, Missus? He just
destructive, huh?
- 6 FIB: I'm not bustin' the sled, Ole - I'm fixin' it!
- 7 OLE: With you - what's the difference? (CHUCKLES) You should
see, Missus, the time he makes the legs even on the pool
table, at the Elks Club.
- 8 MOL: What happened?
- 9 OLE: Well, we now have the only table in town where the
fellars play pool standing on their knees.
- 10 FIB: Oh yeah? Well, the legs are even, ain't they? That's
all you ask me to do - make 'em even. Hand me the saw
there, willya?
- 11 OLE: Sure. (SAW RATTLE) Which saw do you want - the
handsaw?
- 12 MOL: No, he's already sawed his hand, Ole - hand him a wood
saw.
- 13 FIB: Or better still, gimme the hacksaw. I wants back a few
rough edges off these runners. I'll have this sled as
good as new in a couple hours! I think.
- 14 OLE: You know what I think? I think you got bad case of
optimism, McGee. You remind me of old Swedish Proverb.
- 15 FIB: What proverb?

- 1 OLE: It goes - "Don't count your chickens while you keep layin' eggs..." I tell my missus just yesterday -
- 2 MOL: Say, how is your wife, Ole? AND the children? Everybody well?
- 3 OLE: Sure - everybody's fine, Missus. The kids got all their toys busted now and everything goes back to normal. If you can ever call it normal at my house.
- 4 FIB: Got all their toys broke already, have they?
- 5 OLE: Yeah, my littlest kid, little Lars - he gets a bow and arrow for Christmas and the first time he shoots it, the bow gets busted.
- 6 MOL: Well, those things never last long, Ole.
- 7 OLE: This one lasted too long, Missus. Lars catches his woman beilin' over the stove - woman catches an arrow - and Lars catches the bow across the back of his britches. I think I catch a streetcar and go Jovatown. So long, both you fellars.
- 8 SOUND: DOOR SLAM
- 9 FIB: Now Lars see - if I bend this runner this way - (GASPS)
II) no - I guess I gotta bend it the other way - (GASPS)
III) Hmm! This job is a little tougher than I thought!
- 10 MOL: How do you get into these things anyhow?

- 1 FIB: Well, gee-whiz, what on I gonna do when that kid comes in crying with a busted sled and buttons so around like an ear of corn - tellin' me what a talented fixer I am?
- 2 MOL: You could have denied it.
- 3 FIB: How could I deny it - every word she said was true... Huh! so that big monkey wrench, willya? I waste monkey around and see if I can't wrench these boards off.
- 4 SOUND: NAIL PULLING AND BOARD SPLINTERING SOUNDS, FADING
- 5 MOL: Ghh, that's good, Jearie! That just proves that no matter how bad anything is, it can always look worse if you work on it while.
- 6 FIB: Well, at least I got it down to the bare metal frame now. If I can just get these runners hammered out and -
- 7 SOUND: DOOR CREAKS:
- 8 WIL: Hi, Molly - Hi, Pal. Mind if I come in?
- 9 MOL: Hello, Mr. Wilson.
- 10 FIB: "Mind if I come in?" He says. You ever try askin' that question while you're still out on the front porch junior? Because I can't! You 'can't visit near as many people that way.
- 11 WIL: Thanks, Pal - I'll watch it. What's with the clutter in the living room here? You making a new front gate?

FISHER MOORE AND MELLY

1 MEL: No, that's a sled, Mr. Wilcox.

2 WIL: Oh...well anyhow, speaking of gates, Pal, you ought to go downtown and GATE yourself some Pet Evaporated Milk for health and -

3 MEL AND FIS GROAN.

10 MOL: What're you looking so puzzled about?

11 FIB: Got a problem here. These two bolts are supposed to go into these two holes here - only neither one of 'em fits. This here bolt is too large for this here hole - and that that there bolt is too small for that hole there.

12 MOL: Well the answer to that seems obvious.

13 FIB: Not so obvious, tootsie. I can make the small hole larger, to fit the large bolt - but how can I strick the large hole smaller to fit the small bolt. Oh hey, I got it!

14 MOL: I knew it would come to you!!

- 1 FIB: Sure - hand me my brace and bit - I'll bore two more holes. All you gotta use is your head because --
- 2 SOUND: DOOR CHIME
- 3 MOL: COME IN!
- 4 SOUND: DOOR OPENS
- 5 FIB: Oh, hi, Old Timer.
- 6 MOL: Hello, Mr. Old Timer.
- 7 OLD M: HELLO THERE, KIDS! HI, DAUGHTER - HEY, JOHNNY - what's do with the old army cot there? Fall downstairs with it?
- 8 FIB: It's not an army cot and I'm in no mood for jokes. I'm tryin' to fix this dadratted sled, for the little girl down the street.
- 9 OLD M: Sled? Well, maybe I can help you with it, Johnny. I always was pretty handy with tools myself. Did I ever tell you about when I was in the Seabees durin' the last war - we built the first white woman ever seen in the Solomon Islands?
- 10 MOL: Yes, I think you -
- 11 OLD M: YEP, WE BUILT THE FIRST WHITE WOMAN EVER SEEN IN THE SOLOMON ISLANDS A ROCKIN' CHAIR - SO SHE COULD SET ON THE FRONT PORCH AND WAAAAAVE TO THE SAILORS!
- 12 SOUND: HAMPERING AND TINKERING, BEHIND!
- 13 FIB: Yeah? Well, look - if you're so handy with tools - what would you do with this sled?

- 1 OLD M: I'll show you in a jiffy, Johnny. Raise the winch. You take that end and I'll take -
- 2 FIB: No, no, no - forget it! Migoah, I can't do that. I gotta get it fixed.
- 3 OLD M: Well, as I was sayin' to my girl friend Bessie the other night - Hey. That reminds me, kids - I gotta go down and bail her out.
- 4 FIB: What's the matter - she full of water?
- 5 OLD M: No, she's in the poker, Johnny. Police caught her ringin' doorbells, soapin' windows and tippin' over garbage piles night before last. Couldn't catch me, though, I was too fast for 'em.
- 6 MCL: Heavenly lays - you were out ringing doorbells night before last? That's for Hallowe'en.
- 7 OLD M: It is? Well, what was night before last?
- 8 FIB: New Year's Eve.
- 9 OLD M: NEW YEARS EVE?? Well, whattaya know about that - this jiggaw cheap watch stopped agin! Wait'll I tell Bessie about this - so long kids!
- 10 SOUND: DOH MAN
- 11 MUSIC: OPEN AND KING'S MUM "PUT OUT THOSE OLD RECORDS"
- 12 (APPLAUSE)

1 SOUND: HAMMERS AND TINKLING:11

2 FIB: (SINGS) Ohhhhh, I had a little Marmoset and raised
him up on Pet,
I built a little chair for him and that's
where Marmoset!

On the monkey and the coconuts -

3 CLATTER OF TOOLS: Hey, Molly-

4 MOL: Yes, dearie? What's the matter? You bored? Another
hole in the carpet?

5 FIB: Nope. Just want you to take a look at this sled.
(CLATTER) Whaddya think?

6 MOL: Well, frankly dearie....(PAUSE) You do want me to be
frank, don't you?

7 FIB: Y-y-y-yeah, frank with a little touch of kindness.

8 MOL: Well then, frankly, I think it looks worse than ever.
Sort of like an old garbage can that was caught
between two tank trucks.

9 FIB: You know something.....that's exactly my impression.
But now I know what to do. That kid INSPIRES ON ME to
fix this sled.....and By George, I'M gonna do it!
Mind be my big cross cut saw over there, willya?

10 MOL: Certainly, but what -

1 FIB: JUST HAD ME MY BIG SAW AND STAND OUTTA THE WAY,
TOOTSINI! I'LL SHOW YOU WHAT A LITTLE BRAINS AND
INGENUITY WILL DO!

2 MUSIC: BRIDGE:

3 SOUND: CLATTER OF SLED ON FLOOR

4 FIB: There you are!!! Take a look at that! Ain't that as
handsome of a sled as you ever seen?

5 MCL: McGee, it's simply beautiful! How'd you ever do it?

6 FIB: It was simple when I put my mind to it. I just walked up
to a clerk at the Bon Ton and says "GIMME THE BEST SLED
YOU GOT IN THE JOINT, BUD". And this is it. \$14.95.
The same kinda sled Tony's was.

7 MCL: Wait a minute!...why did you ask me to hand you your big
cross cut saw just before you left here?

8 FIB: It was laying on my hat. Naturally, I didn't want to
walk into the Bon-Ton with a cross cut saw on my head
so -

9 SOUND: DOOR CHIME

10 FIB: Oh chi...Mm's the word, Mm! I mean mm's the word,
Mm....er...kiddo.

11 MCL: I won't even pop, Peep. Er....Peep, Pop!

12 SOUND: DOOR CHIME

13 TEN: Hi, Mister. How did you get along with my sl- (PAUSE)
Ooooooooooooooh, Boy....IS THIS MY SLED? (CLATTER)

- 1 FIB: Yup. All yours, sis. Don't mind telling you it was quite a job of fixing. Took time, work, brains, and a short street-car ride.
- 2 MEL: It certainly looks like new, doesn't it, Tony?
- 3 FIB: Like it, sis?
- 4 TEE: Gee, Mister...it's.....well gee, it's just simply wonderful!! You're the most WONDERFUL FIXER that ever lived, I betcha....and SO GOOD to lit-tal chil-dren... THANKS EVER SO MUCH!!
- 5 FIB: It was nothing sis. I mean, when a guy is as handy with tools as I am sis, he - Hey...where's going?
- 6 TEE: I'M GONNA SHOW THE REST OF THE KIDS...OH BOY! WHAT A WONDERFUL JOB OF FIXING....LOOKS PRACTICALLY NEW.....

- 8 TEE: HEE WILLIE!!.....HEE MARGE.....LOOK! LOOK WHAT MR. MARGE DID!
- 9 SOUND: DOOR SLAM
- 10 FIB: Practically new, she says!! It was fifteen bucks new, that's all. (GIGGLES) But did you see her little face light up when she seen that sled...it was worth all the trouble and expense.

- 1 NOLA: Yes she certainly was happy about it. I never would have -
- 2 REVEREND DOGS OFFER
- 3 FIB: COME IN!
- 4 REVEREND DOGS OFFER
- 5 NOLA: For goodness sake, it's His Honor, the Mayor! Come in, Mr. Mayor.
- 6 FIB: High, La Triv.
- 7 GALE: Hello, Nolly - McGee. Well, what're you doing with all the tools, McGee - building something?
- 8 FIB: Yep - I'm buildin' a reputation, La Triv. Reputation as a kindly, gentle, understanding fella - who's sweet to children and handy with tools.
