RIGHT.

6 MOL: To the City Hall, officer.

7 FIS: And if you wanna come with us, I'll give you a badge
for your sore nose.

8 COP: My nose is not sore, sir.

9 FIS: It's gonna be if you don't keep it outta my business;
Come on, Molly, we can't -

- 2 FED: OH, YOU SHALL WILL YOU!!!, BY GEORGE, I GOT MY RIGHTS, AND I AIN'T GUNNA GET FUDED AWAYED BY NO COP WITH A NEW BOOK OF TICKETS! BUSTER....I'M WALKIN' ACROSS THIS DEAD GRASS!

- 2 FIB: Hmmm.
- 3 COP: You refuse to sign the citation?
- 4 FIB: YEP.
- 5 COP: Then you'll have to come to the police station, sir.
- 6 FIB: CRAY...ARREST ME!!!! THEM A INNOCENT MAN IN JAIL FOR DISHONORING HIS CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS....RAILROAD A CITIZEN BECAUSE HE WOULDN'T BE PUSHED AROUND BY THE COPS!!! SO AWGAD....BY CRAYE I'LL TAKE THIS CLEAN UP TO THE SOUTHERN COURT!!!!

- 11 MOL: McGee... this is silly....the officer was right. He was just enforcing the law.

- 1 PTP: WELL IT'S A SILLY LAW...AND MY GEORGE I'M --
- 2 COP: Quiet please....
- 3 SOUNDED: KEY IN LOCK...BOX OPENING...JIGGLE HERE.
- 4 COP: HELLO...PRECINCT? THIS IS OFFICER CLAUDE PARADISOTTE,
SHIELD NUMBER 98, AND I...WHAT'S THATT ON. I'M sorry.
- 5 SOUNDED: RUMBLE UP.
- 6 MOL: What's the matter?
- 7 COP: Wrong number.
- 8 COP: HELLO.
- 9 MOL: Now then, Chief...will you explain once more to my
husband that if he just posts 10 dollars he'll be can

- 10 CHIEF: Okay, lady. Now look, McGee,----

- 3 MCL: Heavenly days!!! Don't touch the body!!!
- 4 PIB: Hold side, Chief?
- 5 CRIEF: Oh no. Detective Broos's wife just ran her car into a
fire hydrant. She wants to pound out the festa in the
body with the heel of her shoe, but I told her to wait.
HOW THIS, MOOCH...WHY DON'T YOU BE REASONABLE...JUST POST
THE BUCKS BAIL AND GO HOME. WE DON'T WANT TO BE---
- 6 PIB: NO BIR...I WON'T DO IT...THROW ME IN JAIL!!! THIS ADT

- 1 OLD: Hold everything there!!! YOU CAN'T DO THIS TO THESE KIDS, OFFICER!!!
- 2 CHIEF: Do what?
- 3 OLD: I dunno... .what's goin' on?
- 4 MOL: Hello there, Mr. Old Timer.....
- 5 FIB: Righh old timer....don't worry about us....this is a test case and I'll gonna fight it clear up to the Supreme Court....higher bat, even. Clear up to Radio Shopperr!!!
- 6 OLD: GOOD FOR YOU, JOHNSON!!!! MINUTE I HEARD YOU WAS IN TROUBLE I DASHED RIDIN' OVER....I KNOW HOW TO HANDLE THESE COPS!!!
- 7 FIB: Really, Old Timer.....you a lawyer?

- 1 OLD: Hope....Used to be a crook, Johnny..Member of the Car Barn Bandits in 1910.
- 2 MOLI: Good heavens....were you really a car barn bandit?...Then you reformend?
- 3 OLD: Had to daughter. After stealin' a car barn we couldn't find any place to hide it.... Need any bail, Johnny?
- 4 FIB: No thanks, Old Timer.
- 5 OLD: Good. I'M busted. Now then Chief...what's the charge against this innocent boy?
- 6 CHIEF: Well in the first place Mister -
- 7 FIB: I AIN'T A BOY AND I AIN'T INNOCENT...I'M GUILTY.....I BUSTED A SILLY RIDICULOUS LAW THAT YEARS AGO SHOULD OUGHT TO OF BEEN PEELLED.
- 8 MOLI: You been BE-Pealed.
- 9 FIB: WHAT WAS IT PEELLED?
- 10 MOLI: Well, I don't -
- 11 FIB: Never mind kiddo. ANYWAY, OLD TIMER....I'M GONNA MAKE AN ISSUE OUTA THIS....I'M GONNA -

- 1 MOLI I just don't know what to do, Chief. He won't let me post bail for him and -
- 2 CHIEF: I gotta get him outta here soon way, Mrs. McGee - if we fill up our cells with guys that just walk on lawns, we got no room for our regular customers! Otherwise, I'd let him sit in that cell till he grow moss on his north side!
- 3 MOLI Well, if you haven't got anything else on your side, I suppose you might as well have moss. I wish I knew how -
- 4 SERG: (PADING IN) Hey, Chief - what're we gonna do about that jerk back there? He's dismoralizing the whole bullpen.
- 5 MOLI Don't you dare call my husband a jerk, Sergeant!
- 6 SERG: (PATIENTLY) Look, lady - if he ain't a jerk, how do you know who I'm talkin' about?
- 7 MOLI Hum....You know, that's a good question, at that.
- 8 CHIEF: Bring him out here, Simenian. I'll talk to him again. See if we can't get rid of him.
- 9 SERG: Okay, Chief.
- 10 SERG: FOOTSTEPS ON CONCRETE...PADES SLIGHTLY...HEAVY CLANK OF KEELS AND BOLTS, CHAINS...HEAVY IRON DOOR CREAKS OPEN...FOOTSTEPS PADE IN.
- 11 FID: Hi, Molly.

- 1 NELL: Dearie, I'm so glad to see you. Let mother look at you!
Have they treated you all right in there?
- 2 FIB: Treated me awful. A great big cop just gave a horrible
beating.
- 3 NELL: Oh dear! With a nightstick?
- 4 FIB: No, with a checker board - beat me three straight games.
I think his checkers were marked and -
- 5 CHIEF: (HOPEFULLY) Well, McCree - we've decided to let you go.
Take him home, Mrs. McCree, I think he's learned his
lesson.
- 6 FIB: ~~AWW NO YOU DON'T!~~ I'M A CITIZEN AND A TAXPAYER AND YOU
CAN'T THROW ME OUTTA JAIL! THIS IS A COUNTRY!
- 7 CHIEF: Look, my boy - if you'll go home, I'll tear up the
citation. I'll tear it in little bitty pieces --
- 8 FIB: No sir! I'm gonna stay right here till you repeal that
~~KEEP OFF THE GRASS~~ signs! GET ME SOME ACTION! GET THE
MAYOR OVER HERE! CALL THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN! I'm gonna
drag this whole rotten mess out in the open and who's
these guys coming?
- 9 NELL: Well, the cards on their hats say "Press". They might be
reporters from the newspaper.

- 1 FIB: Oh boy, if they want a story --
- 2 REPORT: (PAUSES IN) Hi, Chief! The Editor says you got some
crackpot over here that claims - Oh, is this the guy?
- 3 CHIEF: That's him, Rudy, but your paper wouldn't -
- 4 FIB: I'll handle this, Chief! (WITH DIGNITY) Son - every great
champion of the people - every crusader for a righteous
cause - every great man who has had an appointment with
Destiny, has been called a crackpot! You may quote me!
- 5 REPORT: (CHUCKLES) Thank you, Thomas Jefferson!
- 6 FIB: You may tell your readers, fellas, that I'm fightin' for
their rights! I claim it's illegal to make it un-legal
for a citizen not to be allowed that if he walks on the
city hall lawn, which it's dead anyhow, he gets arrested!
Right?
- 7 REPORT: I'd like to quote that statement, McGee - but the linotype
machine was never built that could handle that grammar.
- 8 FIB: Exactly! THAT'S WHY I STAND HERE, SWININ' MY FIST AND -
- 9 REPORT: HOLD THAT POSE, McGEE. Grab a picture, Eddie!
- 10 EDDEE: Got it! (CLICK OF SHUTTER) Great! This'll crowd the
funnies right offa page 121.
- 11 FIB: Take all the pictures you want, fellas. Now, Chief, you
wanta get in onit. You can put your arm around my
shoulders and smile, like I was Public Enemy Number One
and you were the Police Commissioner and -- Not
- 12 CHIEF: Not! (PLAZING) Look, McGee - why don't you go home? If
you do, I'll send you and Mrs. McGee home in a squad car.

- 1 MOL: (EXCITEDLY) Oh, I'd like that, McGee. It'll be such fun
to ride ~~AWAY~~ from the police station with you in a squad
car.
- 2 PIB: OH NO YOU DON'T!! I'M IN THIS FIGHT TO THE FINISH, AND
AS THE PEVILLES CHAMPION OF THE PEOPLE OF WISTFUL VILLE -
THE TWO DOWN CITIZENS OF THIS FAIR -
- 3 MOL: Hold it, derrie - relax. The reporters have gone.
- 4 PIB: Huh? Well, anyway, I ain't goin' home, till I get this
silly law molly prost! We'll see who triumphs - me or
Justice! I'm gonna -
- 5 ~~SOUND~~: DOOR OPENS
- 6 WIL: (EXCITED) ARE YOU ALL RIGHT, PAL? I RUSHED RIGHT OVER
HERE WITH A BLANKET! HURR, WRAP THIS AROUND YOU!
- 7 MOL: What's the blanket for, Mr. Willow?
- 8 WIL: I just met the Old Timer down the street and he told me
they tossed McGee in the drink.
- 9 PIB: It wasn't the drink, Junior - it was the clink.
- 10 WIL: Oh, well it's a good thing I came, Pal - I can help you!
- 11 MOL: If you can persuade him to go home, Mr. Willow, you'll
help all of us!
- 12 CHTSP: /MOM, sister!
- 13 PIB: I ain't goin' home.

- 1 WILL: Well, don't you worry about a thing, Pal. When they stick you in solitary and put you on bread and water - I'll toss some Fat Evaporated Milk in through your cell window.
- 2 FID: Hmmm!
- 3 MOLLY: That ought to even things up, Mr. Wilson. They throw McGoos into the can - and you throw a can in to McGoos.
- 4 WILL: Yes, and all you do, Pal, is take that water they give you - mix it with an equal amount of Fat Milk, and you'll have good rich whole milk, to keep up your strength!
- 5 FID: That's very interesting, Junior, but I don't wanna live no richer than anybody else in here, because I'm the Champion of the people and -

FREEDOM IS IN PERIL - TELL 'EM ABOUT THE CONSTITUTION!
- 2 WILLY Pal - I'LL DO IT!
- 3 MOLLY Good.
- 4 WILLY "FRIENDS" - I'LL say - "ABOUT YOUR CONSTITUTION
THE WAY TO HAVE A STRONG CONSTITUTION" - I'll say - "IS
TO BE SURE YOU GET PLENTY OF RICH DAIRYING MILK
SUBSTANCE IN YOUR DAILY DIET!"
- 5 FISH Chhhh....
- 6 WILLY "DON'T FORGET THAT THE PIG MILK YOU USE IN COOKING PUTS
EXTRA AMOUNTS OF THESE NECESSARY MILK MINERALS INTO ALL
YOUR FAVORITE FAMILY DISHES! PIG MILK," I'll say - "NOT
ONLY ADDS EXTRA-RICH FLAVOR AND GOODNESS TO YOUR"
- 7 FISH HEY, HEY, HEY, LOOK, MELVY!!
- 8 WILLY Yes, Pal? We'll get this straightened out in no time!
I just remembered I've got some mighty good connections
at the City Hall!
- 9 MOLLY You have, Mr. Wilcox? What kind of connections?
- 10 WILLY Two water faucets and a light plug. I better go pick
these up. So long Wida.
- 11 SECOND DOOR SLAM.

- 1 PIB: Hm and his connections! If I ever need a big drip, I'll know where to go!
- 2 CHIEF: Look, McGee, I can tell you where to go! GO HOME!
- 3 MOL: Please - let's call this whole thing off, McGee. This is getting silly!
- 4 PIB: SILLY, BUT THAT'S WHAT THEY SAY'S MORE THAN TWELVE GOOD MEN AND THEM SAT DOWN ON THE PLIMMOUTH ROCK AND SIGNED THE GETTYSBURG ADDRESS; THAT'S WHAT THEY SAY'S WHEN BENJAMIN FRANKLIN SAID "LIBERTY OR DEATH -"
- 5 CHIEF: I'VE BEEN TRYING TO GIVE YOU LIBERTY FOR 3 HOURS, BLAZERMOORE! (LAUGHING) Look, my boy, go on home, will you? We'll send you in a nice shiny squad car - we'll let you drive - you can work the siren -
- 6 MOL: Oh, McGee, doesn't that sound like fun?
- 7 PIB: (INTERVIEWING) Yeah, that would be fun and ...
- 8 CHIEF: (HILLING HARD) You can even flash the red light, McGee!
- 9 PIB: (INTERVIEWING) I can't? Flash the red light? Saay - that-
- 10 CHIEF: Just picture yourself at the wheel of a fast police car - tearing past the Elk's Club - siren screaming - red light flashing -
- 11 PIB: (TRYING TO DECIDE) Welllll, I don't know.....
- 12 CHIEF: (LAUGHING HARD) You'll love it, boy! Here, have a cigar! Take two!!

- 1 FIB: (SOME ADAM) OH, SORRY, KITT AND WITH CHEAP CIGARS,
