your gloves - (PAUSE) One's in the ash tray..where's  
the other?

6 PIB: On my hand. I ain't took it off yet.

7 MOL: Now then....do you see anything in this room that I  
might get disturbed about?

8 PIB: No, but something ain't here that I'M disturbed about!!!  
WHERE'S MY HIP BOOTS, THO' I BROUGHT 'EM IN HERE JUST  
BEFORE I WENT DOWNSTAIRS TO GET A WOLCOTTING OUTFIT TO  
PATCH 'EM WITH BECAUSE THE DUCK SEASON IS ALMOST..HEY...  
WHERE'S MY WOLCOTTING OUTFIT Oh. Here in the candy  
dish.

- 1 MOL: Like your hip boots, which, I might add, gave this room  
the romantic fragrance of the Fulton Fish Market, are on  
the back porch, where they belong.
- 2 FID: (PETULANT) Well, DARN IT, I WISH PEOPLE WOULD LEAVE  
MY PERSONAL BELONGINGS AROUND HERE ALONE.
- 3 MOL: (CAGILLY) By people....you mean...not ~~by~~ any chance?
- 4 FID: Well-l-l....anybody around here.
- 5 MOL: Hm-m-m-m.
- 6 FID: (PLAINTIVE) I happen to have a few little possessions  
that I cherish - nothin' much, just a pitiful little  
handful of personal belongings of my own, that I like  
to know where they are - and when I leave somethin'  
somewhere --
- 7 MOL: Like your old Indian clubs that you varnished last  
week and put in the oven to dry and forgot about and I  
thought I'd burned up my leg of lamb and sat down and  
cried like a baby.
- 8 FID: I dunno what YOU were crying about...I ATE half of one!  
But look....do me a favor, Molly, don't pick up my  
things. Just leave 'em after my own stuff, willya -  
so I'll know where things are when I want 'em!
- 9 MOL: (SWEET AND ICY) My boy - you have just made yourself  
a fine devil!! Share!!
- 10 FID: How do you do.

- 1 MOL: You go right ahead and LEAVE things! I'll touch  
NOTHING! I'm going to LOVE no picking up after you!  
It'll give us three or four hours of spare time a day.  
I'll leave your things strictly alone, believe me!
- 2 PTH: Good! First thing I'm gonna do is bring my old seashell  
collection up outta the basement and sort it out.
- 3 MOL: Great!
- 4 PTH: I may have some valuable shells in that seashell  
collection -- if I can figure out which ones they are.  
(TAZINGO) I'll bring 'em up here where the light's  
better and look 'em over and.....
- 5 MOL: HMM! (TO TAZINGO) "Leave his things where he puts them",  
he says! (MIMICKS HIM) "I wish people would leave my

- 6 SIXTYED DOOR OPENS:
- 7 MOL: COME IN! COME IN!
- 8 SIXTYED DOOR OPENS:
- 9 OLD M: HELLO THERE, DAUGH- (PAUSES) You dad, Daughter?
- 10 MOL: Oh, hello, Mr. Old Timer.....So, I'm not angry - just  
annoyed, is all. I have a husband who acts like a boy  
or 11.
- 11 OLD M: Well....good for Jetway!! He's grown' up!! I never  
seen him act more'n 7 or 8. Where's that boy of ours?

- 1 MOL: That boy of ours, or ~~young~~, if you want him - is down  
in the basement, gathering up his seashell collection  
as he calls it. Three bushels of trash refuse he  
brought home from Florida in 1932 and --
- 2 PIB: Hey, somebody, give me a hand with this basket of sea  
shells will ya?
- 3 MOL: Not me, lower. I promised not to touch things.  
Remember?
- 4 PIB: Gonna sort 'em all out. Know a fellow once that found a  
seashell that twisted left-handed and a museum bought it  
for three dollars. Hey, grab the basket, Old Timer,  
quick -- weeps!
- 5 SUND: BIG GLASSIE OF SEASHELLS ALL OVER THE FLOOR.
- 6 OLD: Very interesting collection of shells, Johnny. Clams...  
oysters, and....HEY...IS THAT A BICYCLE PUMP THURS UNDER  
THE CHAIR, KID?
- 7 PIB: Yeah....
- 8 OLD: Oh, I can't stand bicycle pumps!
- 9 PIB: Why?
- 10 OLD: Well, me and Beardo took us a bicycle trip thru the  
Rocky Mountains last summer, and I spent so much time  
pumpin' up tires, every time I bend over to tie my shoe  
I start lookin' for the valve cap.
- 11 MOL: Otherwise, was it an enjoyable trip?

- 1 OLD: Oh yes...daughter. Pretty "ring, though. Pedallin'  
them heavy bikes up them steep mountains and pushin' 'em  
down the other sides.
- 2 FID: YOU RODE 'EM UP AND PUSHED 'EM DOWN? WHY DIDN'T YOU PUSH  
THEM UPWARD AND COAST DOWN?
- 3 OLD: We tried it that way - but they push easier goin' down.
- 4 MEL: Himself here took a long bicycle trip once and -
- 5 FID: YEAH...ALL THRU THE NEW ENGLAND STATES...OHIO...ILLINOIS  
AND OKLAHOMA. I GOT SOME INCREDIBLE PITCHES I TOOK OF  
IT...LEMON SHOW YOU...I GOT 'EM IN AN ALBUM RIGHT HERE  
IN THE HALL. CLAP--
- 6 MEL: NO, MOONIE...NO!...PLEASE!...THE HOUSE IS ALREADY SO --
- 7 SOUND: DOOR OPEN; CLOSET SWING...BELL TINKLE;
- 8 FID: Well, whaddya know!.. my old moose head, with the loose  
eye. I been meanin' to glue that loose moose eye in ever  
since....
- 9 DICK: RAID: USE YOUR IMAGINATION!
- 10 (AVAILABLE)

SECOND ACT

- 1 FIB: Hey, Molly. You know something?
- 2 MOL: What?
- 3 FIB: Since you stopped pickin' stuff up after me -
- 4 MOL: - at your request.
- 5 FIB: Yeah...at my req' mt., the room is gettin' kinda cluttered up.
- 6 MOL: Oh nonsense. There's only a sea shell collection all over the floor...a vulcanizing outfit -- a 16 man rubber life raft...a tool chest...a moose head...a tire pump, a mandolin and a few objects I haven't identified as yet. Oh yes - there's your mah-jong set and a compstove.
- 7 FIB: You sure they ain't in the way?...till I get 'em took care of?
- 8 MOL: OF COURSE NOT, DRAWEE!! ....My goodness, I LIKE it this way. It makes the house look lived in. By a couple of drunken junk dealers. What's that thing you're --
- 9 SOUND: DOOR CHIME:
- 10 MOL: COME IN!!
- 11 SOUND: DOOR OPEN
- 12 FIB: Oh...DOC GAMBLE...KITTY. DOOKY!!!
- 13 SOUND: DOOR CLOSE:
- 14 DOC: Good day, my dear.

- 1 FIB: Good day.
- 2 DOC: I WASN'T TALKING TO YOU
- 3 MOL: Oh. Good day, Doctor.
- 4 DOC: That's better, and good day to you, Fish-head. Do you know that this house is in a strictly residential district?
- 5 FIB: What's meant?
- 6 DOC: You can't start an Army Surplus store in here, - and Surplus from Coxey's Army at that - they'll -
- 7 FIB: MADDOX MEAN, ARMY SURPLUS? These things are merely a few personal possessions, I happened to temporary lay down in here.
- 8 DOC: Oh. Well, I'm glad I don't have to lie down in here. What's that thing, that looks like a folded up life raft?
- 9 MOL: 12 silver dollars to this gentleman! Doctor - that IS a folded up life raft. And will you join me in a little prayer that it stays folded up!
- 10 FIB: Argh-argh! Don't touch it, Patsel! You see that little gadget there? That's a cartridge full of carbhydrated peroxide that you inflate it with and if you bump it, it's liable -
- 11 MOL: Oh, he can look at it, McCove. Come over here, Doctor.
- 12 ~~DOC~~: CRUNCHING POSITION...STOP IMMEDIATELY
- 13 DOC: WHAT AM I STOPPING ON?
- 14 FIB: Oh just a collection of old sea shells, Doc. Don't worry about breakin' a few. I still got two bushel baskets full of 'em in the basement for emergencies.

- 1 MOL: When we get enough of 'em crushed on the living room floor, we're going to shovel them out and pave the driveway.
- 2 DOC: Well, if you're sure I'm not damaging anything...
- 3 ~~MOL~~: ~~CHUCKING PAPER~~. ~~ACROSS GLASS AND PLATES~~
- 4 DOC: HOW WIEHT?
- 5 PIB: Boy are you clumsy!!! Stopped right into my air raid warden helmet and kicked it into my Greek Typewriter.  
~~WIECHER WATCH WHERE YOU'RE GOING~~
- 6 MOL: ~~GREEN TYPEWRITER!!!~~ Where on earth did you get that...and why?
- 7 PIB: Picked it up at a Police auction last October. Only 15 bucks.
- 8 DOC: You speak Greek?
- 9 PIB: Nope.
- 10 DOC: Then why Greek Typewriter?
- 11 PIB: You speak Swine?
- 12 DOC: No.
- 13 PIB: Then got rid of that wristwatch.
- 14 DOC: Nelly.
- 15 MOL: Yes, Doctor?
- 16 DOC: When you promised to love, honor and obey this brain-train, did you realize what he could do to a civilized dwelling place? Look at this living room! I haven't seen such a shambles since that circus truck landed with chimpanzees smashed into the pie wagon, 14th and Oak, and knocked down a bear-keeper on a bicycle.

- 1 PEP: Oh, don't be silly. Putzoff! Any guy is entitled to a couple bothins. WEALOTTA WANT ME TO DO? MARY EVERYTHING I OWN IN THE BACK YARD? I LIKED TO HAVE MY STUFF AVAILABLE!
- 2 MOL: Certainly....and what more available place for a one-eyed mouse-hound is there than under the piano seat to a broken bone-saw?
- 3 PEP: I'M GONNA FIX THAT LAWN MOWER JUST AS SOON AS I--
- 4 ~~SUNDY~~ DOOR KNOCK:
- 5 WIL: (OUTSIDE) MILDMAN!!
- 6 MOL: COME IN, MILDMAN!!
- 7 ~~SUNDY~~ DOOR KNOCK:
- 8 WIL: Hi folks. Hi yah, Doc. I thought I'd....Oh, WHERE YOU MOVING TO, PAUL?
- 9 PEP: My gosh, I'M gettin' tired of explaining this. Look, Junior, we are NOT moving. AND JUNIOR....COME IN AND SHUT THAT DOOR! WHERE WAS EVERYBODY RAISING - IN A BIRD CAGE?
- 10 ~~SUNDY~~ DOOR KNOCK:
- 11 DOC: Yes, come in and sit down, Marlow. You're in there between the elderly matroness and the convertible top off the small English car.

- 1 FIB: THAT AIN'T A CONVERTIBLE TOP UFF TO SMALL ENGLISH CAR!  
THAT'S THE GRASS BANNER OFFA THE LAWY MONEY.
- 2 DOC: Oh, Sorry, old man.
- 3 MOL: Here, Mr. Wilcox....there's room to sit down over here...  
Sit with me on this.
- 4 WIL: Thanks, but who is it?
- 5 DOC: It's a 16 man life raft, silly boy. What did you expect  
to find in McGee's living room....chairs?
- 6 FIB: OKAY....OKAY....OKAY!! HAVE YOUR FUN!! My opinion is  
that just because a fella that he likes to tinker with  
stuff don't put everything away the minute he lays it  
down nobody gives no credit for havin' the ambition and  
energy that if I didn't like to work on stuff I wouldn't  
have bring it out into the living room in the first  
place, is, that it's ridiculous.
- (PAUSE)
- 7 WIL: How was that again, Fall?
- 8 DOC: Skip it, Marlow. He was a swimmer all thru high school  
and learned English with his ear plugs in.
- 9 MOL: Well....now that we're all settled down on our folded up  
life rafts and our one-eyed moose heads for a nice cozy  
chat, and log creeps, how about some refreshments?
- 10 FIB: GREAT IDEA, KID!! Whynot MAKE US SOME HOT BUTTERED  
ROASTED?

- 1 DOC: I'd like a glass of orange juice, Molly, please.
- 2 MOL: Mr. Wilcox?
- 3 WIL: Would it be too much trouble to make some hot chocolate with Fat Milk?
- 4 MOL: Oh, no' a hill, Mr. Wilcox....I always make it with Fat anyway.
- 5 DOC: Cancel the orange juice. I'll have the hot chocolate too.
- 6 WIL: Made with Fat Milk, you mean, Doc?
- 7 PIP: (MIMICKING) "Made with Fat Milk, you mean, Doc?" My goosh, Junior, after all this time, can't you be a little more subtle? You have to drag them soultions in by their thumbs?
- 8 MOL: The word is not SOUTLION, Major. It's SOUTLIE.
- 9 PIP: I thought a scuttle was a big iron bucket you bring coal in for the stove.
- 10 DOC: That's a SCUTTLE, Pugface.
- 11 PIP: OH YEAH! DON'T FERD ME THAT MISINFORMATION, THROAT-PAINTED! A SCUTTLE IS A CHOCO-TOWN TRAIN. WHEN I WAS IN NEW YORK ONCE, I -
- 12 WIL: No Fair...that's a SCUTTLE!!!
- 13 PIP: SCUTTLE, MY CLAVICLE!!! YOU'RE ALL TRYING TO FOOL ME UP!!! I KNOW WHAT A SCUTTLE IS. IT'S A FRENCH CATELLE. WHEN I WAS IN FRANCE IN THE FIRST WORLD WAR....THE BIG WIN, WE WAS BULLIED IN A SCUTTLE-

- 1 MOLLY You were EX-LITED!  
2 DOC Is a CHILLI.  
3 PATT (DISGUSED) I give up. You're all a buncha frustrated school teachers! What'd I say wrong in the first place?  
4 WILLY You said SUBTITLE instead of SUBLTLE.  
5 MOLLY A subtitle is a title that comes after the main title. Oh, in the silent movies, it was the dialog that was thrown on the screen.  
6 PATT THAT'S WHAT I MEANT, DIDN'T I!!!!....I WAS SOBLY TRYIN' TO SAY THAT IF JUNIOR COULDN'T KEEP HIS DIALOG A LITTLE MORE SUBTITLE, HE OUGHTA STAY SILENT.  
7 WILLY Well, you whiz, Pal, you can't keep either silent or subtle about making wonderful drinks with Pet Milk. Too many people know about it...and love it...Maybe you don't realize how many children drink hot chocolate and cold drinks make with Pet Milk.....because the flavor is so rich and satisfying.....

- 7 FIB: LOOK WHERE YOU'RE GOING, JUNIOR - DON'T BUMP THAT CARTWHEEL!
- 8 MOL: Look - it's inflating!!
- 9 ~~JUNIOR~~ THE...LOST...HIS...FLAME TO ASL THEM AND CRASHED...AS  
LIFE RAFT EXPLODED AND DIED... (LOOK AT SCENE IN  
OLD RECORD)... PAUL.
- 10 MOL: When you come back from the kitchen, Mr. Wilcox, bring the butcher knife. I've deflated that thing once, and by the Seven Sisters of Naud Nelly, I can do it again!
- 11 DOC: KNOB KNOB...CRASH, KNOB, KNOB  
(APPLAUSE)

THIRD ACT1 EDWARD GLAZIER OF WOOD2 FIDI You know, this old seahorse ain't in such bad shape,  
Molly, outside of a busted leg and a couple of -  
(PAUSE) Molly? HEY, MOLLY, WHERE ARE YOU??3 MOL (SLIGHTLY OFF) Up here, McGee - at the top of the  
stairs! Trapped like a mink! How would I get  
downstairs if I wanted to?4 FIDI Well - I'd move some of this junk off the stairs here  
so you could get down - Molly, but frankly, I ain't got  
any place to put it at the moment.5 MOL Don't bother! I wouldn't come down those steps if the
