- 3 MOLY: HOW DON'T YOU KNOW YOUR HUSBAND...IT WON'T DO A BIT OF GOOD. Oh by the way...did you say you were from Massachusetts?
- 4 BABY: No, that's just where we belated the car. I mean.....
- 5 MOLY: You what? Related?
- 6 BABY: Uh.....yes, it wasn't running very well and....we belated it up on a garage rack. Couldn't find anything wrong with it. I was on my vacation.
- 6 MOLY: Oh. Well, you just stop fidgeting....and here....let me take your violin case....it must be getting heavy.....
- 7 BABY: No no no!!..thanks....I er....I LIKE to hold it. It's sort of comforting.
- 8 MOLY: Oh I guess all us musical people are alike! I play the piano. Of course, I can't hold the piano on my lap the way you can a violin case, but -.
- 9 SINGER: DOOR OPENS:
- 10 P.M.: (LAUGHING) Hey how about a cuppa coffee, Molly? Oh! Myah, Honest George. "Everything okay?"

1. BART: That's MY question, son. Is the car ready yet,

2. FIB: Well, not quite yet. I got the radiator off all right -  
but then I ran into trouble. I stumbled and kicked three  
spark plugs into the cover. But don't you worry. I'll  
get it fixed, or knock the fence sky.

4. MOL: McGee always knows the reason why, Mr. Williamson. It's

- 3 MOL: Just a minute. If you were STILL married I didn't know  
you were ever married, Mr. Old Timer.
- 4 FBI: Me, either.
- 5 OLD M: Yep, I was married to a girl named Alice at one time,  
kids - for about 5 minutes.
- 6 MOL: 5 minutes????
- 7 OLD M: Had us a military weddin' daughter -- very pretty ceremony.  
I was in the army at the time - had 14 of my officers  
lined up outside the church as our escort.
- 8 FBI: Yeah? Honor guard, eh?

- 1 OLD M: On her guard constantly, Johnny! But after the wedding - well, Alice just completely lost her head!
- 2 MOL: Really? Got excited, did she?
- 3 OLD M: No, but when we came out of the church me and Alice made a dash for the buggy, under them crossed whips and - well - poor Alice!
- 4 MOL: You mean, She-----.
- 5 OLD M: Top. Too tall! So long, kids.
- 6 PATRON DOOR GUARD
- 7 BABY: Look, McQues, I'll see if I can get that car started myself. I must be going and --.
- 8 PEP: No sir - you just relax, boy - I'll get that car buck together. By George, with all the YMCA does for this town - anytime I can help out the Secretary of the Y - I'm gonna do it!
- 9 MOL: That's right, dearie - but when are you going to do it? Mr. Williamson is anxious to get going and --.
- 10 GUARD DOOR GUARD
- 11 WIL: (OFF) Wilkins!
- 12 GUARD DOOR GUARD
- 13 WIL: Hello, folks! Glad to - Oh, sorry! You entertaining, Pelt?
- 14 BABY: Not very!

- 1 MOLLY Come in, Mr. Wilcox. This is Mr. Williamson - meet Mr. Wilcox.
- 2 WILLY How do you do, sir.
- 3 WILCOX Glad to know you, sir.
- 4 MOLLY Have a cup of coffee, Mr. Wilcox?
- 5 WILCOX Love it, Molly. You know how I am about coffee with that good rich Pet Evaporated Milk in it. (JOHNSON SMILED)

- 3 FID: Oh, doesn't remember? You and your assistant were drivin' along on your way to a Fellowship meeting and your car broke down in front of my house, which shows you're just lucky because -
- 4 TEEN: (FADING IN) Hi, sister McGee! It's me - Teeny!
- 5 FID: Oh, hi sis. Wanted to meet a friend of mine - this is Mr. Williamson, Teeny. Robert George Williamson.
- 6 TEEN: Hi, mister.
- 7 BABY: Hello, little girl. How old are you?
- 8 TEEN: Six, going on eight.
- 9 FID: Uh-huhhuhhuh, six going on eight how about seven?
- 10 TEEN: I've decided not to be seven, I betcha. I'M going right on to 8.
- 11 BABY: Why?
- 12 TEEN: Well, if I'm seven I get Miss Balmer as a teacher. I don't like Miss Balmer for a teacher because she's my momma's cousin and she treats me awful mean just to show there isn't any favoritism; and so I'm gonna skip her.

- 1 FID: Very logical.
- 2 TUES: Well, I - know
- 3 FID: I says VERY LOGICAL.
- 4 TUES: What is?
- 5 FID: Going right from six to eight, skipping seven.
- 6 TUES: Why?
- 7 BABY: So you won't get Miss Balmer as a teacher.
- 8 TUES: For what reason?
- 9 FID: BECAUSE SHE'S YOUR MUMMIE'S COUSIN AND SHE TOLD YOU ONLY TO MOVE THERE'S -
- 10 TUES: No favoritism. I know it!
- 11 (PAUSES)
- 12 BABY: Why are you staring at me, like that, little girl?
- 13 TUES: I always stare at people, Mister. That's because I got a photographic memory, I betcha.
- 14 FID: Yeah? A photographic memory, eh?
- 15 TUES: Sure - I never forgot a photograph. I can't remember people very good, but with photographs, I...
