- 2 BABY: So thanks, Mrs. McGee... say, do you suppose your husband.....
- 3 MCL: HOW DON'T YOU Worry YOUR HEAD ABOUT MCGEE...IT WON'T DO A BIT OF GOOD. Oh by the way...did you say you were from Massachusetts?
- 4 BABY: No, that's just where we heisted the car. I mean.....
- 5 MCL: You what? Heisted?
- 6 BABY: Er.....yes, it wasn't running very well and...we heisted it up on a grease rack. Couldn't find anything wrong with it. I was on my vacation.
- 6 MCL: Oh. Well, you just stop fidgeting....and here....let me take your violin case....it must be getting heavy.....
- 7 BABY: No no no!!..thanks....I er....I LIKE to hold it. It's sort of comforting.
- 8 MCL: Oh I guess all us musical people are alike! I play the piano. Of course, I can't hold the piano on my lap the way you can a violin case, but -.
- 9 SOUND: DOOR OPENS:
- 10 FIB: (PAUSE IN) Hey how about a cuppa coffee, Molly? Oh! Hiyah, Honest George. Everything okay?

1 BART: That's MY question, McGee! Is the car ready yet,
because --,

2 FIB: Well, not quite yet. I got the resistor off all right -
but then I ran into trouble. I stumbled and kicked three
spark plugs into the sewer. But don't you worry. I'll
get it fixed, or know the reason why.

3 BART: (GROANS).

4 MCL: McGee always knows the reason why, Mr. Williamson. It's
usually because he ---.

5 SOUND: DOOR CHIME:

6 FIB: COME IN:

7 SOUND: DOOR OPEN:

8 MCL: Oh, hello there, Mr. Old Timer!

9 FIB: Hi, Old Timer.

10 OLD M: HELLO THERE, KID! HELLO DAUGHTER, HI, JOE - Oh,
sweepy?

11 MCL: Yes. Mr. Williamson, this is the Old Timer.

- 1 FIB: Old Timer, this is Mr. Willingham. His car busted down
out front - he's sittin' while I fix it.
- 2 OLD M: While you fix it? Well, you'll be here for quite a spell,
wonts, sister? You got a room in the neighborhood?
If I was still married, I'd git my wife to --
- 3 MCL: Wait a minute. If you were STILL married? I didn't know
you were ever married, Mr. Old Timer.
- 4 FIB: No, either.
- 5 OLD M: Yep, I was married to a girl named Alice at one time,
kids - for about 5 minutes.
- 6 MCL: 5 minutes????
- 7 OLD M: Had us a military weddin' daughter -- very pretty ceremony.
I was in the army at the time - and 14 of my officers
lined up outside the church as we come out.
- 8 FIB: Yeah? Honor guard, eh?

- 1 OLD M: On her guard constantly, Johnny! But after the weddin' -
well, Alice just completely lost her head!
- 2 MCL: Really? Got excited, did she?
- 3 OLD M: No, but when we come out of the church we and Alice made
a dash for the buggy, under them crossed arches and -
well - pure Alice!
- 4 MCL: You mean, she-----,
- 5 OLD M: Yep. Too tall! So long, kids.
- 6 SOUND: DOOR SLAM:
- 7 BABY: Look, McGee, I'll see if I can get that car started
myself. I must be going and --.
- 8 FIB: No sir - you just relax, boy - I'll get that car back
together. By George, with all the YMCA does for this
town - anytime I can help out the Secretary of the Y -
I'm gonna do it!
- 9 MCL: That's right, dearie - but WHEN are you going to do it?
Mr. Williamson is anxious to get going and --.
- 10 SOUND: DOOR KNOCK:
- 11 WIL: (OFF) Wilman!
- 12 SOUND: DOOR OPENS:
- 13 WIL: Hello, folks! Glad to - Oh, sorry! You entertaining,
Paul?
- 14 BABY: Not very!

- 1 MCL: Come in, Mr. Wilson. This is Mr. Williamson - meet Mr. Wilson.
- 2 BABY: How do you do, sir.
- 3 WIL: Glad to know you, sir.
- 4 MCL: Have a cup of coffee, Mr. Wilson?
- 5 WIL: Love it, Molly. You know how I am about coffee with that good rich Pet Evaporated Milk in it. (HEARD DOOR SHUTTING) Pass me that pitcher of Pet, Mai.
- 6 BABY: I'll just get out to the street there and watch for my assistant. He ought to be along any minute now and -
- 7 FIB: AW - set down and have some more coffee, secretary - Don't be so jumpy.
- 8 WIL: You'll love this coffee with Pet Milk in it, Mr. Williamson. Is something the matter, sir?

- 1 FIB: Gee whiz, I guess he is kind of anxious, at least I'll get out there and get that car fixed. (DOOR OPENS) Go ahead and tell Holly about Pet Milk, Junior. (DOOR CLOSING - SCENE BEHIND:) HEY, WILLIAMSON! DON'T GO AWAY!
- 2 BABY: (PADING IN) (SCNS) I CAN'T GO AWAY, MOUSE, TILL I GET SOME TRANSPORTATION!! OH, HOW DID THIS EVER HAPPEN TO ME??
- 3 FIB: Oh, doncha remember? You and your assistant were drivin' along on your way to a Fellowship meeting and your car broke down in front of my house, which shows you're just lucky because -
- 4 THE: (PADING IN) Hi, sister McGee! It's me - Teeny!
- 5 FIB: Oh, hi sis. Wonda to meet a friend of mine - this is Mr. Williamson, Teeny. Hooast George Williamson.
- 6 THE: Hi, sister.
- 7 BABY: Hello, little girl. How old are you?
- 8 THE: Six, going on eight.
- 9 FIB: Whaddye mean, six going on 8? How about seven?
- 10 THE: I've decided not to be seven, I betcha. I'M going right on to 8.
- 11 BABY: Why?
- 12 THE: Well, if I'm seven I get Miss Bulzer as a teacher. I don't like Miss Bulzer for a teacher because she's my maan's cousin and she treats me awful mean just to show there isn't any favoritism. and so I'm gonna skip her.

- 1 FIB: Very logical.
- 2 TEE: Well, I - huh?
- 3 FIB: I says VERY LOGICAL.
- 4 TEE: What is?
- 5 FIB: Going right from six to eight, skipping seven.
- 6 TEE: Why?
- 7 BABY: So you won't get Miss Salzer as a teacher.
- 8 TEE: For what reason?
- 9 FIB: BECAUSE SHE'S YOUR MAMA'S COUSIN AND TREATS YOU BADLY TO
PROVE TEE'S -
- 10 TEE: No favoritism't. I know it!
- 11 (THINK)
- 12 BABY: Why are you staring at me, like that, little girl?
- 13 TEE: I always stare at people, Mister. That's because I got a
photographic memory, I betcha.
- 14 FIB: Yeah? A photographic memory, Eh?
- 15 TEE: Sure - I never forget a photograph. I can't remember
people very good, but with photographs, I...
- 16 BABY: Look, McGee - I - I think I'd better go back in and use
your phone. (FADING) Maybe I can get somebody over here
to help me get outta...
- 17 FIB: OKAY, SECONDARY, DON'T YOU WORRY, BOY - I'LL GET THIS BABY
RICKIN'.

- 1 THE: Sure you will, I betcha. Before you know it, even!
- 2 FIB: What do you mean?
- 3 THE: Well, gee, it's runnin' right now, mister.
- 4 FIB: WHATTHE HEAR, IT'S RUNNING?
- 5 THE: Look underneath there. It's running like everything.
- 6 FIB: OH MY GOSH! ...I LEFT THE PLUG OUT! THE CRANK CASE...THE
OIL IS ALL... HAND ME A WRENCH,...MUNKY!!!...I MEAN A
MUNKY DRIVER...A SCREW DRIVER...OH THIS IS AWFUL...
- 7 THE: (GIGGLES) INTO -
- 8 SEEK & SEIZURE'S MEN, "BOYHO KID"
- 9 (APPLAUSE)

TRIP SET

- 1 FIB: So you see, Dad, the reason I came back in the house was to tell you something.
- 2 BAW: What was that?
- 3 FIB: Well, I got the crankshaft took apart...the cylinder head off and the fuel pump dis-assembled. Then I noticed something. You got a flat tire, too.
- 4 NOLA: Ohhh, McGee...and now Secretary Williamson will be late for his Buman Fellowship class!
- 5 BAW: Yes I...Well...look I'll just call up and have an assistant secretary take over...may I use your phone again?
- 6 FIB: Sure, Secretary! Here you are...
- 7 BAW: Thank you. (PICKS UP) Hello, Operator? Give Eddie's Book Shop...(FUZZ) who? Wait just a minute? (ASIDE) who's Myrt?
- 8 NOLA: Just a friend....tell her not today.
- 9 BAW: (IN FURZ) They said "not today", Myrt. Yeah...(ASIDE) Why I take this phone into the kitchen!
- 10 FIB: Sure sure sure...we don't wanna butt in on any confidential YCA business...you go right ahead.
- 11 BAW: Thanks.
- 12 SOUND: DOOR CLOSING AND CLACK

- 1 MOLA My he's an interesting man, McGee! And such fun...really!
I almost wish I was in his YCA classes, he's just a boy
himself at heart. Did you know he carries a squirt gun
in a shoulder holster?
- 2 FIB: No kidding. He tell you?
- 3 MOLA I saw it when his coat flapped open. I said is that a gun
you're carrying?...and was he embarrassed!! (LAUGH) You'd
have thought I'd caught him carrying a REAL gun!
- 4 FIB: (LAUGH) Quite a gag at that. Squirt gun in a shoulder
holster. Some fresh kid hits him with a spit ball..he
whirls...draws his trusty gat, and SQUINT...SQUINT...SQUINT
Very funny idea...(LAUGH)
- 5 MOLA I thought so! And he read me all about the YCA out of a
circular he had. How it trains boys for good citizenship
...how it provides recreational facilities, and all that.
(LAUGH) And do you know...he looked so interested, you'd
have thought he was reading it for the first time! Why
my goodness, he --
- 6 SOUND: DOOR CHIMS
- 7 FIB: COME IN!!
- 8 SOUND: DOOR CHIMS
- 9 MOLA Oh, for goodness sake...Ole from the Elk's Club...Hello,
Ole!
- 10 SOUND: DOOR CLOSE
- 11 OLE: Hello, Missus. Hello, McGee.
- 12 FIB: Hiyah, Ole.
- 13 OLE: Look, McGee...if that's your machine all took apart at the
curb, I got news for you.

- 1 MCL: Oh now GLE, if YOU put that car back together again and
got it running, youascal you --
- 2 GLE: So, missus...but you clear up one thing for me, whywy.
That gag on automobile snow. HoGee...you know how messy
the sidewalk look with all those parts laying around?
Well now it look much neater.
- 3 FID: Yeah...you pick 'em up and lay 'em aside, Ole?
- 4 GLE: No, but it been snowing hard for 20 minutes now and
everything is covered up, very pretty.
- 5 FID: Oh well...it won't be long till Spring. How's the family,
Ole?
