- 1 HOL: Well, this trip ought to be fun. I'm anxious to --
- 2 P.A., ANNCR: YOUR ATTENTION PLEASE!... WILL PASSENGERS FOR TRAIN
NUMBER 7, "THE DOME ZEPPELIN", LEAVING AT 4:22 FOR
POISONED WILLS, CHIEF'S CROSSING, MOOTHT POINT, LIPSTICK
FLAT AND DAVID JOE MISSOURI, PLEASE NOT BE SO STUPID!
THIS IS THE UNION STATION AND THAT TRAIN DEPARTS FROM GRAND

- 3 FID: Grand Central - What's that guy talkin' about? You can't
get to Peoria on the Grand Central - OH MYSAK, OLE!! Hey,
Molly...here's Ole, from the Elks Club.
- 4 HOL: Oh...Hello there Ole.
- 5 OLE: (PAUSE) Well, hello there, Molly! Nice to see you.
Hello Molly...you coming back from somewhere, I'm afraid,
or going away, everybody hopes?
- 6 HOL: (LAUGHS) We're going to Peoria, Ole. For a convention.

- 1 CLR: Oh for goodness sakes...a convention!! I went to one of those things once. Sons and Daughters of Baudouin, it was, in Minneapolis, Minnesota. I play the bass drum to provide BOOM BOOM, BOOM-BOOM-BOOM!!!!
- 2 FID: Some fun, eh?
- 3 CLR: No, it was very miserable, Ma'am. It starts to rain and I don't see where I am going...my drums make so much noise I don't hear the leader's whistle...so I walk and walk and walk....BOOM, BOOM, BOOM BOOM, until I suddenly see I'm marching all alone.
- 4 MOL: Heavenly days...what did you do, Cle?
- 5 CLR: I ask somebody where am I....and he says, this is St. Paul and I say, very glad to meet you, can I train you a drum for a burg?

- 10 M.L.: (FADE IN) CANDY BARS...PEANUTS...MAGAZINES...PET MILK...IT'S A LONG TRIP FOLKS, AND THE DINING CAR IS A GOOD BISCUIT...SO GET YOUR CANDY BAR...YOUR PEANUTS...YOUR PET MILK HERE AND --

- 1 P.D.: HELL...JULY 20TH...!!
- 2 MOL.: MR. WILSON!?
- 3 WIL.: Hell for the -- Hello, Molly. Hello Pal.
- 4 MOL.: Heavenly days! No matter where we go, we always seem to run into Mr. Wilson! The way you turn up is positively uncanny.
- 5 WIL.: PLEASE...Molly....NEVER use that word to me. I am NEVER uncanny. I've got dozens of 'em! CANS AND CANS AND CANS OF FINE EVAPORATED MILK....
- 6 P.D.: Junior, I been ridin' these rattlers since the Union Pacific was a cow trail, and you're the first candy butcher I ever seen sellin' Fat Milk on a train.
- 7 WIL.: Naturally. It's my own idea, Pal. Lots of families with children ride this train. They need a good milk for coffee...they need the same milk for the children and for the baby's formula...so what's the answer? FAT MILK....

- 12 SOUND 1: TRAIN WHISTLE
- 13 P.A.: -- AND POSSIBLY FLYING BATTERS! THANK YOU. PLEASE LISTEN FOR THE NEXT INTERESTING ANNOUNCEMENT.

1. MOLLY That engineer has got himself confused with Betsy Goodwin!
2. PINE Yeah - what did they find down in the tunnel, Junior?

6. MOLI OH DON'T LEAVE IT OFF...I'D STILL LIKE TO HEAR ONE COMPLETE ANNOUNCEMENT.
7. PIB: Well, mighosh, they -
8. CLIFF: (FADE IN) Good day, folks...may I have your tickets, please?
9. MOLI Oh certainly, Conductor. NoOne...the tickets.

- 1 FIRE Myuh, bud. Don't go away...I got 'em here somewhere.
How I know now....I think I had 'em in my...no...
2 MOLI Won't you sit down, Conductor...while my husband looks
for his tickets?
3 CLIFF: No thank you, madam. It is not permitted. It is a
policy of the company to keep the personnel on their
feet. It seems that the President of the railroad also
owns a large firm which will be much supports. He's no
fool. Find your tickets, sir!
4 FIRE No, but I got 'em here somewhere...just be patient.
I'm lookin'.
5 CLIFF: Nice to know you, Mr. Lookin'. And this, I presume, is
Mrs. Lookin'?
6 MOLI No, I'm Mrs. McGee, I'm --
7 CLIFF: Well, it's nice to see that you found a congenial

8 FIRE I GOT HIS TICKETS, MISTER!

10 FIRE I'M NOT LOOKIN', SORRY'S IT.....
11 CLIFF: Then you'd better get started, that's all I can say.
12 MOLI Get started what?
13 CLIFF: Lookin'.

- 1 FIB: I AM LOOKIN'! FIVE DONG A MINUTE, WILLIAM
- 2 CLIFF: Don't take that tone of voice to me, master! I can have
you put off this train, you know!
- 3 MOLLY: Oh, don't get so fresh - we've got tickets! What are
you trying to do - roast us?
- 4 CLIFF: (PAUSE) Roastin', or lady we talkin' to you.
- 5 FIB: Oh sorry, I - DAIDAT IT, MY NAME AIN'T ROASTIN'! I'M NEVER
- 6 CLIFF: I thought you were Lookes.
- 7 MOLLY: He can quit. Is -- our tickets - I had them.
- 8 CLIFF: Thank you. Oh, I'm sorry, sodden.
- 9 FIB: Now what? This is the right train, so don't give me -
- 10 CLIFF: But the wrong car, sir. This is car number 2 -- your
car is toward the front of the train.
- 11 MOLLY: Well, that's all right -- we'll go back there. Which is
our car, sir?
- 12 CLIFF: Number 418, sodden. This is a long train!
- 13 FIB: WHAT? Awful for the -
- 14 SCENE: TRAIN WHISTLES UP INTO
- 15 MEDIC: OUCH AND KING'S MAN - "IF I WERE A ROLL"
- 16 (APPLAUSE)

- THIRD SET -

1 SUPER TRAFFIC POLICE IS SO.

2 FBI: (SARCASTIC) Well, here we are, kiddo! How's it feel to be standin' in front of the Peoria Astoria Hotel in Peoria with the guy that'll probly be the next president of the ~~SAFECOFS~~?

3 MOL: Tired.....I didn't sleep a wink on that train last night. Somebody kept moving all night.

4 FBI: That's funny - I didn't hear it. I slept like a log.

5 MOL: Yes, I know. I heard that log going back and forth through the sawmill all night...I hope you win your election this year, dearie. You've run for president before, haven't you?

6 FBI: KNOCK CONVENTION! And I been gyped out of it for one flimsy excuse or another every time!

7 SUPER: YOUR OTHERS, PERHAPS.

8 MOL: That's a show.

9 FBI: Yeah. One year it was because my dues wasn't paid up - the next time it was because nobody voted for me -- one bad break after another! Come on, let's register and look for old Fred Nitney. This convention oughta -

10 MOL: WELL, FOR OCCIDENTAL SALES, LOOK WHO'S COMING THROUGH THE LOBBY!
