stand for "SPYLING FROM INNOCENT CITIZENS", or "SUSPECT
PERSON IS CLEVER"...
- 4 MOLA: Or, "SILENT FALLS IN COFFEE".
- 5 PIB: Yeah. Eh oh! (CLINK OF COFFEE CUP) Thankie! Good
thing I wore my brown suit today. Got your hat, Tootsie.
I wanna go downtown.
- 6 MOLA: Huh...you're not going to the Gas Company and -
- 7 PIB: YOU SAID IT, SISTER!! I'M GOING TAKE IT UP WITH 'EM
PERSONALLY! I'M gonna fight this thing thru till the
gas company hollers uncle!
- 8 MOLA: Not Flashed...no!
- 9 PIB: Eh?
- 10 MOLA: That's a phrase I don't like. They fought maloma to
Wistful Vista till they hollered Uncle...and Uncle Dennis
thought they were calling him. And went!

- 1 PDE: Nevertheless, I ain't gonna be a party for no hold-up like this!!! I'm gonna go right to the head of the company and who is the head of the company?
- 2 MCL: Mr. Marston and Mr. Scott, I believe.
- 3 PDE: Oh....IT'S ON THE HOUSE.....I might have known! Grab your hat, kid or--
- 4 PDE: Let's get down there, right now!! Before I catch off and realize how unreasonable I'm being....Come on, let's --.
- 5 PAUL.....MICHAEL
- 6 MCL: COME IN!
- 7 JOHNSON.....ROCK ODELL
- 8 MCL: Oh, good morning, Mr. Old Timer.....
- 9 OLD: HEY, THIS DAWGNESS!!!! KIDZ, JOHNSON, HOW'S ANYONE LITTLE...Oh oh! Johnson....take that profane expression off your face, boy.....! There's a lady present.
- 10 PDE: Teach' Hell, look what I just got!
- 11 OLD: Coffee all over your sleeve, abt Hell, the cleaners can git that out, son. Try the Eagle Cleaners on 14th Street. I had a dirty Eagle case they cleaned for me, and done a fine job of it. - 1 SOUND: PRACTICE ALONE PAYMENT... TRAFFIC NOISES.
- 2 FID: Walk faster, Molly - I wanna get to that gas company before I cool off!
- 3 MIL: Oh, McGee, don't get so -.
- 4 FID: I'll blow the lid offa that whole rotten mess - that's what I'll blow the lid offa that whole rotten! By George -
- 5 MIL: I still think you're taking this thing too big, dearie. It's probably just a mistake and they'll be glad to straighten -.
- 6 FID: I'LL SAY IT'S A MISTAKE! ANY PUBLIC UTILITY THAT TRIES TO ROB ME IS A ~~BIG~~ MISTAKE! Sixteen dollars and twenty-three cents for their smelly old gas! My gosh, for that kind of dough, they could pipe in Schlitzel Number 5!

- 4 MOL. Hello, Kitty.
- 5 MRS. M.and in that darling hat!!
- 6 MOL. You like it, dear?
- 7 MRS. M. Oh, I've loved that hat on you for years.
- 8 MOL. Thank you, Kitty, dear. I like your hat too. In fact I almost bought it before you did. The Ladies Aid Bazaar Sale, wasn't it? My, you're looking well, Kitty.
- 9 MRS. M. Thank you. So are you, dear. And don't let anybody tell you those crow feet around your eyes make you look older....I think they just give your face character.
- 10 MOL. Oh, you're sweet to say that, darling. Personally, I've always sort of envied the smooth faced, empty headed, featherbrained type, but as I always say...we can't all be Kitty McDonald...can we? (LAUGHS)

- 1 MRS. H: (LAUGHS)...well, I must be going dear...I have an appointment to get my tooth fixed...
- 2 MOL: And you brought this downtown yourself when you could have just as well sent them by messenger! Well, that's pretty thoughtful of you Kitty...Goodbye, dear...
- 3 MRS. H: Bye, Honey...DO call me...~~(PAUSE)~~ If you still have your phone.

- 10 PIB: Oh him. I always wondered where Doc studied surgery. Now I know. He probably -
- 11 DOC: (PAUSING IN) Hello there, Mally - and good day to you. D.L.P.M.

1. PFB: Hi, Liver Lifter. What're you doin' at the butcher shop - takin' a post-graduate course?
2. DOC: No, I just made a deal with the butcher, Petrone. I'm delivering a baby to his wife next week and he's going to pay my bill in pork chops - pound for pound!
3. MOL: My goodness - with meat at those prices, Doctor, I think you made a very shrewd deal.
4. DOC: I think so. (~~CHARLES~~) The butcher doesn't know it yet, but according to my estimation, he's about to become the father of triplets.
5. PFB: Well, that's all very fascinating, Wrinkle-Bucket, but I got no time to gab. I'm on my way in here to clean out this damned gas company.
6. MOL: Mistake on the bill, Doctor.
7. PFB: When I get through with this joint, they'll think a tornado went through here!

we're trying to straighten out and -
- 7 WILS Ohhhwell, that's too bad, Molly! You missed a wonderful
recipe - Fat Milk's Princess Icebox Pie!
- 8 FISH Who is Princess Icebox, Junior????That the same as Miss
Quackenbush of 1950? Because -
- 9 MOLY Oh no, Scarbie - Icebox Pie is a KIND of pie. You see --
- 10 WILS Right, Molly! Princess Icebox Pie is a new rich, creamy
Fat Milk Dessert that simply melts in your mouth! It's
that whipped Fat Milk filling that --
- 11 FISH How many pies can you make out of one icebox, Junior? You
