AS HE ONCE WAS, OF COURSE - BUT LISTEN TO THE MOUTH! AS WE  
JOIN --

FIBBER MUESS AND MOLLY!!

2 APPLAUSE

3 FIB: ....and when I saw this in the paper, Molly - about 'em  
runnin' the Wistful Vista Soapbox Derby tomorrow - I says  
to myself "ANNN, FIAB!" I says.

4 MOL: A very intelligent comment, dearie! Meaning what???

5 FIB: Meanin' what do kids these days know about buildin' soapbox  
racers? Why when I was a kid, I could take an old catalogue  
crate, nail four pie tins on it for wheels, grease 'em with  
a stick of butter, and barrel down Main Street Hill faster'n  
you could holler "LOOK OUT FOR THE OPEN MANHOLE!"

6 MOL: Ahh, those happy childhood days?

7 FIB: Yep, I had quite a reputation as a builder of soapbox racers  
in them days, Molly. ANNN, I'll never forget old Number  
Nine!

8 MOL: Number Nine?

9 FIB: That was my championship model. Old Number Nine. The one  
I finally won one with. Finished buildin' it at 1 minute  
after 2 on May 3rd, and won the race by 4 lengths, in 5  
minutes and 6 or 7 seconds at the age of 8! My lucky  
Number Nine!

- 1 MOL: What was the prize? Nine life insurance policies for  
your cat?
- 2 FIB: Nope. Ten bucks and a new bicycle.
- 3 MOL: Oh, that's wonderful!
- 4 FIB: That's what I thought, till I rode past your house on the  
bicycle, to show off. I rode no-hands, smacked into a  
tree, and picked myself up no-teeth. I was so healthy,  
though, they grew back in again.
- 5 MOL: Including those fillings??
- 6 FIB: Aw no, this is my third set, thank goodness. My second  
set grew in with the molars in front.
- 7 MOL: Ouch! That's what my folks meant - they always said you  
were a backward lad in those days, dearie. But I claimed  
you -

8 SOUND: DOOR CHIME

9 FIB: COME IN!

10 SOUND: DOOR OPENS

11 FIB: Well, well, look who's here! Doctor George Gable,  
Physician and Surgeon - and the best friend I could have  
in the world. -- if I happened to own a mortuary! COME  
IN, FATSO!

12 SOUND: DOOR CLOSING

13 DOC: Hello, Molly. And thank you for that charming tribute,  
Pickle-Head.

- 1 NCL: Don't let him fret you, Doctor. If McGee didn't like you  
so much he wouldn't talk to you that way.
- 2 DOC: If wanting to insult someone is a sign of tender affection  
I'm nuts about him, too.
- 3 NCL: You look a little weary, Doctor. Had a rough week?
- 4 DOC: Yes - rugged, Nolly. I'm going fishing for a few days,  
though - and that ought to fix me up ship-shape.
- 5 FIB: You're already shipshape, Doctor. The shape of a ship.  
A stern-wheeler.
- 6 NCL: Oh, McGee, that isn't a very nice -
- 7 DOC: I don't mind him, my dear - with him, it's purely defensive.
- 8 FIB: Whaddya mean, DE-fensive? I'm as OF-fensive as you are.
- 9 NCL: More so, even!
- 10 DOC: I simply mean that --
- 11 SOUND: DOOR CHIME:

1 FIB: COME IN.

2 BUSBY DOOR OPENS

3 TEE: Hi, Mr. McGee. Hi, Mrs. McGee. Hi, Doctor Gummel.

4 AD LTR YELLOWS

5 TEE: I just thought I'd drop in, Mr. McGee. You're always so nice to lit-ul, chil-drun. And I wanna ask your advice, too, I betcha.

6 DOC: It's never necessary to ask Mr. McGee's advice, Teety.

7 FIB: Nope.

8 DOC: He throws it around like spaghetti at a Roman Plenio. And it can get you just as messed up, too.

9 MCL: What kind of advice do you want, Teety?

10 FIB: Ask me anything, sis! Old Uncle Fibber, the question and answer man.

11 DOC: The question being, does he know any answers.

12 TEE: well-l....you're so nice to lit-ul chil-drun, Mr. McGee and you can fix things so dandy, and Willie Toops is buildin' a soapbox racer to get in the soapbox derby and - well, I thought if you would tell me how to make a racer, too - so I could race tomorrow, well - I -.

13 FIB: **HEY!! WE WERE JUST TALKING ABOUT THAT, SIS....I USED TO BE A CHAMPION SOAP BOX RACER BUILDER.....**

14 TEE: That's what I told Willie, I betcha....I said, WILLIE, I said, I'll betcha Mr. McGee could build the **BESSSSST** soap box racer in the whole world, I said -



- 1 FIB: Well, it's odd that you should ask my advice, sir. Because you're talkin' to the guy that he's probly the greatest authority on sogbox motors alive today.
- 2 DOC: You're alive today? That's odd. I could swear you -
- 3 FIB: Quiet, Doc. First thing you do, Teamp, is you find yourself a big box.
- 4 THE: GEE, THAT'S A WONDERFUL IDEA.....!! Gee.....a big box!!
- 5 FIB: (MISHEARLY) Then you find four wheels the right size and attach 'em right to the box.
- 6 THE: GEE, THAT'S A DANDY IDEA!!!! ATTACH THE WHEELS RIGHT TO THE BOX....WAIT'LL I TELL WILLIE!!! OH BOY....I DISE WISH I KNOW AS MUCH AS YOU DO, HINTER!!! AND HAD ALL THE TOOLS YOU GOT....BUT....well....(SALLY) I'm just a lit-tal girl and I can't do stuff like smart men like you.
- 7 DOC: This is the most obvious -.
- 8 WIL: Quiet, Doctor.....let it work itself out.

- 1 DOC: Okay.
- 2 TEE: where was it. Oh yes....sawney, Mister....thanks ever so much for telling me how to do it, but maybe I better let it go till I'm a bigger kid and - well ...
- 3 FIB: HEY!!!
- 4 TEE: Haw?
- 5 FIB: Look.
- 6 TEE: Okay, here it comes!
- 7 FIB: I got an idea!!!!
- 8 TEE: I wondered if you were ever goin' to!
- 9 FIB: SUPPOSE I BUILD YOU A SCAF BOX RACER? I GOT THE TOOLS.....I GOT THE TIME....I GOT THE KNOW-HOW...IF I GET RIGHT TO WORK, I CAN ---.
- 10 TEE: GOSH, THIS IS WONDERFUL...! OH BOY!!....THANKS EVER SO MUCH!!! GAW, YOU'VE BEEN TO LIT-TUL CHIL-LEUN, MR. MOORE!! GAW, WAIT'LL I TELL WILLIE.....
- 11 SOUND: DOOR OPENS AND CLOSE FAST.....FOUNTSISTS ON FORM:
- 12 TEE: HEY, WILLIE....HEY...WILLIE!!
- 13 WILL: Yeah? What happened? He fall for it?
- 14 TEE: Like a ton of bricks.
- 15 WILL: Is he gonna do it?
- 16 TEE: Oh sure. I gave him the nice-to-lit-ul children routine and he ate it up. I hope I don't break my neck in that racer, because some of the stuff he builds --.
- 17 MUSIC: "I WHISTLE A HAPPY TUNE".
- 18 (APPLAUSE)

1 SONG: (HAPPY SINGING)

2 FIB: (SINGS) ODDLY, I HAD A TIGER FOR A PET,  
HE OWNS HE LEAPS AND BARKS;  
THE DAY HE SISTER DISAPPEARED,  
HE GAINED A HUNDRED POUNDS.

3 SONG: (HAPPY SINGING)

4 FIB: (SINGS) WE KNOW HE WAS A MAN-EATER,  
AND OUR MINDS WERE IN A MISTLE  
WE THINK HIS MOUTH GOT CORRUPTED  
CAUSE SISTER WAS A GIRL.

5 SONG: (HAPPY SINGING)

6 MOL: (FALS IN) How you coming along with the soap-box racer,  
Mr. Kettering.

7 FIB: Kettering? I remind you of Charlie Kettering, the General  
Motors genius?

8 MOL: No, I was thinking of Sore-Thumb Kettering, the handy man  
we had in Peoria. His front porch was always a mess like  
this, too.

9 FIB: I remember old Sore-Thumb. Used to build custom-built  
chicken coops for the farmers. But he had to give it up  
because he was always calling himself inside. Wonder what  
ever happened to him.

1 MOL: Last I heard, he went to Chicago in a shipment of pullets.  
The man who opened the crate got the Pullet surprise of  
his life. (L/ROSS) Don't you get it, Mollie? Pulitzer  
Prize? It's a play on words with the --.

2 FIB: TALK PUNNY, KID?!

3 MOL: Why not?

4 FIB: Because I didn't think of it. (BANGS T/P) MOLLIE, look it's  
startin to shape up now, Molly. This baby is gonna be a  
exact copy of little old Number Nine....the racer I built  
as a kid. It was what you might call a Tear Drop design.

5 MOL: Tear drop?

6 FIB: Yep, I used to cry like a baby every time I sat in it - till  
I got smart and hammered down the nails in the seat. It  
was the ---.

7 ~~SIDE:~~ HUMORING SCENE:

8 MOL: Which is the front end of that thing? Or haven't you  
decided?

9 FIB: This end, here, I think. (CLATTER) Yeah.....this end here.  
I'm building the front end low and the back end high. You  
see with a low front end --- OH MYOH, LA TRIVIA!

- 1 GALE: (PAISE IN) Hello, McGee....hello, Molly. Welllllll  
Building a soap box racer? That looks like fun!
- 2 FIB: Yeah. You wanta watch, La Trivi? Set down on the porch  
railing there, boy - and don't talk.
- 3 SOUND: HAMMERING
- 4 GALE: Excuse me - what's the idea of the low front, McGee? Are  
you getting it ready for television?
- 5 FIB: Nope, new principle, La Trivi! Front part is lower than  
the back part so it's always going downhill, see? Known  
to Science as The McGee Amendment to Newton's Law of  
Gravity. Named for the guy that discovered it. Newton.
- 6 GALE: Well, that's a pretty sloppy job of carpentering, McGee.  
Here, let me have that hammer. -- I'll show you a few  
tricks about --
- 7 FIB: I DON'T NEED NO HELP, LA TRIVIA! You just set down, boy.  
I know what I'm doing!
- 8 MOL: Oh, let him help you, dearie. After all, he's company,  
and.....
- 9 FIB: LET HIM GO BUILD HIS OWN SOAPBOX RACER. (THE HAMMER  
STOPS)
- 10 GALE: STINY: (COAXING) Oh, come on, let me drive a few nails,  
McGee. That looks like fun!
- 11 SOUND: HAMMERING...SOUND:

- 1 GALE: (COAXING) I work hard all day. Nobody ever lets me --  
Look, McGee. Next time you're down at City Hall, I'll  
let you drive the Mayor's private limousine!
- 2 FIB: (QUICK INTERLUDE) Yeah? The official car? Okay, La Triv -  
- here's the hammer.
- 3 MOL: Good.
- 4 FIB: ONE nail, La Trivia. How far can I drive the car??
- 5 GALE: All the way around the City Hall Garage. Inside, of  
course.
- 6 FIB: WHAT? GIMME BACK MY HAMMER!
- 7 MOL: McGee! Don't snatch it out of his hand like that!  
You'll break your glasses.
- 8 FIB: Well, gee-whiz.
- 9 SOUND: HAPPENING, BEHIND:
- 10 GALE: Look, McGee - you've been begging the city to fix the  
street in front of the house here, haven't you?
- 11 MOL: We certainly have, Mr. Mayor! It's got more bad cracks  
than McGee had in vaudeville.
- 12 GALE: Well, I sent the request to the City Engineer yesterday.

- 1 FIB: Tush! Swell! Here's the hammer.
- 2 GALE: Good. Where's a nail and --
- 3 FIB: When did they say they'd pave it?
- 4 GALE: They turned the request down.
- 5 FIB: GIVE THAT HAMMER!
- 6 MOL: Oh, for heaven's sake!
- 7 GALE: I sent the order back today, marked urgent! They'll start paving it tomorrow.
- 8 FIB: Here's the hammer.
- 9 MOL: And if they don't pave it, Mr. Mayor--you promise to come back and pull the nail out?? This is the silliest --
- 10 GALE: (HAPPILY) By George, I haven't done any carpenter work since - Let's see, I'll put this brace right here and --
- 11 SOUND: CLATTERING OF BOARD... HANGING
- 12 GALE: There! Hard as another nail while I'm down here and - (GRUNT) OOOO! Must have sprained my back...I can't straighten up!
- 13 MOL: Of course you can't, Mr. Mayor - you nailed your necktie to the porch.
- 14 GALE: I did? Oh, yes --
- 15 SOUND: RIPPING SOUND
- 16 TECH: TWIDLE
- 17 SOUND: OUT OF BRIDGE HANGING

- 1 MEL: Look at the glass in his eye, McGee! He hardly knows we're here!
- 2 FIB: I'll show him who's - DIDN'T IT, LA TRIVIA! GIMME THAT HAMMER - YOU BEEN WORKIN' ON IT FOR AN HOUR. YOU GOT A CHOUT COMIN' IN HERE TAKIN' OVER ME JOB! I DON'T TELL YOU HOW TO RUN CITY HALL, DO IT?
- 3 GALE: Oh, the heck you don't! Everybody does! Just a couple more nails, McGee. Come on - I -
- 4 FIB: NO SIR! By gosh, if I didn't have respect for your job as the Mayor of this town, I'd poke you right in the nose! If you weren't holdin' that hammer!
- 5 MEL: Oh, McGee, that's not -
- 6 GALE: (COLDLY) Oh, is that so? Well, if this hammer is all that's keeping you from striking me, McGee - I'll bang onto it! Where's another nail and -
- 7 WIL: (FADING IN) Hey, hi, fellas! Hi, Willy!
- 8 AD LIB "HELLO"
- 9 WIL: Tracy and I just stopped by to see how her room is coming along.
- 10 FIB: I'd of had it built by now, if La Trivia hadn't -



- 1 YEN: OH BOY, IS THAT GONNA BE IT, MR. SCOTT? IS THAT MY  
DADDY LITTLE SOAPBOX RACING RACE IS IT?
- 2 FIB: This is it, sis. Pretty rough yet, but when I get it  
finished---
- 3 WIL: Well, nothing is too good for Teeny, Pal. She was a Pet  
Milk baby and she's still a Pet Milk girl, because she --
- 4 FIB: YEAH, YEAH, YEAH....we know...you gon' to be at the  
Soap Box Derby tomorrow?
- 5 GALE: I'm the official starter, Harlow. It looks like a great  
race.
- 6 WIL: I'll be there. And speaking of a great race - my  
favorite one is the Hamon.
- 7 FIB: (GROANS)
- 8 MCL: Oh, that's cute! Isn't it, Mr. Mayor?
- 9 GALE: Uh..yee. How did that get into the conversation?
- 10 WIL: We were speaking of the race - and I just realized that  
when you race your children on Pet Milk, you get them  
off to a flying start.
- 11 FIB: This goes on all the time, La Trivia.
- 12 GALE: GREAT SCOTT!
- 13 WIL: You see, growing children need those good milk minerals  
and the Vitamin D, that Pet Evaporated Milk gives them -

- 3 GALE: But the Soapbox Derby is-
- 4 WIL: - and when you raise your child on Pet Milk, you're making sure he gets all the nourishing milk substances he needs to grow strong straight bones, and good sound teeth, because Pet is one of the best -
- 5 TEE: Hey, when does it start, Mr. Wilcox? He? When does it start?

- 9 GALE: Because I've done this every year for six years and I know what happens. At 3 o'clock sharp I pull the trigger of the starting gun. Nothing happens. Defective ammunition. At 3:02 I reload. At 3:02 and a half, I pull the trigger again. The gun falls apart. At three minutes after three, I snatch a paper bag from someone in the crowd, dump the lunch out of it, blow it up and BOM!!!  
THEY'RE OFF!

- 1 MOL: It seems to me that a big shot like you should have a better gun.
- 2 GALE: Well, I -
- 3 WIL: SPEAKING OF GUNS, SOME OF OUR HIGHEST CALIBER CITIZENS OPEN UP ON PET MILK...
- 4 FIB: Some of our biggest bores, too.
- 5 WIL: YOU SEE, IT TAKES A LOT OF MILK TO RAISE A HEALTHY CHILD AND SINCE PET MILK COSTS LESS GENERALLY THAN ANY OTHER FORM OF WIDLE MILK, IT'S QUITE A SAVING AND ...
- 6 THE: Hey, Mister McGee. Hey?
- 7 FIB: Yes, sis?
- 8 THE: Look...can I do anything to help you build my lil soap box racer team? Can I. How? Do anything? To? Help?
- 9 FIB: Yes, you can, sis. You know where Bremer's Drug Store is?
- 10 THE: Sure I do, I betcha. What do you want down there?
- 11 FIB: Uncle Herlow. Get him outa here and make him buy you a soda. That'll be a real help!
- 12 WIL: I can take a hint.
- 13 FIB: Yeah, and take the Mayor with you, too! Maybe I can get some work done!
- 14 GALE: (HEBT) Very well, McGee. If that's your idea of gratitude after I ruin a 5-dollar necktie and wash 3 thumbs trying to help -
- 15 MOL: THREE thumbs?
- 16 FIB: He washed one of mine.

- 1 GALE: Then I, too, can take a hint! But don't tempt me  
tomorrow!
- 2 FIB: TEMPT FOOT
- 3 GALE: When I fire that starting pistol tomorrow - DECK! Good  
day, Molly!
- 4 THE...MANSION...FIB: -- AD LIB DOUBTES
- 5 MIL: NoOoo, do you think he was angry?
- 6 FIB: Ahh, he don't scare me! How can you shoot anybody with a  
paper bag? Now learn see...(CLATTER OF WOOD) I'll have  
this baby finished by dark - put a coat of paint on it  
tonight and -
- 7 OLD M: (PADING IN) HELLO THERE, KIDS! HI, DAUGHTER, HI, JOHNNY!  
HWT, DID YOU KIDS SEE NESSIE GO BY HERE, DAUGHTER?
- 8 MIL: No we didn't, Mr. Old Timer, Is she -
- 9 OLD M: Got a letter for her from her brother, Milford. He's a  
soldier you know.
- 10 FIB: Private?
- 11 OLD M: Must be - it's sealed, Johnny. He and Fessie went down  
to see Milford last week and when we left, he stood there  
at the army base - with his hands in his overcoat pocket  
- wavin' goodbye.

- 1 NDL: How could he wave goodbye, with his hands in his pockets?
- 2 OLD M: BABS, Daughter! Got very talented ears!
- 3 FIB: He waves his ears?
- 4 OLD M: Yep, got the finest pair of ears in the Army, Milford has! About the size of a blacksmith's hands, and about the same color, come to think of it! Very muscular, Milford's ears.
- 5 NDL: He has muscles in his ears??
- 6 OLD M: Yep! Got a good job in the army, too, Milford has! Signal Corps. WEI WAG Division. They wig messages to him, and Milford wags 'em back. Very handy boy.
- 7 NDL: Well, I'm glad he's getting along well. The Army is sort of...
- 8 OLD M: Oh, he loves it, daughter. You see them now-reel pitchers of them airplane carriers? Where the fellows stand on the deck and wave the planes down with big red and yellow paddles in each hand?
- 9 FIB: Yeah, yeah, we've seen -
- 10 OLD M: Milford does it - No hands! And no paddles, too! Just ears! (CHUCKLES) So long, kids!

11 MUSIC: OPEN AND KING'S MEN: "THE UNIDENTIFIED MONG"

12 (AFFAIRS)

THIRD SPOT:

1 SOUND: CRASH HEARD UP AND DOWN IN D.C. ... OCCASIONAL LOUDSPEAKER  
(OFF)

2 HCL: Harry, McGee, it's nearly time to start. Look at the crowd!

3 FIB: Yeah, don't drop the racer, Ole - hold your end up, boy!

4 OLE: Don't worry about me, McGee - you got the biggest end. If  
you can hold THAT up --

5 HCL: LET US THROUGH PLEASE! RACING CAR COMING THROUGH, THROUGH  
PLEASE!

6 FIB: HEY TREAT! COME HERE!

7 TEE: (FADING IN - WORRIED) Ohh, Mr. McGee, was I ever scared,
