4. MOLLY: A very intelligent comment, dearie! Runnin' what???

5. FIB: Moonie! what do kids these days know about buildin' soapbox racers? Why when I was a kid, I could take an old easelouge crate, nail four pie tins on it for wheels, grease 'em with a stick of butter, and barrel down Main Street Hill faster'n you could holler "LOCK OUT FOR THE OPEN WHEELS!"

6. MOLLY: Ahhh, those happy childhood days!

7. FIB: Yep, I had quite a reputation as a builder of soapbox racers in them days, Molly. AHH, I'll never forget old Number Nine!

8. MOLLY: Number Nine?

9. FIB: That was my championship model. Old Number Nine. The one I finally won one with. Finished buildin' it at 1 minute after 2 on May 3rd, and won the race by 4 lengths, in 5 minutes and 6 or 7 seconds at the age of 8! My lucky Number Nine!

- 1 MOL: What was the prize? Two life insurance policies for
your son?
- 2 FIB: Hops. Two bucks and a new bicycle.
- 3 MOL: Oh, that's wonderful!
- 4 FIB: That's what I thought, till I rode past your house on the
bicycle, to show off. I rode no-hands, smacked into a
tree, and picked myself up no-teeth. I was so hurtin',
though, they grew back in again.
- 5 MOL: Including those fillings??
- 6 FIB: Aw no, this is my third set, thank goodness. My second
set grew in with the molars in front.
- 7 MOL: Ohhh! That's what my folks meant - they always said you
were a backward lad in those days, dearie. But I claimed

- 8 SOUND: DOOR CHIME
- 9 FIB: COME IN!
- 10 SOUND: DOOR OPENS
- 11 FIB: Well, well, look who's here! Doctor George Gamble,
Physician and Surgeon - and the best friend I could have
in the world. -- if I happened to own a mortuary! COME
IN, MOLLY!
- 12 SOUND: DOOR CLOSES
- 13 DOC: Hello, Molly. And thank you for that charming tribute,
Pickle-Head.

- 1 MOL Don't let him frost you, Doctor. If Major didn't like you
so much he wouldn't talk to you that way.
- 2 DOC₁ If wanting to insult someone is a sign of tender affection
I'm nuts about him, too.
- 3 MOL You look a little weary, Doctor. Had a rough week?
- 4 DOC₂ Yes - rugged, Molly. I'm going fishing for a few days,
though - and that ought to fix me up ship-shape.
- 5 PIB You're already shipshape, Doctor. The shape o' a ship.
A storm-shovel.
- 6 MOL Oh, Major, that isn't a very nice -
- 7 DOC₁ I don't mind him, my dear - with him, it's purely defensive.
- 8 PIB Whaddya mean, DE-fensive? I'm as OF-fensive as you are.
- 9 MOL More so, even!
- 10 DOC₂ I simply mean that --
- 11 SOUND: DOOR CLOSING

1 PIB: COME IN.

2 PIB: GOOD MORNING.

3 TEE: HI, MR. McGEE. HI, MRS. McGEE. HI, Doctor Gammel.

4 AD: LEE WELLOWS.

5 TEE: I just thought I'd drop in, Mr. McGee. You're always so nice to litt-l, chill-drin. And I wanna ask your advice, too, I betcha.

6 DOC: It's never necessary to ~~ask~~ Mr. McGee's advice, Teeny.

7 PIB: Hoper.

8 DOC: He throws it around like spaghetti at a Roman Picnic. And it can get you just as messed up, too.

9 MCE: What kind of advice do you want, Teeny?

10 PIB: Ask me anything, sis! Old Uncle Fibber, the question and answer man.

11 DOC: The question being, does he know any answers.

12 TEE: Well-l....you're so nice to litt-l chill-drin, Mr. McGee and you can fix things so dandy, and Willie Toops is buildin' a soapbox racer to get in the soapbox derby and - well, I thought if you would tell me how to make a racer, too - so I could race tomorrow, well - I -.

13 PIB: HUH!! WE WERE JUST TALKING ABOUT THAT, SIS....I USED TO BE A CHAMPION SOAP BOX RACER BUILDER.....

14 TEE: That's what I told Willie, I betcha....I said, WILLIE, I said, I'll betcha Mr. McGee could build the ~~BEST~~ soap box racer in the whole world, I said -

- 1 PIZ: Well, it's odd that you should ask my advice, sir. Because you're talkin' to the guy that he's probly the greatest authority on mecha mechs alive today.
- 2 DOC: You're alive today? That's odd. I could swear you -
- 3 PIZ: Quiet, Doc. First thing you do, Teeny, is you find yourself a big box.
- 4 TEENY: OHH, THAT'S A WONDERFUL IDEA.....!! Ouu....a big box??
- 5 PIZ: (MURKINLY) Then you find four wheels the right size and attach 'em right to the box.
- 6 TEENY: OHH, THAT'S A DANDY IDEA!!!! ATTACH THE WHEELS RIGHT TO THE BOX....HAPPILY I WILL WILLIN!!!! OH BOY....I DUSE WILK I KNOW AS MUCH AS YOU DO, KESTER!!!! AND KID ALL THE TOOLE YOU GOT....BUT....well....(SADLY) I'm just a littul girl and I can't do stuff like smart people like you.
- 7 DOC: This is the most obvious -.
- 8 MEL: Quiet, Doctor.....let it work itself out.

- 1 DOC: Okay.
- 2 TEE: Where was IT? Oh yes...anyway, Mister,...thanks ever so much for telling me how to do it, but maybe I better let it go till I'm a bigger kid and - well ...
- 3 PEB: Hooray!!!
- 4 TEE: Hooray!
- 5 PEB: Look.
- 6 TEE: Okay, here it comes!
- 7 PEB: I got an idea!!!!
- 8 TEE: I wondered if you were ever gonna' tell!
- 9 PEB: SUPPOSE I BUILD YOU A SCALP BICK RACER? I GOT THE TOOLS.....I GOT THE TIME....I GOT THE KNOW-HOW....IF I GET RIGHT TO WORK, I CAN ---.
- 10 TEE: OH MY, THIS IS WONDERFUL...! OH BOY!!!...THANKS EVER SO MUCH!!! OH, YOU'RE BACK TO LIT-TLE CHILD-ISHIN, MR. MOOSE!! OH, WAIT'll I TELL WILLIE.....
- 11 SCHOOL DOOR CLOSING AND SLAMMING....WALL STREET IN FOREGND.
- 12 TEE: HEY, WILLIE....HEY...WILLIE!!
- 13 WILL: Yeah! What happened? He fall for it?
- 14 TEE: Like a ton of bricks.
- 15 WILL: Is he gonna do it?
- 16 TEE: Oh sure. I gave him the nice-to-lit-tle children routine and he ate it up. I hope I don't break my neck in that racer, because some of the stuff he builds --.
- 17 MUSIC: "I WHISTLE A HAPPY TUNE".
- 18 (APPLAUSE).

1. SINGER (SINGING... FAIRLY SOFT)
2. FIB: (SINGS) GOSH, I HAD A TIGER FOR A PET,
HE CAME IN LEAPS AND BOUNDS;
THE DAY MY SISTER DISAPPEARED,
HE GAINED A HUNDRED POUNDS.
3. SINGER (SINGING)
4. FIB: (SINGS) WE KNOW HE WAS A MEAT-EATER,
AND OUR PIGS WERE IN A KNOT.
WE THINK HE EATEN OUT OF ORDER
CAUSE SISTER WAS A GIRL.
5. SINGER (SINGING)
6. HOL: (FAIRLY SOFT) How you coming along with the soap-box reader,
Mr. Lettering.
7. FIB: Lettering? I remind you of Charlie Lettering, the General
Motors genius?
8. HOL: No, I was thinking of Bone-Thumb Lettering, the handy man
we had in Peoria. His front porch was always a mess like
this, too.
9. FIB: I remember old Bone-Thumb. Used to build custom-built
chicken coops for the farmers. But he had to give it up
because he was always tailing himself inside. Wonder what
ever happened to him.

- 1 MUL: Last I heard, he went to Chicago in a shroud of gallots.
The man who opened the crate got the bullet surprise of
his life. (LAUGH) Don't you get it, Robert Pulitzer
Prize? It's a play on words with the ---.
- 2 PUL: THAT'S FUNKY, KID!
- 3 MUL: Why not?
- 4 PUL: Because I didn't think of it. (LAUGH) Look it's
startin to shape up now, Molly. This baby is gonna be a
exact copy of little old Huber Nine....the racer I built
as a kid. It was what you might call a Tear Drop design.
- 5 MUL: Tear drop?
- 6 PUL: Yes, I used to cry like a baby every time I sat in it - till
I got smart and hammered down the tails in the front. It
was like the ---.
- 7 MUL: WHAT'S THIS?
- 8 MUL: Which is the front end of that thing? Or haven't you
decided?
- 9 PUL: This end, here, I think. (LAUGH) Yeah.....this end here.
I'm building the front end low and the back end high. You
see with a low front end --- OH MY GOD, IS THAT IT?

- 1 GALE: (FADE IN) Hello, Robert...Hello, Molly. Wellllll
Building a soap box racer! That looks like fun!
- 2 PIB: Yeah. You wanna watch, La Trivia? Set down on the grass
railing there, boy - and don't talk.
- 3 JOHN HAPPILY
- 4 GALE: Excuse me - what's the idea of the law front, Robert? Are
you getting it ready for television?
- 5 PIB: Hmmp, new principle, La Trivia! Front part is lower than
the back part so it's always going downhill, sort known
to Science as The Hobos Amendment to Newton's Law of
Gravity. Named for the guy that discovered it. Newton.
- 6 GALE: Well, that's a pretty sloppy job of carpentering, McGee.
Here, let me have that hammer. -- I'll show you a few
tricks about --
- 7 PIB: I DON'T NEED NO HELP, LA TRIVIA! You just set down, boy.
I know what I'm doing!
- 8 HOL: Oh, let him help you, dearie. After all, he's company,
and.....
- 9 PIB: LET HIM GO BUILDI HIS OWN GOATFOOT RACER. (JOHN
STUNNED)
- 10 GALE: STINNY! (COAXING) Oh, come on, let me drive a few nails,
McGee. That looks like fun!
- 11 JOHN HAPPILY..PUSHED..

- 1 GALE: (DRAWING) I wore hard all day. Nobody ever lets me on.
Look, Major. Next time you're down at City Hall, I'll
let you drive the Mayor's private limousine!
- 2 PFD: (QUICK INTERRUPT) Yeah? The official car? Okay, La Trivia -
- here's the money.
- 3 MOL: Good.
- 4 PFD: City hall, La Trivia. How far can I drive the car??
- 5 GALE: All the way around the City Hall Garage. Inside, of
course.
- 6 PFD: WHAT? GIVE ME BACK MY HAMMER!
- 7 MOL: McGee! Don't scratch it out of his hand like that!
You'll break your glasses.
- 8 PFD: Well, yeah...
- 9 SOUND: HAMMERING, BEING:
- 10 GALE: Look, Major - you've been begging the city to fix the
street in front of the house here, haven't you?
- 11 MOL: We certainly have, Mr. Major! It's got more bad cracks
than McGee had in Woodsville.
- 12 GALE: Well, I sent the request to the City Engineer yesterday.

- 1 FDR: Yucky swell! Here's the hammer.
- 2 GALE: Good. Where's a nail and --
- 3 FDR: When did they say they'd pave it?
- 4 GALE: They turned the request down.
- 5 FDR: OH MY GOD THIS HAMMER!!
- 6 MOL: Oh, for heaven's sake!
- 7 GALE: I sent the order back today, marked urgent! They'll start paving it tomorrow.
- 8 FDR: Here's the hammer.
- 9 MOL: And if they don't pave it, Mr. Mayor--you promise to come back and pull the nail out!! This is the absolute --
- 10 GALE: (SIGHING) By George, I haven't done any carpentry work since - Let's see, I'll put this brace right here and --
- 11 OUND: CLATTERING OF BOARD, SAWING
- 12 GALE: There! Hand me another nail while I'm down here and - (GROAN) OUCH! Must have sprained my back...I can't straighten up!
- 13 MOL: Of course you can't, Mr. Mayor - you nailed your necklace to the porch.
- 14 GALE: I didn't oh yes --
- 15 OUND: RIPPING BOARD
- 16 ICH: TWIDDE
- 17 OUND: OUT OF BRIDGE SUMMONED

- 1 WIL: Look at the glow in his eyes, McGee! He hardly knows
you're here!
- 2 FIB: I'll show him who's - DADNT IT, LA TRIVIA! GIVE THA
NUMBER - YOU BEEN WORKIN' ON IT FOR AN HOUR. YOU GOT
A GHOST COMIN' IN HERE TALKIN' OVER ME JUST! I DON'T
TELL YOU HOW TO RUN CITY HALL, DO IT!
- 3 GALE: Oh, the heck you don't! Everybody does! Just a
couple more nails, McGee. Come on - I -
- 4 FIB: HE SIR! By gosh, if I didn't have respect for your job
as the Mayor of this town, I'd poke you right in the
nose! If you weren't holdin' that hammer!
- 5 HEL: Oh, McGee, that's not -
- 6 GALE: (COURTESY) Oh, is that so? Well, if this hammer is all
that's keepin' you from striking me, McGee - I'll
hang onto it! Where's another nail and -
- 7 WIL: (PADDING IN) Hey, Mr. Follies! Hi, Molly!
- 8 AD-LIB "HELLO"
- 9 WIL: Thony and I just stopped by to see how her motor is
coming along.
- 10 FIB: I'd of had it built by now, if La Trivia hadn't -

- 1 TOM: Oh boy, is that gonna be it, Mr. Mayor? Is that all
DANIEL LEPPIN BOULSON SAYING HE IS IT?
- 2 FID: This is it, sis. Pretty rough yet, but when I get it
finished-----
- 3 WIL: Well, nothing is too good for Terry, Pal. She was a Pet
Milk baby and she's still a Pet Milk girl, because she --
YEAH, YEAH, YEAH....we know...you going' to be at the
Soap Box Derby tomorrow?
- 5 GALE: I'm the official starter, Marlow. It looks like a great
race.
- 6 WIL: I'll be there. And speaking of a great race - my
favorite one is the Moon.
- 7 FID: (GIGGLES)
- 8 MOL: Oh, that's cute! Isn't it, Mr. Mayor?
- 9 GALE: Uh...yes. How did that get into the conversation?
- 10 WIL: We were speaking of the race - and I just realized that
when you race your children on Pet Milk, you get them
off to a flying start.
- 11 FID: This goes on all the time, La Trivia.
- 12 GALE: GREAT SOOTY!
- 13 WIL: You see, growing children need those good milk minerals

GROW UP ON FRESH MILK...
4. FID: Some of our biggest heroes, too.
5. WIL: YOU SEE, IT TAKES A LOT OF MILK TO RAISE A HEALTHY CHILD
AND SINCE FRESH MILK COSTS LESS GENERALLY THAN ANY OTHER
FORM OF WHOLE MILK, IT'S QUITE A SAVING AND ...
6. TEE: Hey, Mister McGee. Hey?
7. FID: Yes, sis?
8. TEE: Look...can I do anything to help you build my lil soap box
Power Street Can I. How? Do anything? To? Help?
9. FID: Yes, you can, sis. You know where Brewster's Drug Store is?
10. TEE: Sure I do, I betcha. What do you want down there?
11. FID: Uncle Harlow. Get him outa here and make him buy you a
sofa. That'll be a real help!
12. WIL: I can take a hint.
13. FID: Yeah, and take the Mayor with you, too! Maybe I can get
some work done!
14. GALE: (HINT) Very well, McGee. If that's your idea of gratitude
after I ruin a 5-dollar necklace and wash 3 thumbs trying
to help -
15. MOL: THREE thumbs!
16. FID: He washed one of mine.

1. GAIL: Then I, too, can take a hint! But don't tempt me
tomorrow!

2. FISH: TROT TROT

3. OLD: When I fire that starting pistol tomorrow - BOOM! Good
day, Nelly!

4. THE...MILKMAN...FISH -- AD 128 DOCUMENTS

5. NELL: Nellie, do you think he will angry?

6. FISH: Ahh, he don't scare me! How can you shoot anybody with a
paper bag? Now listen see... (CLATTER OF WOOD) I'll have
this baby finished by dark - put a coat of paint on it
tonight and -

7. OLD M: (padding in) HELLO THERE, KIDS! MI, DAUGHTER, MI, JOHNNY!
HEY, DID YOU KIDS SEE PEGGY GO BY HERE, DAUGHTER?

8. NELL: No we didn't, Mr. Old Timer, Is she -

- 4 OLD M: Yes, got the finest pair of arms in the Army, Milford has! About the size of a blacksmith's hands, and about the same color, come to think of it! Very muscular, Milford's arms.
- 5 MOL: He has muscles in his arms??
- 6 OLD M: Yep! Got a good job in the army, too, Milford has! Signal Corps. WEE WEE Division. They wig messages to him, and Milford Wags 'em back. Very handy boy.
- 7 MOL: Well, I'm glad he's getting along well. The Army is sort of...
- 8 OLD M: Oh, he loves it, daughter. You see them reversal pictures of the airplane carriers? Where the sailors stand on the deck and wave the planes down with big red and yellow paddles in each hand?
- 9 FID: Yeah, yeah, we've seen -
- 10 OLD M: Milford does it - No hands! And no paddles, too! Just arms! (CHEERLES) So long, kids!
- 11 MUSIC: ORCH AND FID'S JINGLE "THE STRUTTIN' SONG"
- 12 (APPLAUSE)

- 5 ROL: LET US THROUGH PLEASE! RADAR CAN COME THROUGH, THROUGH
PLEASE!

- 7 TIN: (PADDING IN - WORRIED) Ole, Mr. McGee, who I ever seen,
I betcha! It's almost race time and you, I thought you
weren't ever coming.
- 8 FID: (CHECKS) I told ya I wouldn't let him down. Let her down,
Ole.

9 ROLLER: THINK OF ANYTHING ELSE?

- 10 TIN: OH BOY, LOOK AT THAT! HEY WILLIE, IT'S ME!! LOOKIT! MY
LIT-TLE RACER IS HOME! LOOKIT!
