- 4 FIB: Why do you want stop at -
- 5 MOL: PLEASE!!!...STOP BY THAT SAILOR STANDING THERE...
- 6 FIB: Okay...I got the red light anyway...

- 10 FIB: Well! Nigguh, the sub must have a leak!
- 11 MOL: Yes, it's supposed to be watertight inside those things,
Ole.
- 12 OLE: Say - you know, Lars never thought of that! I go tell him
the next time it goes down, get inside the sub. Thanks for
the tip, missus. So long, both you fellers!

- 1 MCL: Well, so Lars was the hitchhiker who wasn't hitch hiking.
2 Say, incidentally, McGee...
- 2 FIB: Eh?
- 3 MCL: What if there was some way, or some method, by which a
person hitch hiking someplace could register with a
bureau and get approved by the police and wait in a certain
place, and --
- 4 FIB: HEY, I JUST THOUGHT OF SOMETHING!!
- 5 MCL: What, sweetheart?
- 6 FIB: (EXCITED) LOOK...SUPPOSE SOMEBODY ORGANIZED A KIND OF A
BOOKIN' AGENCY WHERE A GUY THAT HE WANTED TO HITCH HIKE
SOMEPLACE, COULD GO AND GIVE REFERENCES AND GET OKAYED
BY THE COPS...AND DRIVERS THAT WANTED TO TAKE SOMEBODY
ALONG FOR COMPANY COULD DO THE SAME THING...AND IF THE
GUY THAT BOY THE BUREAU CHARGED TWO BITS APIECE FOR
DRIVER AND HITCH HIKER...THAT'S FIFTY CENTS A RIDE...MOM!!

- 7 MCL: It's amazing...how on earth did you think of that?
- 8 FIB: I dunno...them things just come to me, I guess...HEY...
I'LL BET THERE'S A FORTUNE IN A THING LIKE THIS...HARD
ME THE PHONE, KIDD...BIG THINGS ARE GONNA HAPPEN AROUND
HERE!!
- 9 MCL: I'll just betcha!!
- 10 ORCH: "PLEASE DON'T TALK ABOUT ME WHEN I'M GONE"
- 11 (APPLAUSE)

1 SONG: PICKING UP AND DING, DING.

2 FIB: HELLO! WINDY VISTA REAL ESTATE COMPANY THIS IS FIBER
3 MOSE...PRESIDENT AND CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF THE
4 CERTIFIED KITCHEN-SINK CORPORATION, Limited.

5 MOL: Limited? With YOUR imagination?

6 FIB: LOCK, IN...I'M INTERESTED IN OFFICE SPACE. AT 14TH AND
7 GLE. OH, EIGHT OR TEN ROOMS...SWITCHBOARD...BIG
8 RECEPTION ROOM...YEAH,...NEW COMPANY. WOULD BE NEAR,
9 REFERENCED? ASK THE CHASE NATIONAL BANK IN NEW YORK ABOUT
10 ME!! YEAH...WELL, KEEP ME INFORMED! (PICKING UP)

11 MOL: Who do you know in the Chase National Bank?

12 FIB: Nobody. . . but my god. . . you don't think I'M gonna ask
13 references from anybody that KNOWS me, do you?

14 MOL: But a suite of eight or ten rooms...aren't you expanding
15 pretty fast, dearie? So far, all you have is an idea.

16 FIB: That was **all** Casey Jones had, too when he invented the
17 locomotive! This kinda thing takes imagination, kiddo....
18 It requires vision.

19 MOL: And after that, - NO-VISION.

1 FIB: Betcha! By George, the possibilities of this idea is
fantastic! I'll form a corporation, sue? Sell stock at
fifty dollars a par debenture with a maturity of 99 years
and a escalator clause that guarantees a flat percentage of
preferred dividend. Or, in lieu of dividends, a stock

just happen to have it here in my pocket, constantly so---

- 1 FIB: No, no, no - not THAT generous. BUT - as President of the Registered Hitchhikers Corporation Futeo, I'm gonna let you invest some munny with me. Fifty Bucks a share. Let you in on the ground floor.
- 2 DOC: So thanks, Nubbiehead. Every time somebody lets me in on the ground floor, I wind up losing my foundation garments.
- 3 MUI: How do you invest your munny, Doctor?
- 4 DOC: It's all tied up in cash.
- 5 FIB: Well, you better hop on the bandwagon, Bolt-Stretcher. With this stock, you could wind up the richest man in town.
- 6 DOC: I don't have to wind up the richest man in town - he's already wound up.
- 7 MUI: Who, Doctor?
- 8 DOC: McDonald, the bank President. Stepped over to pick up a penny at the Ben Ton, got his necktie caught in the escalator, and he's all wound up in the machinery.... Better go unwind him, I guess - so the customers can quit stopping over him. So long, kids.
- 9 SCENE: DOOR SLAM
- 10 MUI: Well, you didn't sell him any stock, Genrie. Anyway, isn't fifty dollars a share a little stiff?
- 11 FIB: Yeah, but I -- OH HISS! A POSTCARD COME FROM UNCLE LEOHIS! I had it in my pocket. If you hadn't said "a little stiff" I'd of forgot all about it!
- 12 MUI: Thanks. Hmmm. Well, for goodness sake, he's in France!
- 13 FIB: What'd he say - I didn't read it.

1 WIL: He says... "HAVE FINE JOB IN VINEYARD HERE. I AND FOUR
OTHER PEASANTS TRAMPLE OUT THE GRAPES AND MAKE WINE. I AM
THE FOREMAN AS I HAVE THE BIGGEST FEET. LOVE TO ALL....
(Signed) YOUR LOVING UNCLE. - DENNIS (Purpletoes) DISCULL.

2 FIB: That guy'll be trying to trample out some pebbles one of
these days, to make himself a batch of rock and rye. BUT..
BACK TO BUSINESS...I THINK I'LL GO DOWNTOWN AND GET SOME
STATIONERY PRINTED AND SIGN UP A HITCH HIKER...A TEST CASE.

3 WIL: Hadn't you better wait till you -

4 SOUND: DOOR CLOS

5 WIL: HIYAH, MOLLY...HIYAH PAL!! HEAR YOU'VE GOT A NEW BUSINESS!

6 SOUND: DOOR CLOS

7 FIB: Boy, the news has sure got around hasn't it? You know
something, Junior...this is the greatest idea I ever had...
Gonna make a million bucks in it. Start local, then spread
all over the state and then make it a national organization
I'll be travelling from the New York office to the Chicago
office...out to L.A. up to Wells Wells... (GROES SAD) swing
down to New Orleans... back to...(SNIFF) be spending months
on trains...plances...in hotels...(SNIFF)

8 WIL: What's the matter?

9 FIB: I dunno...just homesick, I guess. Whedye think of the idea
Junior?

10 WIL: Sounds very interesting, FBI. When I first heard about
it, I had another idea...

- 1 FIB: Well, speak up, Junior. My door is always open to you young fellows.

2 WIL: No.

3 MEL: Take another run at it, darlin', in second gear.

4 FIB: Okay. You see, my boy, when the stock market broke in
1929, then that didn't get out -

5 WIL: Didn't what?

6 MEL: Get out.

7 WIL: Okay.

8 BOB: DOOR SLAM

9 MEL: My....I was rude, wasn't I?

- 1 FIB: 'Tis just as well he went. I gotta get downtown and get busy. Got the approval of the Chief of Police...Got an okay from Mayor La Trivia...SIGN UP MY FIRST KITCH KIDEN and --
- 2 SOUND: DOOR CHIME:
- 3 MEL: COMES IN
- 4 SOUND: DOOR OPEN:
- 5 MEL: Oh Hello, Mr. Old Timer...
- 6 SOUND: DOOR CLOSE:
- 7 OLD: Hello, Daughter...Hello, Johnny. WHAT'S THIS I HEAR ABOUT YOU?
- 8 MEL: Well, he's got a real idea this time, Mr. Old Timer. He thinks there's a fortune in it. The question is, can he get it out? Tune in next week and hear the thrilling climax of this thrilling, chilling tale of man against Fate. Bong Bong Bong!
- 9 FIB: She's kiddin', Old Timer...Hey...you got any dough you wanna invest in a sure thing?
- 10 OLD: Johnny; ...the last money I invested in a sure thing, was ten bucks on a 3-year old at Flalico at 50-to-one and I had a food box tip that she was out to win. (SIGNS) Tried to hang myself that night, only I had a basement room that the ceiling wasn't high enough.

- 1 MEL: The horse lost, I presume?
- 2 OLD: Yes...she lost. In fact...the jockey rode her so slow he got arrested for vagrancy in the back stretch. Bah..bah.. that's one of Bessie's jokes. She sure thinks 'em up!
- 3 MEL: How is Bessie?
- 4 OLD: Fine, daughter...fine!! Does quite a business in radio jokes. Had a bout last week. Fella sees a cow walkin' along, followed by a flock o' ducks..."OH", he says, "QUACKERS AND MILK"! Bah hah! Bessie sold that one to four different comedians.
- 5 FIB: SHE SOLD THE SAME JOKE TO FOUR DIFFERENT COMEDIANS?
- 6 OLD: Sure...but Bessie's careful to sell 'em to fellers that are all on the air at the same hour. Nobody can listen to more'n one at a time. Wouldn't be fair, otherwise.

4 PEB: WHAT DO YOU MEAN...YOU'RE AFRAID SO. WHERE IS IT..IN THE...

5 OLD: So...in my kitchen. Folded it up and hid it away in a
old sardine can...realized later I hadn't even finished
the sardines. Oh well...lots of people got money out of
oil...there ought to be some way to vice versa. SO LONG
KIDS.....

6 SOUND: DOSE JAZZ

7 MUSIC: KING IS NEW... "ACT UP THE LINE KINGDOM"

8 (APPLAUSE)

- 1 FIB: Boy, oh, boy, I've really got things rolling. I looked at office space in the 14th and Oak Building, then I seen the newspapers and give 'em a human interest story. Talked to the Chief of Police ..the State Highway commission Mayor LA Trivia...
- 2 MCL: Heavenly days...you really were busy downtown. What did everybody say? Before they threw you out?
- 3 FIB: WHADDY MEAN, THROW ME OUT? EVERYBODY WAS DELIGHTED WITH THE IDEA! But they all say it depends on one guy. The Chief of Police.
- 4 MCL: My hint
