- 2 **CHUCK:** THINK...FAIR FIB:
- 3 **WILCOX:** The First Evaporated Milk - Fat Milk - presents Fibber Macee and Molly, with Bill Thompson, Gale Gordon, Arthur Q. Bryan, Dick La Grand, Tyler McVey and me, Harlow Wilson. The show is written by Doc Quirk and Phil Leslie, and directed by Max Hutto, with music by the King's Men and Billy Mills' Orchestra!
- 4 **CHUCK:** THINK UP AND FAIR FIB:

QUINCY COMMERICAL:

1 WILCOX: THIS IS THE TIME OF THE YEAR WHEN ANY MAN WITH SPORTING BLOOD IN HIS VEINS TAKES AN AFFECTIONATE LOOK AT HIS GOLF EQUIPMENT, AND HERE AT 79 WILFUL VISTA, JUST COMING DOWN FROM THE ATTIC WITH HIS ---

2 FIB: (OFF) Ooooooooooop!!!

3 SOUND: CLATTER AND THUDS OF FALLING LAMPSHADES WITH GOLF BAG...
OFF AT FIRST AND PADING IN FAST

4 FIB: (MUTTERS) Dad rat the dad rotted....

5 WIL: ----- BAG OF GOLF CLUBS, WE FOUND MR. MOORE, OF
-----FISHED MOORE AND MOLLY!!!

(APPLAUSE)

6 FIB: (GROANS) Ooooooooooooooh....

7 MOL: (PADS IN FAST--WARRIED) Noooo....are you hurt, dearie?
Are you all right? Did you break anything?

8 FIB: Yeah.....I cracked my ashie!

9 MOL: GOOD HEAVENS!!!...WELL, DON'T MOVE AN INCH TILL THE DOCTOR
GETS HERE!!! DOES IT HURT MUCH?

10 FIB: I'll say it does....it cost me four dollars and ninety-
five cents! That's pretty painfull!

11 MOL: What do you.....OH....YOUR NASHIE! One of your golf
clubs!

- 1 FIBs Yeah....and believe me, kiddo....I'M gonna miss it.
A good meshie can get you outa more trouble than if
your brother is the District Attorney.
- 2 MCLs Well, I wouldn't know about that, sweetheart. To me a
golf course in the spring is just a dumping ground for
six months of stored-up male profanity.
- 3 FIBs It's more than that, Baby. For a cemetery type folia
that he's not very active - most o' the time, it's -
- 4 MCLs Not cemetery, McGee. It's SEDENTARY.
- 5 FIBs Yeah...."sedentary"....meaning a guy that he's sudden
down most o' the time. For a guy like that, which I
happen to be one of him, golf is probably the best form
of exercise that can be took. I ever tell you about the
hole-in-one I made in Puerto, in 19 ought 23?
- 6 MCLs DID YOU EVER TELL ME? More times than I can --
- 7 FIBs OKAY, I WILL! Well sir, there I was - 185 yards
to the green - the wind against me - and my caddy had the
hiccups! I stopped up -
- 8 MCLs Look, love! You've told me that story so often I can
recite it backwards! (QUOTES) HERE'S THE HAD, CADDY MY--
ME WIND AGAINST THE -- AND GREEN TO THE YARDS, 185!
HE STOPPED --
- 9 FIBs Okay, okay, okay - scoff if you wanna. Deride me. But
by George, a hole-in-one don't happen to everybody.
The day I made mine, it was gettin' so dark I fell into
three sand traps on the way home.
- 10 MCLs Why did you wait till dark to play golf?

1 FIB: Had to. It was at the Puerto Country Club and I wasn't
a member. You know, you ought to learn golf, kiddo.

2 MLL: It's too expensive.

3 FIB: No, no, not necessarily. Personally, I use second-hand
balls, or then that I find, carry my own bag, tip no
caddies, and all-in-all, about as cheap a sport as you'd
find anywhere.

4 MLL: Oh you're just self conscious, Docie...

5 FIB: Well, anyway...it's a great little hack o' recreation.

Now you take this number four iron - (BATTLE OF CLUES)

6 MLL: Better start with number one. I'm not very --

7 ROUND: DOOR OPENS

8 FIB: COME IN!

9 ROUND: DOOR CLOS

10 MLL: Oh Doctor Grable...come in, Doctor.

11 ROUND: DOOR CLOSE

12 DOC: Thank you, my dear.....and good morning to you, drizgle-mug-

13 FIB: Rhyth, Melon-Squagler. You play golf?

14 DOC: Well, there are two schools of thought on that, my boy.

I say I do. The pro says I don't. He says I have a swing
like I was carrying Kot. Smith piggy back.

15 FIB: Personally, I'm an old hand at the game, Doc. Made a
hole-in-one, once.

16 DOC: Yes, you've often told.....

- 1 FIB: Back in 19 ought 23 it was. Florida Country Club. Done
it against almost impossible conditions. Dark sunin'
on, wind against me.
- 2 DOC: 185 yards...
- 3 MCL: - and a eddy with the hiccups.
- 4 FIB: Well, sir, I took my driver...
- 5 MCL: DRIVER!! I didn't even know you had a car then!
- 6 DOC: A driver, Molly, is the name of a golf club. That's the
club with which, theoretically, you get the most distance.
Personally, I could send the ball further by kicking it.
- 7 FIB: I've seen you do that, too. You thought I wasn't lookin'
but I seen you kick it out that sand trap last summer.

- 1 DOC: Any other witnesses?
- 2 FIB: Well-I-I no, but -
- 3 DOC: Then pipe down or I'll have you up for slander. Besides, you shouldn't talk. I heard you ask the caddy once, "HOW DO I LIE, CADDY?" And the caddy said, "WITH THE MOST BRASS EFFORTS, SIR".
- 4 MCL: It sounds like a vice honest game that develops good character and the player who keeps the score is the most likely to win.
- 5 FIB: You said it, sister! When Doc keeps score, you can hold the card up to the light and see where he's crossed his own scores.
- 6 DOC: Ohh look who's talking! Molly...if you intend to learn golf from McDoo....let me tell you just what kind of a sportsman he is.
- 7 FIB: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE! WHAT KIND OF A SPORTSMAN I KNOW GOLF DON'T IT I MADE A HOLE IN ONE, DIDN'T IT 3/5 TIMES AGAINST THE WIND AND A CADDY WITH THE NIG-
- 8 MCL: McDoo.
- 9 FIB: ENT
- 10 MCL: The Doctor was talking.
- 11 FIB: That's for sure. Well, go ahead, tattle-tale!

1 DOG: He accused me of altering the score card. Ask Mayor La
Trivitt about the time we played a thousand, and McGee
kept score. He won by fifteen strokes and took us for a
back a place. We dragged him back of the clubhouse and
forced him to admit he'd made out the complete score
card before he even left home.

2 MEL: Heavenly days...how ingenious!

3 FIB: I still don't know how you guys ever suspected me.

4 DOG: BECAUSE OUR NAMES AND THE SCORES WERE TYPEWRITTEN, YOU
FOOL! Watch him, Molly....he's a phoney!

5 CHORD: DOOR SLAM

6 CHORD: "HIM HIDE THE MOON"

7 APPLAUSE

SECOND SPOT

1 SOUND: BATTLE OF GOLF AND SHOT GOLF

2 FIB: All right, Nolly - now for your first lesson in the finer rudiments of golf, we'll start right here in the front yard.

3 NOL: Good. Right over here in the flower bed.

4 FIB: Why the flower bed?

5 NOL: Because I watched you practicing last year, and all that digging shouldn't go to waste. We can plow the whole -

6 FIB: Never mind that, kiddo. We ain't gonna be that violent. Now, I'll drop a ball on the ground here -

7 SOUND: FLAP

8 NOL: Isn't it awfully hard to hit down there, McGee? Why don't you throw it up in the air and swing at it and -

9 FIB: This is golf, kiddo! Not handball. Besides, you don't drive it right off the ground - you put a little tee under it.

10 NOL: TEAT (LAUGHS) Oh, you golfers and your silly superstitions. I suppose that's like throwing a pinch of salt over your shoulder when you spill it. Or like -

11 FIB: No, no - this ain't a superstition. You put a small tee under the ball to hold it off the ground so -

12 NOL: OHHH, A TEA BAG! Will orange juice do? Because I'll run in the house and -

13 FIB: NO, NO, NO, NEVER MIND!! I'll skip the tee! I'll just hit it off the ground here. Hand me an iron - a number eight.

- 1 MOL: How'd you do that? An iron?
- 2 FIB: Outta the bag there!! Every good golfer carries at least eight irons with him, Molly!
- 3 MOL: Then why are his pants always so baggy? Most golfers' clothes look like they haven't seen an iron for months!
- 4 FIB: (PAUSE) I'm really startin' from scratch with you, ain't I tootain'?
- 5 MOL: Well, I told you I don't know anything about-
- 6 FIB: Look - watch this! You see that dishpan I put over there?
- 7 MOL: My good one.
- 8 FIB: I'm gonna knock the ball into the pan. A chip shot. Now watch. I keep my head down...left arm straight...short back swing...
- 9 SOUND: SWISH, SWACK...WIND WHISTLE...BALL FLICK ONTO METAL.
- 10 MOL: HEAVENLY DAYS!! THAT WAS WONDERFUL, DEARIE!
- 11 FIB: Right in the dishpan, eh?
- 12 MOL: No, right in the mailbox....
- 13 FIB: In the mailbox? I musta aimed it.
- 14 MOL: You certainly did. Right in two. Here's the other half of it, right here.
- 15 FIB: Well wheddye know? I musta of...
- 16 MOL: HOLD IT, DEARIE!! LOOK WHO'S COMING...HELLO THERE, OLE!
- 17 OLE: Hello, Missus. Hello NoOce.
- 18 FIB: High Ole.

- 1 OLE: What you doin', M'aseus. Teachin' McGee to play golf?
- 2 MOL: No, he's teaching me, Ole. Though personally, I think it's a pretty silly game. Big grown men chasing a little bitty ball around all day and beating it with a stick doesn't look very sporting to me.
- 3 OLE: Where did you learn to play golf, McGee? If yet?
- 4 FIB: WHO, ME? BOY, YOU'RE TALKIN' TO THE GUY THAT I MADE A HOLE-IN-ONE IN 19 OUGHT 23. I REMEMBER IT LIKE IT WAS YESTERDAY. I STEPPED UP TO THE TEE...
- 5 OLE: Was that in Peoria, McGee?
- 6 MOL: Yes, it was, Ole.
- 7 FIB: Yep. 285 yards it was. I stepped up to the tee and --
- 8 OLE: With the wind against you?
- 9 FIB: ...Yep. I stepped up to the tee and --
- 10 OLE: -- and it was almost dark?
- 11 FIB: ...Yep. I stepped up to the tee and -
- 12 OLE: -- with a caddy with the hiccups, McGee?
- 13 MOL: That's right, Ole. He stepped up to the tee and --
- 14 FIB: Yep - I selected my favorite driver - waved to the caddy to move back and - (FAUSE) You heard this before?

- 1 OLE: McGee, every spring I expect three things, Crocuses, housecleaning and McGee's hole-in-one story. I was saying to my niece yesterday -
- 2 NIE: Oh say, how is your wife, Ole? Well, I hope?
- 3 OLE: Well, I hope so too, Niece. We have a little trouble at our house today though. Little Sven, my littlest kid - he's in bed.
- 4 FIB: That's too bad. He come down with something, Ole?
- 5 OLE: Yes, he come down from the top shelf of the pantry with the cookie jar, McGee. When my Niece picks up the jar, it's got a busted bottom - so she picks up Sven and gives him the same.
- 6 FIB: You ever play golf, Ole?
- 7 OLE: Nope - all I know about golf, is one day I go and watch Mayor La Trivia play. "Good relaxation, Ole?" he says. It was very confusing to me, McGee.
- 8 FIB: Nothing confusing about it. What did he do?
- 9 OLE: Well, first he puts a little ball down, takes a stick like you got there, holler "four", and knocks the ball in the woods.
- 10 NIE: Oh dear.

- 1 OLE: Then we go in the woods, and he takes the club and chops enough small firewood to last all winter - only he don't hit the bell.
- 2 FIB: Well, in the rough you always --
- 3 OLE: Then he talks to himself while swings again, and knocks the bell in a scampile. We go to the scampile and he knocks it back in the woods.
- 4 MOLA: Sounds spontaneous.
- 5 OLE: We go back in the woods - he takes big swing with the club - knocks the bell in the lake - throws his clubs in the lake - throws his hat in the lake - throws his caddy in the lake - screams - and jumps in the lake. It takes three of us to drag him out and all the way home he keeps moaning why don't we let him drown himself!
- 6 FIB: Hipeah!
- 7 OLE: If that's relaxation, McGoo - I think I take up steepie-jacking. So long, both you fellows. (~~POSTER~~ AWAY)
- 8 MOLA: Look McGoo...let's just skip the golf lesson. I think it's silly game and -
- 9 FIB: No, baby. You gotta learn. I want you to play golf with me. I'm your husband. You're my wife. This is for companionship. We own to golf pole. Why I can see us now...when we're in the sunset of life, strolling down the green fairways, hand-in-hand --
- 10 MOLA: - still looking for the ball we'll no doubt lose this afternoon. All right, dearie. Let me try it once.

- 1 FIB: SWELL...THAT'S THE SPIRIT! I'll tee up the ball - there!
Now you take the club and swing at it easy. KEEP YOUR
HEAD DOWN NOW!! SLOW BACK SWING...LEFT ARM STIFF...
- 2 MOL: Be quiet a minute and let me concentrate.
- 3 SOUND: WHISH...CLICK!...WIND WHISTLE...CLANK OF BALL IN DISHPAN!
- 4 MOL: Like that, you mean?
- 5 FIB: ME GOSH...YOU DONE IT!!! THE VERY FIRST TIME!!
- 6 MOL: Well, I just watched how you did it. You aimed at the
dishpan and put it in the willow...I aimed at the willow
and put it in the dishpan. NOW, I think I understand!!
You shoot for where you don't want it to go. That's why
I think this is such a silly -
- 7 WIL: (FADE IN) THAT WAS A GREAT SHOT, MOLLY!! HOW LONG HAVE
YOU BEEN PLAYING GOLF?
- 8 MOL: About 20 seconds, Mr. Wilcox.
- 9 FIB: I'M learning her how to play the game, Junior.
- 10 WIL: Well, she looks like a very apt pupil.
- 11 MOL: Very apt, Mr. Wilcox. Very apt to give it up any minute.
- 12 FIB: Reason she's catching on so quick, Junior, is on account
of she's being taught by me, which I'm the guy that he
made a hole in Florida, in 19 ought 0) -- in one, once.

- 1 WIL: You know what the greatest hole-in-one in America is,
Molly?
- 2 MOL: Yes. In 19 ought 23, in Peoria -
- 3 WIL: No, not that one, Molly. Look, you take an economical
housewife, one who watches the budget. She takes a
can of Pet Milk off the kitchen shelf and makes a
hole-in-one, side of it....
- 4 MOL: Oh, that's cute, isn't it, McGee?
- 5 FIB: Ahh - cute my cuticle.
- 6 WIL: - then she makes another hole in the other side of it,
and PRESTO, out comes the most economical, money-saving
rich wholesome milk that money can buy! Pet Evaporated
Milk!
- 7 FIB: What kind of club does she use for that, Junior? A
brassie? Because that's the brassiest approach to a
commercial -
- 8 WIL: It's very easy to see what a good food investment Pet
Milk is Pal, because Pet - which is just good whole
milk -
- 9 FIB: Speaking of hole, Junior - the one I made in-one,
back in Peoria, was 185 yards.
- 10 MOL: You mentioned that, dearie.
- 11 FIB: Well, Milky does it, too!
- 12 WIL: Yes, Pet Milk is good whole Milk, concentrated to
double-richness by evaporation, and Pet Milk costs
less generally than any other form of whole milk!
Less than half as much as cream! That's important,
as any housewife knows.

- 1 FIB: Speaking of "nose" - I aimed mine at the green that day and sighted down it and that glass a hole to the right, see -
- 2 SOUND: WHISH, CLICK, WIND WHISTLE, CLATTER OF BALL IN DISHPAN
- 3 MOL: (EXCITED) LOOK, MOGEE....I DID IT AGAIN....RIGHT IN THE DISHPAN!
- 4 FIB: Well, naturally. When I teach somebody to play golf, it's only reasonable to....
- 5 WIL: Look, kids. I'm meeting the mayor out at the municipal golf course at 3 o'clock. Why don't you join us and make it a foursome?
- 6 FIB: Well, I dunno, Junior. Molly's just a beginner and with the rest of us bein' experienced golfers -
- 7 SOUND: WHISH, CLICK, BALL IN PAN AGAIN..
- 8 MOL: Well, that's three times in a row.
- 9 FIB: - and I wouldn't want you guys to accuse me of my wife holding up the game when -
- 10 MOL: (YELLS) PURE!!
- 11 SOUND: WHISH, CLICK, BALL IN PAN
- 12 MOL: Four it is.
- 13 WIL: Look, Pal - don't worry about your wife holding up anybody's game. Just bring her along to hold YOU up.
- 14 MOL: You must be good, Mr. Wilcox - you played in the tournament last year, didn't you?

- 1 WIL: Yes, but I didn't do very well, Hally. When the scores were all handed in, I wasn't even close.
- 2 FIB: Tournament player, eh? What was your handicap, Junior?
- 3 WIL: Honesty...(PAISES) See you out there, kids - four o'clock.
- 4 MEL: See you, Mr. Wilcox.
- 5 FIB: Now then, Tootsie, let's get on with the lesson. When I made my hole-in-one, back in Peoria -
- 6 MEL: What's so exciting about making a hole-in-one? I've just done it four times in a row.
- 7 FIB: Yeah, but you're a beginner. You got beginner's luck, when you been -
- 8 OLD: (PAISE IN) WELL, HELLO THESE KIDS...WHATCHA DOIN' PLAYIN' CROQUET?
- 9 MEL: Oh hello, Mr. Old Timer. So, McGee is teaching me golf.
- 10 FIB: It's a grand old game, Old Timer. Ever play it?
- 11 OLD: Well, I never exactly PLAYED it, Johnny..but I used to caddy. Had a rather amusing experience once, which I should like to relate in my humorous fashion.
- 12 MEL: Please do!
- 13 OLD: Thank you. I shall. It was just after Papa had to leave Norfolk, Virginia, on account of the Mason Jar episode.
- 14 FIB: What was the Mason Jar episode?
- 15 OLD: It was when Papa was hired to blow up some stumps near the Striner's Hall and used too much dynamite..jammed so many Masons they ran him outa town.
- 16 MEL: And you were a caddy at the time?

1 OLD: Yes daughter...First time I ever caddied was for a lady
friend of mine, and when she said, HOW IS MY BACK SWING? I
says, "Frankly, homeary", I says, "I prefer it to your front
swing, because when you sit in your front swing the street
light shines on it so bright, that -".

2 FIB: Well a minute....was that the amusing incident?

3 OLD: No, Johnny....that was later. I was caddying for the local
golf champion. Well sir, kids, he wound up and smacked the
ball so hard it went clean across the State line into
Kentucky. When we got there, and seen where the ball landed,
he was so tickled he set right down and wrote me kind of a
request number.

4 MIL: A request number? A song, you mean?

5 FIB: What was the name of it?

6 OLD: "CARRY ME BACK TO OLD VIRGINY". (SINGLES) So long, kids.!!

7 GRACE AND KING'S MOM: "HOOLES, SUN DE MOON".

8 (APPLAUSE)

1 SOUND: BIRD TWITTERS...FAR OFF CRY OF "FORE"

2 MOL: Did you see how that man drove over there, Mr. Mayor?
Right into the woods!

3 GALE: Yes, that's my neighborhood butcher, Molly - His life is
just one bad slice after another. (And look who's talking!)

4 MOL: I wish it was our turn to tee off. I want to get this over
with and go home.

5 WIL: OO HONEY? That's a happy little attitude to start off with.
Don't you like golf, Molly?

6 MOL: I don't know whether I will or not, Mr. Wilcox. I'm just
so sick of hearing about McGee's hole-in-one back in
Peoria -

7 GALE: Yes, we know. In 19 ought 23, with the wind against him,
a caddy with the hiccups -

8 WIL: Wait a minute, - here he comes. Who's that he's talking
to, Molly?

9 MOL: I don't know, but -

10 MAN: (FADING IN) That's very interesting sir. Caddy had the
hiccups, did he?

11 FID: (FADING IN) Yep, it was 185 yards to the green, bud, and -

12 MAN: And you had the wind against you?

- 1 FIB: Yep, and that's how I made my hole in one back in Peoria
in 19 ought 23. If there's any more advice I can give you,
but - I doubt it.
- 2 MAE: Thank you very much.
- 3 FIB: Not at all. Hey fellows - WE ABOUT HEADIN TO THE OFF?
- 4 GALE: Just about, McGee.
- 5 WIL: Who was the good-looking man you were talking to, dearief
- 6 FIB: Pella named Speed. Sassy Speed. Plays a little golf.
Nice guy. WELL...WHAT ARE WE WAITING FOR? I'm HEADIN FOR -
- 7 GALE: McGee...don't you know who Sassy Speed is?
- 8 FIB: Sure...he's the guy I was just talkin' to. Why?
- 9 GALE: Never mind. But I'll bet this was a big day for him...
meeting a golfer like you.
- 10 FIB: Well, my gosh, anytime I can help a fellow golfer with
a few tips on the game, I'm -
- 11 WIL: COME ON...WE'RE UP!
- 12 FIB: Okay I'll drive first fellas, because I want Molly to see
how it's done. Because when I made my hole in one -
- 13 WIL: THE OFF...GADEY!
- 14 FIB: - this is how I done it. (YELLS) FORE!!!
- 15 SOUND: WHISH...CRASH!!

1 MOL: Nice punt, Charlie! Punt it out! KICK it out!

2 FIB: Precision shot. We call that a Mulligan, Molly.

3 MOL: I see. Hit it with your spoon and land in the stew.

4 WIL: Come on, Pal. Lets get going.

5 FIB: Okay. Stand back, everybody.

6 SOUND: SWISH: CLICK: SMOOT WIND WHISTLE

7 FIB: Whoops...topped it! That's the way you wanna do it, kiddo, only I was just showing you what happens when you raise your head.

8 MOL: I remember. Now let me see....hand down...left arm straight slow backswing...wait a minute...what do I aim for?

9 GALE: The green is just over the top of that little hill, Molly.
