4 MOLLY Oh my, it's good to get home again, McGee!

5 PIB: Sure is, kiddo.

6 MOLLY It was nice at Aunt Sarah's, but I was beginning to get
a real case of nostalgia, dearie.

7 PIB: Me too. It's the water, I think. Full of chlorine.
Boy, the old place looks just the same, don't it?
How long we been away now?

8 MOLLY Five days....Unlock the door, will you - these bags are
heavy.

9 PIB: Oh, sorry! Goshwitz, I'm afraid I'm not very
thoughtful, Molly - expectin' you to open the door
when you got both hands full.

10 MOLLY Think nothing of it, dearie. I could have done it
with my teeth, of course, only I don't have the key.

11 PIB: Here. (CLICK OF LOCK - DOOR OPEN) Get the bags
inside - I wanna gather up the newspapers here.

12 SOUND: TWID OF DOOR SET DOWN

- 1 MOL: Wow! I know why they call those boulders "glaciatons"
all right! They feel like they're full of stones,
and I'm glad to set them down.
- 2 PIB: (SILENTLY OFF) Five days of the Windful Vista Gazette
is quite a stack of stale stuff, Molly. (PUSHES PAPER)
Scattered all over the porch.
- 3 SPOON: DOOR CLOSE
- 4 MOL: What's in the paper - anything interesting?
- 5 PIB: (HOLDING UP PAPER) Well, you know the Gazette - the
only time we ever got anything interesting in this
paper was when they used to wrap hot tamales in it....
Here's somethin' about a friend of yours, though.
- 6 MOL: Who?
- 7 PIB: Old Man McDonald, the President of the Third National
Bank's wife. Picture of her plantin' a tree at the
Animal Shelter. Caption says "A DOG'S BEST FRIEND".
- 8 MOL: Well, she should be - she looks like a Princess....
What's it say on the back page there - something about
Red China?
- 9 PIB: Whew! Oh - they're havin' a sale on it at the
Grocery Shop. (PUSHES PAPER) Remember when they
opened that place, Molly?
- 10 MOL: I remember.

- 1 PIB: (CHECKING) They run an ad that said "All Visitors
Get Crockery Free" - and Uncle Dennis thought it
said "Crocked". He ran all the way down there and - .
- 2 MOL: (RESPONDING) Well, now, that was a natural mistake,
Charlie. His glasses were foggy.
- 3 PIB: So was Uncle Don -- (PAUSE.....MUCH) Oh look at
this, kiddo! Here's a cute picture. (SMILING) (PAUSE)
A little mother bird built a nest in an open mailbox
on some guy's porch!
- 4 MOL: In a mailbox? My goodness!
- 5 PIB: Yep - it's sort of a human interest picture.
- 6 MOL: Should be interesting to birds, too.
- 7 PIB: Yep, it says "Your loving photographer took this
photo of one tenant who has solved her housing problem".
- 8 MOL: That's cute.
- 9 PIB: Says "Finding a mailbox with the lid open on the front
porch at 79 Wistful Vista, our feathered friend - built
her nest in it, completely sealing the top of the box
with mud and straw and - 79, WISTFUL VISTA. HEY,
THAT'S OUR HOUSE!!
- 10 MOL: What?
- 11 PIB: LOOK! IS THIS A PICTURE OF OUR TENANT? (PAUSES PAPER)
THAT'S OUR BRITNA, AIN'T IT???

- 1 HOL: Heavenly days - IT IS!! Let's look and see if she's still
there.
- 2 MAILED BOOK ARRIVED POST, SCOTTISH FISH
- 3 PIB: Migooh, Molly - look at him settin' there!
- 4 HOL: Isn't that wonderful....Hello, Birdie. You're the little
mother?
- 5 SCOTT BIRD: CHIRP CHIRP
- 6 PIB: Hello, Birdie - how's the little birdie?
- 7 SCOTT BIRD: ALERT CHATTERING
- 8 PIB: That's cute. He thinks I'm gonna - Hey, Molly, there's a
letter under that seat! I can see it thru the little
window.
- 9 HOL: What is it - a circular?
- 10 PIB: All I can see is part of the return address. Says, "AFTER
5 DAYS, RETURN TO UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT, DEPARTMENT OF".
- 11 HOL: Of what?
- 12 PIB: I dunno. That's all I can see of it. But migooh, THE
UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT! RETURN IN FIVE DAYS TO! WE BEEN
GONE 5 DAYS! HEY, THIS MIGHT BE IMPORTANT.

- 5 MOL: Wait, look who's coming, McGee! HELLO, DOCTOR!
- 6 PIR: PUTTING UP OF FENCE
- 7 DOC: (PAIR IN) Welcome home, Molly..Hello, Footlocker.
- 8 PIR: Footlocker?
- 9 DOC: Yes, that's a low chest and yours has slipped so far down, I - OH...HEY YOU KNOW WHAT THERE'S A BIRD'S NEST IN YOUR MAILBOX!
- 10 PIR: Yeah, we know, Patco...we seen it. And also a letter from the Government in there, and I can't get it out..

- 11 MOL: Habeas CORPUS. Not corpus.

Well, landbucket...you got any suggestions?
- 2 DOC: No, but speaking of confinement, I've gotta get to the hospital. At least by tomorrow.....Labor Day.
- 3 MOL: Tomorrow isn't Labor Day, Doctor, it's Decoration Day.
- 4 DOC: For Mrs. Haderhatch, it's Labor Day. Well, if you go to Alcatraz, McGee, I'll bake you a cake with a pie in it.
- Bye now.....
- 5 SCHOOL PRINCIPAL DROWNS PUPPIES
- 6 FDR: Baby, this thing has got me worried....Maybe I can coax the bird off long enough to get the letter out from....JANE BIRKIE....HIS IT, BIRKIE.....
- 7 SCREAMING ANGEL TWITTERS...LOUD FLUTTERING
- 8 FDR: OUCH!! DAD-RUT THE DAD-BATTED....BIT MY THIGH!
- 9 MOL: Oh wasn't that cute.....McGee....it WINKED AT ME!!
- 10 SEAGULL "ON TOP OF OLD SMOKY"
(LAUGHING)

- 1 SOUND: SCATTER OF TOOLS BEING LADD DOWN.
- 2 MOL: Good heavens, Hobee...what are all the tools for? What are you going to do?
- 3 FIR: I'm gonna get that letter outa that mailbox, that's what I ain't gonna have Docile Sue on my tail for because I ignored a official communication.
- 4 MOL: BUT YOU CAN'T TAKE THAT LITTLE BIRD OFF THE NEST WHEN IT'S HATCHING ANY EGG!
- 5 FIR: I ain't gonna. I'm gonna chop a hole in the hall wall and leave the letter outa the BACK of the mailbox.
- 6 MOL: CHOP A HOLE IN THE HALL WALL? Oh, NO!
- 7 FIR: You got a better idea?
- 8 (PAUSE)
- 9 FIR: Then I chop a hole in the hall wall. Here we go....
- 10 SOUND: CHIPPER PLASTER.....
- 11 FIR: You'll admit I tried everything else, Hobee. I tried luring it off the nest with bread crumbs...I sprinkled birdseed here-there all over the porch...I tried kindness and patience....
- 12 MOL: Maybe you didn't try the right kind of bait....
- 13 FIR: I tried everything from worms to chocolate doughnuts....but I don't know what to feed it unless I know what kind of a bird it is.

- 1 MOL: Well, if it's any help to you, Mr. Wimble just came
up the walk with his Bird Book, George. He's out there

- 3 ~~MOL~~ BOOK OPEN
- 4 WINE:Hello, folks.

little feathered friend out there?
- 7 WINE: Feathered FRIEND, Mr. McGee.
- 8 FIR: It may be a friend to you, boy, but it ain't your
letter that I gotta return it to the Government in
5 days, which I've already used up, she's settin' on.
It's mine!
- 9 MOL: Did you get a good look a. the bird, Mr. Wimble?
- 10 FIR: Yeah, what kinda bird are we bein' infested with,
anyhow? You know?
- 11 WINE: Well, as near as I can make out from my Bird Book, it's
a cinch it isn't a finch....
- 12 FIR: We don't care what it ain't....we wanna know what it is.

- 1 WIMP: No it definitely isn't a seagull, Mrs. McGee. As far as I can make out, it seems to be a combination, a hybrid....etc.
- 2 FIR: Gross?
- 3 WIMP: Gross!!! I'll say...it's a nasty little bird...In fact, I'd classify it as a genuine Sproblarkface.
- 4 MOL: A what? A Sproblarkface??
- 5 WIMP: Yes....it has the bill of a sparrow, the breast of a robin, feet like a lark and a disposition like Scroftyface -- my big old wife....
- 6 FIR: How is the old...I mean, how is Mrs. Wimble, Wimpster?
- 7 WIMP: Oh, she's just dandy, Mr. McGee. She's up to something today which just delights me!
- 8 MOL: Really, Mr. Wimpster? What is she up to?
- 9 WIMP: Up to Saint Paul, Minnesota to visit her sister. I wrote her a little poem this morning.
- 10 FIR: Can we keep you from reciting it, Wimp?
- 11 WIMP: With the greatest difficulty, Mr. McGee. I call it "MINT SAUCE"
- 12 MOL: Oh that's a cute title for a poem...."MINT SAUCE..."

1 WINT: Yes... "MINT SAUCE"

3 FIB: Well...back to work...

4 SOUND: CHIPPING.

5 MOL: That's a horrible mess you're making of the ball wall.
McCone....

6 FIB: Well, it's gotta be done, kiddo...I can't take that bird
off the nest and I GOTTA get that letter from the
Government. So, only thing to do is chop thru behind it...

7 SOUND: CHIPPING.

8 MOL: You're sure you're cutting thru the right place?

9 FIB: I measured it, with a rubber band. Couldn't find the top

- 3 JUNIOR: DOOR UP!!
- 4 WILCOX: MY PAL.....MOLLY....YOU KNOW SOMETHIN'...YOU GOT A KID IN YOUR MILKBOX!!
- 5 MCLE: Yes, Mr. Wilcox....we know that.
- 6 PIB: We're keepin it there for a pal, Junior.
- 7 WIL: Good for you!!....I've got a little pal at home and you know where I put it? -
- 8 MCLE: So....where?

2. FIB: Why? Do you like birds?
3. TEE: Oh, yes....I LOVE birds, I betcha. I think birds are
the prettiest things that fly except my cousin Charlene.
4. FIB: Your cousin Charlene?
5. TEE: Sure....she's a hostess on a airline.
6. FIB: She is, eh?

5 MOL: How do you get thru the metal mailbox?

6 FIB: Can open. (CHIPPING) Soon'n I chip some more plaster I'll be ready to --

7 REED...DOORBELL:

8 MOL: COME IN!!

9 REED...DOOR OPEN:

10 MOL: Well, heavenly days... His Honor, Mayor La Trivia....

11 OLE: And me too, Miami.

12 MOL: AND OLE FROM THE BEAS CLUB... McGee... look who's here!

13 REED...AD LTB REACTS:

- 1 GALE: Say McGee.....do you know what? You've got a bird in your mailbox.
- 2 GALE: Mr. Meyer and I was walking past one day when we see a bird fly into mailbox.....
- 3 GALE: And Ole said...."OH, AN AIR MAIL LETTER FOR MCGEE".....
- 4 GALE: (CHUCKLES) I just made a small joke, McGee.
- 5 FISH: Yes, a very small one! And don't worry, I know all about the bird in the mailbox.
- 6 MUL: And there IS a letter in there, too. Behind the bird's nest.
- 7 FISH: Letter from the government, and the only way I can get it out without disturbing the bird off the nest is chop a hole in the wall o' the hall...which I'm doing.....
- 8 GALE: I got lots of letters from Washington, McGee. My cousin Thor, he's big bureaucrat there.
- 9 GALE: You mean ~~CONFIDENTIAL~~, O.J.?
- 10 GALE: No, erato,- he creates business for big fun and storage company.
- 11 MUL: Well, McGee is a little worried about this letter. Goodness only knows what it could be.
- 12 FISH: Yeah....might be almost anything....draft notice.... Federal Grand Jury summons....some kind of an appointment.....As a politician, La Trivia....what do you think?

- 1 DALE: As a politician McGee, I would say that any communication from your government, deserves your immediate attention, your earnest consideration and your heartiest co-operation, BUT, as Roger La Trivis, Private Citizen, I would say, "WHATEVER IT IS FRIEND YOU NEVER GOT IT!"
- 2 OLE: Our kid, little Ole, Senior who is only three years old, gets letter yesterday from -
