ROD: HI-DY, FRIENDS...IT'S KINDA COLD TONIGHT, AIN'T IT? WHY, BY NED, IT WAS SO COLD IN HOHENWALD THE OTHER NIGHT THAT I JUST LAID THERE IN BED AND SHIVERED.

FOLEY: ROD, DID YOUR TEETH RATTLE?

ROD: NO, MR. FOLEY-- WE DON'T SLEEP TOGETHER! (LAUGHS)

WE HAD US A LITTLE EXCITEMENT DOWN IN HOHENWALD THIS WEEK...ME AND POPPY WAS IN TOWN THE OTHER DAY AND WE WENT OVER TO UNCLE CYPE'S SNIP, SNAP, AND BITE RESTAURANT TO GET US A GRILLED GOATEBURGER AND A SODY POP, AND UNCLE CYPE WAS TELLIN' US ABOUT HIM AND AUNT SAP. THEY'S FEUDIN' AND FUSSIN' AGAIN...ABOUT THAT TIME DAN DUDLEY COME RUNNIN' UP, ALL OUTA BREATH, AND SAYS "UNCLE CYPE, THEY'S A BURGLAR JUST BROKE INTO YOUR HOUSE AND THERE AIN'T NOBODY THERE BUT YOUR WIFE!" UNCLE CYPE SAYS "WELL, IT'S TOO LATE TO WARN 'IM NOW!" (LAUGHS)

I SURE WISH UNCLE CYPE AND AUNT SAP WOULDN'T FIGHT SO MUCH. THEY COULD GET ALONG REAL NICE IF THEY'D TRY. WHY THE OTHER DAY UNCLE CYPE BOUGHT ANNT SAP A FUR COAT AND BROUGHT IT IN AND AUNT SAP JUST MIGHT' NIGH HAD A FIT OVER IT. SHE SAYS "I DON'T SEE HOW A PRETTY COAT LIKE THAT CAN COME FROM A SMELLY OLE SKUNK!" UNCLE CYPE SAYS "WELL, I KNEW YOU WOULDN'T THANK ME FOR IT, BUT YOU DON'T HAVE TO CALL ME NAMES!"...

ROD: 'COURSE, IT COULD BE THAT UNCLE CYPE'S RECENT OPERATION HAS SOMETHIN' TO DO WITH HIM BEIN' OUT OF SORTS A MITE. I'LL ALWAYS REMEMBER HIM A-COMIN' OUTA THE ETHER AFTER THEY'D REMOVED HIS APPENDIX. UNCLE CYPE HEARD THE DOCTOR SAY SOMETHIN' ABOUT GANGRENE SETTIN' IN, AND HE TOLD AUNT SAP TO HAVE THE NURSE BRING ANOTHER CHAIR INTO THE ROOM.
