MUSIC: "YONDER COMES A SUCKER"..... JIM REEVES

(APPLAUSE)

REEVES: Thank you, folks. Speaking for the entire Opry gang, I'd like to welcome you to another Grand Ole Opry !

GRANT: Featuring tonight: June Carter !... Chet Atkins.... Pete Stamper..... Del Wood.... the Opry Square Dancers... and all the Opry gang !

REEVES: And we've lowered the stage and heightened the ceiling because our guest tonight is high-jumpin', high-flyin' Bill Carlisle !!

(APPLAUSE)

(REEVES OVER)

REEVES: Our first guest tonight is a young fella a lot of you know. He wandered in backstage and didn't really plan on being on the show and since he's a little bashful and uncomfortable about the whole thing, I hope you'll give him a nice welcome. Here's our good friend from Dalton Springs, Kentucky..... Pete Stamper !!

(APPLAUSE & PLAYON)

MUSIC: " PETE STAMPER

(APPLAUSE & PLAYOFF)

REEVES: Mighty good, fella, thank you. Right here and now, we want to clear off a nice big circle on the stage 'cause our guest star is the kinda fella who needs a lot of room to operate in. Let's roll out the welcome mat for Bill Carlisle and his friends !

(APPLAUSE)

REEVES: BILL...before you start fidgiting around like a World Series pitcher..... let's give the folks some notice of where you'll be visiting in the weeks ahead.

BILL: Fine, Jim. (AD LIBS PERSONAL APPEARANCE DATES & PLACES COMING UP)

(REEVES OVER)

REEVES: And all you folks who need a lift and enjoy country music; drop in to see Bill and the gang. By golly, they'll lift themselves and you right out off the ground. Bill,...show 'em what I mean,...blast away on your new RCA release... "Uncle Bud!"

MUSIC: "UNCLE BUD".....CARLISLES
(APPLAUSE)

(REEVES OVER)

REEVES: Hey, Grant.....c'mere. What's this big grin you're wearin' tonight?

GRANT: Jim...this is my kinda weather. Fire-in-the-fireplace weather.

REEVES: Nothin' like proppin' up your feet and relaxin' in front of a blazin' fire.....

GRANT: (ADDING IT HASTILY)...with a pipeful of Prince Albert Smoking Tobacco.

REEVES: That's the final, perfect touch, Grant. A pipeful of P.A. is sheer smokin' comfort. P.A.'s fresh...crimp cut to burn slow and lazy and even...comfortable...and downright tasty. Natural tobacco taste.....rich and fine,

REEVES: Thank you, folks, thank you very much. Well, this is sorta RCA night at the Opry because here comes another label-buddy of mine and a real star. It's time for the best of pickins and here's Chet Atkins going on "Hidden Charm,"

MUSIC: "HIDDEN CHARM"..... CHET ATKINS

(REEVES OVER)

REEVES: Wonderful, Chet, thank you. Well sir.....better dust off the track once more because this next friend of ours is a fast movin, fast talkin bundle of cute fun. Here's June Carter !

(APPLAUSE & PLAYON)

REEVES: June, before you go, what was this about your boyfriend... always having two desserts after supper ?

JUNE: He says the first dessert is plain dessert... piece'a cake or pie... and the second dessert is puffin' away on his pipe packed with good Prince Albert Smoking Tobacco !
