Yes, Jim... I know they did. But you know something? I'm going to enjoy hearing from our next guest too.

REEVES:

Right, Grant...and that goes for everybody. Here she is...
that country girl who says the woman who drives from the back
seat is no worse than the man who cooks.....from the dinner
table........MISS JUNE CARTER !!

(APPLAUSE AND PLAYON)

JUNE:

(APPLAUSE AND PLAYOFF)

REEVES:

June....before you go, answer a question for me. Are you and that boy-friend of yours ever gonna get married?

JUNE:

Mister Reeves... I wish I knew. Sometimes he gets that look on his face... real happy like and contented lookin!.... like he was about to pop the question... but then he gets that same happy, contented look when he's smokin' his pipe loaded with Prince Albert Smokin' Tobacco... so I just don't fightly know.
