Be happy to, Hank Rod Brasfield is here...and Miss June Carter &

Right. And Chester Atkins...

GRANT:

... Der Wood... Tommy Jackson and the Opry Square Dancers...

SNOW:

...AND...Our very special guest...back after a long absence...

JIM REEVES!!

(APPLAUSE)

SNOW:

Now I want you to meet an old friend of mine... Hohenwald's gift to the nation....ROD BRASFIELD!!

(APPLAUSE & PLAY ON)

ROD

(APPLAUSE & PLAY OFF)

SNOW:

Some doctor once said that laughter was a great medicine for the world's ills. If that's true...Rod Brasfield is a whole bottle of tonic, But now it's "guest time"...so let's give a great big Opry welcome to a boy who's been away from the Opry TOO long...

JIM REEVES!!

S NOW:

Jim., it's good to see you, and be workin' with you again,

JIM:

It's good to be here, Hank...on the Grand Ole Opry once more.

SNOW:

They tell me you've got a great new record out, Jim...and that

it's movin' right along.

JIM:

Well. it's in the charts, Hank... and we have hopes.

SNOW:

I've got a couple of my own that I'm doin' a little hopin' for.

How about a sample for all the folks. Here he is, neighbors...

Jim Reeves...with his new RCA record... "BLUE BOY".

(APPLAUSE)

MUS IC:

"BLUE BOY"...JIM REEVES

(APPLAUSE)

SNOW:

Rod... I hear your girl friend Suzie has gone in for all the new fashions in women's clothes.

ROD:

Fitter yes! The other day she got herself a pair of them "pointy-toed" shoes...just to match her pointed head... I reckon. I swear I don't see how women wear them things. They CAN'T be comfortable.

SNOW:

Well., women will do lots of things just to be in style...or so they say. Now with men., it's different. To a man., comfort is everything., and that goes double if he happens to be a pipe smoker.

ROD:

...and..! think...with a good many of our Opry listeners. Some how or other...there's a lot of comfort and help for all of us in times of trouble...in these sacred songs. Here's one that I like...

Chester Atkins...and Wildwood Flower. Thanks a whole lot, Chet...that was great. Now...it's time we heard from our next featured performer...and believe me...we are gonna hear from her...she'll see to that. Your friend and mine...MISS JUNE
