GRANT: From the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville, Tennessee...the country music capitol of the world...here's the 1001st broadcast of the GRAND...OLE...OPRY...tonight starring the Young Sheriff...FARON YOUNG !!

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "LAST NIGHT AT THE PARTY"...FARON YOUNG

(APPLAUSE)

FARON: Thank you...thank you so much, folks...and welcome to the Grand Ole Opry. Grant...Grant Turner.

GRANT: Yes, Faron...what's on your mind ?

FARON: How about tellin' the good people who's on the show tonight ?

GRANT: Good idea. First off...we've got our regulars...COUSIN MINNIE Pearl...the Jordanaires...

FARON: Yes...an' Chester Atkins...Stringbean.....

GRANT: ..Tommy Jackson and the Opry Square Dancers...

FARON:and our very special guests...LONZO AND OSCAR !!

(APPLAUSE)

(FARON OVER)

FARON: We'll be hearin' from our guests in just a minute. Right now... it's the Jordanares...with a great spiritual... "This Little Light of Mine."

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "THIS LITTLE LIGHT OF MINE"...THE JORDANAIRES

(APPLAUSE)

FARON: Thank you, Jordanares...thanks a whole lot. Now.. I promised to get our guest out here...so let's have a great big Opry welcome for 'em... LONZO AND OSCAR ! !

(APPLAUSE)

FARON: Lonzo...Oscar...welcome to the Grand Ole Opry ! !

LONZO: Thank you, Faron...we sure are glad to be here. Aint we, Oscar ?

(PAUSE) I said... "ain't we, Oscar ?"

OSCAR: Ain't we...what ?

LONZO: Glad to be here on the Grand Ole Opry.

OSCAR: Are they gonna pay us ?

LONZO: Sure they're gonna pay us.

OSCAR: We're glad to be here...we're glad to be here.

FARON: Lonzo...you're all right...but that Oscar...he seems kinda dumb to me. Has he got all his marbles ?

(LONZO OVER)

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LONZO: Oh, don't pay no attention to Oscar, Faron. He ain't so bad. He's just a little silly...but he's all right after you get to understand him.

FARON: Say...ain't that the name of a new record you boys just recorded ?

OSCAR: That it is...that it is.

FARON: I thought so. Neighbors...here they are...Lonzo and Oscar...with their new Stardate record....."Things Look Silly Till You Understand."

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "THINGS LOOK SILLY TILL YOU UNDERSTAND"...LONZO & OSCAR

(APPLAUSE)

G RANT: *Say*, Faron, do you mind if I talk to the folks for just a minute ?

FARON: Not at all, Grant Turner. You just go right ahead.

G RANT: Neighbors, Christmas isn't very far off and I've got a suggestion that will make your shoppin' mighty easy. For all those pipe smokin' men on your list, why not give 'em the BIG, handsome pound tin of Prince Albert Smokin' Tobacco ? It's already gift wrapped and bright and Christmasey lookin' on the outside...

(FARON OVER)

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FARON: (INTERRUPTS) ^{yesiree} and on the INSIDE...it's that same...always fresh...always mild and mellow...crimp cut P.A. The locked IN flavor of the fine tobaccos just naturally give a man a cool...satisfyin'...COMFORTABLE smoke. And for the makin' man who rolls his own...P.A. just suits him to a T. It rolls so easy.. smokes so good.

G RANT: So, neighbors, if you're givin' this year to a pipe smoker O R ^o makin' man...give him the bright red pound tin of Prince Albert! Then when he opens it on Christmas morning... just watch his face as he lights up ^{dat} his first pipeful, Then you KNOW why they call Prince Albert...America's Joy Smoke!!

MUSIC: "LEATHER BRITCHES"...T. JACKSON..FADE UNDER AS BG FOR:

(FARON OVER)

FARON: Tommy Jackson and the Square Dancers and 'Leather Britches.'
Thank you, Tommy Jackson...thank you Square Dancers.

GRANT: Faron... I don't mean to step out of line...

FARON: You know you never do that, Grant. What's on your mind ?

GRANT: You know right after the square dance we always take time out
for the part of the show we call "hymn time." I wonder what
you've selected for tonight.

MUSIC CUE: SNEAK IN UNDERSCORE AS FARON STARTS TO TALK

FARON: Grant... this is one that's not as well known as some of the
others...but never the less...it's got the true feeling and
spirit. So if the Jordanaires will help me out...we'll try to
sing it for you. "How Long Has It Been."

MUSIC: "HOW LONG HAS IT BEEN...FARON & JORDS.

(APPLAUSE)

FARON: Thank you...thanks so very much. And thank you, Jordanaires...
for that help. Now...now it's time we had a little music from
one of our Grand Ole Opry regulars...so here he is...with
his guitar...to play that old, old timer... "Farewell Blues."
Chester Atkins !!

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "FAREWELL BLUES"...CHESTER ATKINS

(APPLAUSE)

(FARON OVER)

FARON: Chester Atkins...with "Farewell Blues." Thanks a million, Chester. Now...it's my pleausre to introduce that girl in a million...that gabby, gossipy gal from Grinders Switch...
COUSIN MINNIE PEARL !!

(APPLAUSE & PLAY ON)

MINNIE

(APPLAUSE & PLAY OFF)

FARON: Cousin Minnie, you planni n' on getti n' lots of kisses under the mistletoe this Christmas ?

MINNIE: I sure am, Faron...an' I have worked out a deal that beats that mistletoe business all to pieces. I am gonna get me one of them big pound tins of Prince Albert Smokin' Tobacco an' when the fellers want to load their pipes they'll have to gimme a kiss.

(FARON OVER)

FARON:

Well now...I don't know about that, Minnie...but I do know that any gal who gives her man one of those Christmas-wrapped pound tins of P.A. deserves a kiss. And why not! P.A. is always fresh...it's crimp cut and it always gives a man a tasty...cool...satisfyi n' COMFORTABLE smoke. Makin' men like P.A. for the same reasons...an' because In O.C.B. paper it rolls so easy...tastes so good. (APPLAUSE)

MUSIC;

"HAVE A LITTLE FAITH IN ME"...LONZO & OSCAR

(APPLAUSE)

(FARON OVER)

FARON: Thank you, Lonzo and Oscar, .and thank you for bein' our guests tonight. Come back again, . . . real soon. Now, . . . it's time we presented another of our Opry regulars, . . . a long tall skinny boy who plays the fire outa a banjo and sings a mighty mean song, The Kentucky Wonder, . . . STRINGBEAN, . . . with his latest Culman record of, . . . "I Wonder Where Wanda Went," Play it, String.

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "I WONDER WHERE WANDA WENT" . . . STRINGBEAN

(APPLAUSE)

FARON: Thank you, String, . . . thanks just a whole lot.

GRANT: Faron, . . . I been just bustin' to talk to you about this all evening, . . . so if you don't mind I'll just go right ahead. I've never heard you sing that song you did on the opening of the show, . . . and I don't recognize this last tune. Are these, by any chance, . . . new records ?

FARON: Somebody must have told you, Grant. As a matter of fact, . . . and all jokin' aside, . . . they both are brand new. They'll be out on the Capitol label day after tomorrow, . . . and I certainly hope all the folks are gonna like them.

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GRANT: You know they will, Faron..you just know they will. Folks.. here he is..Faron Young, the Young Sheriff...with the other side of his first number... "Last Night at the Party"... another great song... "A Long Time Ago."

MUSIC: GREY EAGLE...T. JACKSON...FADE UNDER AS BG FOR:

FARON: Well, Neighbors...that's the signal to be headin' out. It sure was nice havin' you here with us this evening at the Grand Ole Opry. Next week is the big Christmas show with Marty Robbins as your star...along with all the Opry regulars as his guests. Be listenin', won't you. Now...this is Faron Young sayin'.. "Thanks"..and we'll be seein' you NEXT week at the GRAND...OLE...OPRY !!
