GRANT: From the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville, Tennessee....the  
country music capitol of the world.....here's the one thousandth  
and sixth broadcast of the GRAND....OLE....OPRY....tonight  
starring.....HAWKSHAW FAWKINS !!

(APPLAUSE)

"I'VE GOT IT AGAIN".....HAWKSHAW HAWKINS

MUSIC:

(APPLAUSE)

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HAWK: Thank you....thanks just a whole lot and "welcome" to The  
Grand Ole Opry. We've got a great line-up for you....and here  
my old buddy Grant Turner to tell you about it !!

GRANT: Great line-up is right, Hawk ! There's cousin Minnie Pearl...  
The Jordanaires...

HAWK: Chester Atkins....Stringbean....

GRANT: Tommy Jackson....Ben Smothers and the Stoney Mountain  
Cloggers.

HAWK: ...AND...our VERY SPECIAL GUEST....that great entertainer  
JIM REEVES !!

(APPLAUSE)

(HAWK OVER)

HAWK: We'll have a song from Jim in just a few minutes. Right now,...  
it's The Jordanaires....with "Light Of Love."

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "LIGHT OF LOVE".....JORDANAIRES

(APPLAUSE)

HAWK: Thank you, Jordanaires....thanks a lot. Now it's my pleasure  
to introduce our guest for this evening. He's a great entertainer...  
and a favorite with Opry audiences everywhere.....that good  
lookin' boy from down Texas way.....JIM REEVES !

(APPLAUSE)

HAWK: Welcome to the Grand Ole Opry , Jim....it's great to have you  
as our guest.

JIM: Thank you, Hawk....it's a pleasure to be here....and thanks for  
that great introduction. I just wish it was all true. Especially  
that part about bein' "good lookin."

HAWK: Well now, Jim....you know you're better lookin' than some of  
the boys over there in the band.

JIM: Isn't everybody? I'm only kiddin', boys....I don't think any of  
us would take any prizes in a beauty contest !

HAWK: That's for sure, Jim. Tell me a little about yourself. What  
you been doin' lately?

(JIM OVER)

JIM: Oh....out playin' the personals, Hawk,...and makin' a record now and then.

HAWK: Yeah....I know. Some pretty GOOD records if you ask me. How about givin' us a sample. Here he is, neighbors.... Jim Reeves with his great tune....."Billy Bayou !"

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "BILLY BAYOU".....JIM REEVES

(APPLAUSE)

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HAWK: Grant Turner, step over here and answer a question. What does a man want most when it comes to pipe smokin'?

GRANT: That's hard to answer, Hawkshaw. A man wants a tasty... satisfyin' smoke. A cool...relaxin'...COMFORTABLE smoke. And he wants it every time he lights up !!

HAWK: Would you say he gets all that when he uses Prince Albert. Smokin' Tobacco?

GRANT: I always do. And judgin' from the fact that Prince Albert is America's LARGEST selling smoking tobacco...I say that just a whole lot of other men do too. HAWK: Now here's Tommy Jackson and his fiddle....along with Ben Smathers and all the Stoney Mountain Cloggers to lead the square dancin' to that old timer....."Bill Cheatham."

MUSIC: "BILL CHEATHAM".....TOMMY JACKSON & SQUARE DANCERS

(APPLAUSE)

HAWK: Thank you, Tommy Jackson....and Ben Smathers and the Stoney Mountain Cloggers....I never saw square dancin' to beat that !

GRANT: We always have great square dancin' here on The Grand Ole Opry, Hawk. ...no matter WHO is performin.'

HAWK: That's a fact, Grant.....it surely is !!

(GRANT OVER)

GRANT: Now it's gettin' on toward "Hymn time"; Hawk.... and of course, that means it's **your** time to sing. Have you picked out a good one for us?

MUSIC CUE: SNEAK IN HYMN UNDERSCORE.....SOFTLY....AS HAWK GOES RIGHT ON.

HAWK: Grant.... I sure have.....at least I think so. This is one of the old favorites with folks who listen to the Grand Ole Opry.... so if The Jordanaires are ready to give me a hand...we'll sing it for you. And nothin' would make us more happy than to have everybody in the audience join in....on...."Precious Memories."

MUSIC: "PRECIOUS MEMORIES".....HAWK & JORDANAIRES  
(APPLAUSE)

GRANT: Hawkshaw Hawkins and The Jordanaires singin' "Precious Memories." Hawk.....that was great !

HAWK: Thank you, Grant. But speakin' of something great....we have got a great entertainer comin' up next. He plays the guitar... and he's a great favorite with EVERYBODY....Chet Atkins.... playin' "Foggy Mountain Top."

(APPLAUSE)

(MUSIC OVER.....CHET ATKINS)

MUSIC: "FOGGY MOUNTAIN TOP".....CHET ATKINS

(APPLAUSE)

HAWK: Thank you, Chester.....thanks a whole lot. That was great. But now...now it's my pleasure to introduce one of our Grand Ole Opry featured performers....the gabby girl who says "an echo...is the only thing that can beat a woman out of the last word".....COUSIN....MINNIE..... PEARL !!

(APPLAUSE & PLAYON)

MINNIE'S ROUTINE

(APPLAUSE & PLAYOFF)

HAWK: Minnie....what's this I hear about Hezzy goin' duck huntin' and forgettin' to take along any shells. He must have been mighty dissappointed?

MINNIE: ~~Not~~ Hezzy. Just so long as he's got his pipe an' plenty of Prince Albert Smokin' tobacco along....he's happy.

HAWK: Well...you have to admit that he's got a point there, Minnie. If a man has plenty of Prince Albert along, he can usually make himself pretty comfortable. "I'D LIKE TO BE".....JIM REEVES

(APPLAUSE)

HAWK:

Jim Reeves....and "I'd Like To Be." A great song, Jim..... and done only as you can do it. Thanks a lot....and thanks for bein' here with us.

JIM:

Hawk.....it was my pleasure. Ask me to come back again sometime.

HAWK:

We'll do just that ! Now, folks....it's time we heard from another of our featured performers.....so here he is....that boy they call The Kentucky Wonder.....Stringbean.....with his great song...."I Wonder Where Wanda Went."

(APPLAUSE)

(MUSIC OVER.....STRINGBEAN)

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MUSIC: "I WONDER WHERE WANDA WENT",.....STRINGBEAN

(APPLAUSE)

HAWK: Stringbean with "I Wonder Where Wanta Went," I sure wish he'd find that girl.

GRANT: So do I, Hawk.....but right now I'm more interested in you. We haven't seen much of you lately. What have you been doin'?

HAWK: AD LIBS BRIEFLY ABOUT HIS PERSONALS AND SUCH....

GRANT: Well good deal, Hawk. It's time for a song.....so here he is, neighbors.....with another of his great numbers....Hawkshaw Hawkins....singing....."Freedom."

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "FREEDOM".....HAWKSHAW HAWKINS

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "GREY EAGLE".....TOMMY JACKSON...ESTAB. FADE AS BG FOR :

HAWK: That's it, neighbors. That's the story for tonight. It sure was nice of all of you to be here with us at The Grand Ole Opry. Listen next week,....when \_\_\_\_\_ will be your star...and he'll have \_\_\_\_\_ along as his guest. Now...this is Hawkshaw Hawkins sayin...'Thanks' and we'll be lookin' for you next week at The GRAND....OLE....OPRY !! (OVER IMMEDIATELY)
