(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "SINGING THE BLUES"..MARTY ROBBINS

(APPLAUSE)

GRANT: Marty Robbins... the boy with the golden voice... and one of his great songs... "Singin' the Blues." Welcome Marty... welcome to the Grand Ole Opry. It's a pleasure to have you with us.

MARTY: Thank you, Grant... thanks a lot. It's a pleasure to be here. But let's stop all this kind of talk and tell the folks who's on the show tonight.

GRANT: Good idea. First off... in the comedy line we've got Miss June Carter... Then there's the Jordanaires..

MARTY: ...Chester Atkins and his singin' guitar... Miss Del Wood..

GRANT: ...Tommy Jackson... his fiddle and Ralph Sloan and the Tennessee Travelers...

MARTY: ...and our very special guest... that good lookin' boy from down San Antonio, Texas way... CHARLIE WALKER !!

(APPLAUSE)

(MARTY OVER)

MARTY: We'll be hearin' from Charlie in just a few minutes. Right now it's time for some great inspirational singin'...and here are the boys who can give it to us. The Jordanaires...with...
"He Lifted Me."

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "I'M SO GLAD..HE LIFTED ME"...JORDANAIRES

(APPLAUSE)

MARTY: The Jordanaires...with... "He Lifted Me"...and a great job they did with that fine old spiritual. But now it's time we heard from our guest...so let's bring him on with a great big Grand Ole Opry welcome...CHARLIE WALKER !!

(APPLAUSE)

MARTY: Welcome, Charlie...welcome to the Grand Ole Opry. How are things down in San Antonio...and Texas in general.

CHARLIE: Mighty fine, Marty...mighty fine.

MARTY: Say, tell me somethin', Charlie ? Your last name is Walker...are you any relation to the famous WILLIAM Walker ?

CHARLIE: What station does he work at...or who does he record for ?

(MARTY OVER)

MARTY: He doesn't work,..he doesn't record for anybody. He was born right here in Nashville,..back in 1824,..and he was quite a hero. He fought all over the southwest and finally wound up by bein' shot in one of the Central American countries back in 1860.

CHARLIE: No, Marty,..I don't believe he was any relation of mine. You know there's more 'Walkers' in this country than you can shake a stick at.

MARTY: Well,..there's nobody shakin' a stick at YOU...especially since that great Columbia recording of yours came out. So how about singin' it for us,..right now ? Here he is, neighbors.. Charlie Walker with his big one... "Pick Me Up On Your Way Down, "

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "PICK ME UP ON YOUR WAY DOWN"..CHARLIE WALKER

(APPLAUSE)

MARTY: Charlie,..I know you come from down Texas way so I wonder if you'll answer a question for me. You hear a lot of stories about how proud you Texans are of your state. Are all those stories true ?

(CHARLIE OVER)

CHARLIE: Well...we're mighty proud, I have to admit that. But there's one thing we sure agree on with all the rest of the folks in the whole country.

MARTY: What's that, Charlie ?

MARTY: It certainly is, Grant...and thanks for remindin' us.

MUSIC CUE: SNEAK IN UNDERSCORE...SOFTLY....AS MARTY GOES ON...

MARTY: The hymn we've selected for tonight is an old timer and dates way back to the time before a lot of us were born. But it tells the whole story of simple Christian faith...and is one of my favorites. 'Who At My Door Is Standing.'

MUSIC: 'WHO AT MY DOOR IS STANDING'....MARTY ROBBINS

(APPLAUSE)

GRANT: Ahhhhhh wonderful, Marty...wonderful. That's a fine old hymn.

(MARTY OVER)

MARTY: Thank you, Grant. I'm glad you liked it. And now we've got an entertainer who I know is liked by EVERYONE. He's the "king" of the guitar players..and here he is..Chet Atkins...with a little novelty tune..."SPAGHETTI RAG" !!

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "SPAGHETTI RAG"...CHET ATKINS

(APPLAUSE)

MARTY: Chester Atkins and the "Spaghetti Rag." Thank you, Chester... your playin' is always a highlight of the show. And speakin' of "highlights"..our next performer is a "bright spot" in any list of entertainers. Here she is...just back from a triumphant tour of the West Coast...MISS JUNE CARTER !!

APPLAUSE & PLAY ON

JUNE

APPLAUSE & PLAY OFF

MARTY: Say, June...I read your boyfriend's little piece in the paper the other day.

JUNE: Oh...you mean when he said...*"A widow and her money are soon married again?"*

(MARTY OVER)

MARTY: Nooooo. I mean the piece he wrote about Prince Albert Smokin' Tobacco and how good it is. How P.A. is always fresh... and how it's crimp cut...to burn even and cool. GRANT: Thank you, Del... thanks a lot. Now, Marty... we've come to the spot in the show everybody's been waitin' for. The spot where you sing your brand new Columbia release of the theme song you made for the big Warner Brothers motion picture production of "The Hanging Tree."

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "THE HANGING TREE"... MARTY ROBBINS

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "STONY POINT"... T. JACKSON... FADE UNDER AS BG FOR:

(MARTY OVER)

MARTY: That's it, neighbors. You have been a wonderful audience and it sure was nice to have you here with us at the Grand Ole Opry. Next week Cowboy Copas will be "ram-roddin'" the show and he'll have that smilin' boy, Jimmy Newman, along as his guest. Listen then, won't you : Now this is Marty Robbins sayin' "Thanks"...and we'll be seein' you NEXT week at...the GRAND...OLE...OPRY !!
