GRANT: From the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville, Tennessee..the country music capitol of the world, here's the one thousand and thirty second broadcast of The Grand... Ole Opry...tonight starring the young sheriff, Faron Young !!
(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "I HEAR YOU TALKIN".....FARON YOUNG
(APPLAUSE)

GRANT: Faron Young and one of his great new Capitol discs.... "I Hear You Talkin". Welcome , Faron...welcome to The Grand Ole Opry. We've got a great show lined up for the folks...and one they're gonna enjoy !

FARON: That's for sure, Grant !

GRANT: There's that Opry favorite, Cousin Minnie Pearl...

FARON:Archie Campbell...Chet Atkins...

GRANT: ...Grandpa Jones...Tommy Jackson...Ralph Sloan and the Tennessee Travelers...

FARON: ...and as our special guest The Tennessee Ploughboy himself....EDDY ARNOLD !!

(APPLAUSE)

(GRANT OVER)

GRANT: We'll be hearin one of Eddy's great songs in just a few minutes. Right now it's time to introduce that nervous individual who always eats his ~~dessert~~ first....because his stomach is upset.....ARCHIE CAMPBELL !!

(APPLAUSE & PLAYON)

(ARCHIE'S ROUTINE)

(APPLAUSE & PLAYOFF)

GRANT: Archie Campbell, ladies and gentlemen....the sage of Bulls Gap, Tennessee. Which brings us right down to "guest time" on the show.

FARON: It certainly does, Grant....and our guest tonight needs no introduction to the Grand Ole Opry. Let's have a great big welcome for one of the greatest.....EDDY ARNOLD !!

(APPLAUSE)

GRANT: Eddy...it's certainly a pleasure to have you here with us this evening .

EDDY: Always my pleasure to be on the Grand Ole Opry, Grant. Faron.....you're lookin' mighty spry and handsome.

FARON: Fell. that way, Eddy.

(GRANT OVER)

GRANT: Eddy...we all know you've got a great new RCA record out that is headin'...as usual for you...right straight up there to the top.

EDDY: Well..... we're hoping, Grant.

GRANT: Anyway...here he is...EDDY ARNOLD....with a song about the.....'TENNESSEE STUD'..

APPLAUSE

MUSIC: 'TENNESSEE STUD'.....EDDY ARNOLD

(APPLAUSE)

GRANT: Faron, you're a pipe smoker. What do you look for in a smoking tobacco?

FARON: *Well sir* Grant, I know the proof is in the puffin'. *+* I also know *that* P.A. has the flavor most favored in the U.S.A. So, all I do is ask for a tin of Prince Albert and know that I'm gonna get the kind of smoking pleasure I want every time. *You know* That Prince Albert is always fresh.

GRANT: The very freshest, Faron. And you know why?

FARON: No, why?

GRANT: Because P.A. sells the fastest. So naturally it moves ~~the~~ freshest off the shelf to you.

FARON: *well Sir* I'll buy that. *you know* But while we're talking about Prince Albert, we've gotta say something about its mild and mellow flavor. For pipe smoking or roll your own, P.A. has got that smooth easy-going taste preferred by far.

GRANT: *well* You've already said it, Faron. But I would like to mention the fact that P.A. is mighty cool and steady burning. *of* That's because it's crimp cut to pack firm, *+* roll easy and smoke clean through without hot spots.

FARON: *Well, in just about does it* Well, that's ~~it~~, Grant. There isn't *two* much more *you can* to say.

(GRANT OVER)

GRANT: Thank you, Tommy....thank you, Square Dancers.
That was really nice !

FARON: I'll say it was, Grant !

GRANT: But I'll tell you something that maybe would be a little
nicer. The other day I was playing some of the songs in
your new Capitol Album... "My Garden Of Prayer"...and
I think it would be great if you sang a selection from it !

MUSIC CUE: SNEAK IN UNDERSCORE

FARON Thank you, Grant....I'd be happy to. I don't know
whether or not you can call this the "title" song or not...
but anyway...it's in the album and it's one that was always
a favorite of my mother's. Here it is...for her...and
everybody else.... "The Beautiful Garden Of Prayer."

MUSIC: "THE BEAUTIFUL GARDEN OF PRAYER"....FARON YOUNG

(APPLAUSE)

FARON: Thank you....thank you...thanks just a whole lot.

GRANT: Faron...that was great. But now we got to get on with the
show...because it's time we presented one of our featured
acts. Really though...this boy doesn't need any in
introduction...he's recognized as one of the greatest in
his field....Chet Atkins and his guitar with...
"Tiger Rag."

(MUSIC OVER....CHET)

MUSIC: 'TIGER RAG'.....CHET ATKINS

(APPLAUSE)

GRANT: Wonderful, Chet...wonderful. I don't see how a man with only ten fingers gets so many great notes out of a guitar. I swear I don't. But then...I always wonderin' about SOMETHIN'. Like our next entertainer, for instance. It's that girl who's been wonderin' how she can get a husband.....COUSIN MINNIE PEARL !!

(APPLAUSE & PLAY ON)

(MINNIE)

(APPLAUSE & PLAYOFF)

GRANT: Well now, neighbors...musical history isn't made very often.....but back about ten years ago, one of our Nashville boys cut a record for the Victor folks that really took over and "swept" the nation. That singer was Eddy Arnold...and the song went like this.....

MUSIC: "ANYTIME".....EDDY ARNOLD

(APPLAUSE)

(GRANT OVER)

GRANT: The one...the only...Eddy Arnold with his great all-time hit
...."ANYTIME". Eddy...it's still a great song...and you do
it better than ever. Thanks so much....and thanks for
bein' our guest .

EDDY: Grant....Faron...it's always my pleasure to be on The
Grand Ole Opry.

GRANT: Now it's my time to announce our next entertainer....
Grandpa Jones with his big record...that tells a sad story
but has a happy ending...."Don't Bring Your Banjo Home."

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "DON'T BRING YOUR BANJO HOME".....GRAND PA JONES

(APPLAUSE)

GRANT: Thank you, Grandpa...thanks a lot. Maybe I'll buy ME
a banjo and make some money. But before I do that...I
want a few words with our star. Faron...tell us a little
about your future plans !!

FARON: AD LIBS BRIEFLY ABOUT FUTURE TOUR OR RECORD DATES....

(GRANT OVER)

GRANT: Well, great ! Now....it's time for a song...so how
about that brand new Capitol tune of yours...
"Country Girl?"

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: 'COUNTRY GIRL'.....FARON YOUNG

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC: "ARKANSAS TRAVELER".....T.JACKSON...FADE AS BG FOR:

FARON: Neighbors...that writes "the end" right across tonight's
show...but before we go, I just want to say how nice it
was havin' you here with us at the Grand Ole Opry !
Be listenin' NEXT week when Hank Snow will be the star
and will have Carl Beale along as his guest. Till then...
this is Faron Young, sayin' "Thanks" ...and we'll be
seein' you NEXT week at....the GRAND...OLE....OPRY !!

(APPLAUSE & MUSIC TEN SECONDS)

(ENG. NOTE OVER)
