MOORE: Facing the rear of the plane? That's dangerous! Why don't

you face the front?

DURANTE: I TRIED IT THAT WAY AND THREE TIMES & GOD MY NOSE CAUGHT

IN THE PROPELLOR.

ORCH: (PYRAMID CHORDS)

APPLAUSE

MUSIC:

(QUICK FANFARE)

LUTHER:

Thanks to the Yanks of the Week! Tonight we salute all the crew of the Liberator bomber Sheasta which started out with eleven other B-24's on a fourteen-hour-long distance raid on the Celebes, Dutch East Indies. In thick clouds the other planes missed the objective, but the Sheasta attacked alone, smashing mine buildings, and hitting and beaching a freighter. Attacked by twelve new Jap fighter planes, the Sheasta, still alone, knocked down four for sure, and probably three more, and returned to her base with three hundred twenty-five bullet holes. SOUNDS

SLIDE WHISTLE THEN CRASH

(MORE)

Or "John's Other Wife" .... Alright Jimmy, let's go.

MUSIC:

BRIDGE

SOUND:

PHONE RINGS

DURANTE:

YOU TAKE IT PARTNER

SOUND:

PHONE UP

MOORE:

all enter -/Hello, Moore and Durante Circus. What? Me .. bare-back? You actually mean I'll have to ride bare back. Goodbye.

DURANTE:

WHO WAS THAT?

MOORE:

My laundry. . / But what's wrong with you, Jimmy? You look mad....

DURANTE:

AND WHY NOT ... I'M WALKING THROUGH THE MENAGEREE. I LOOKS THE I COMES FACE TO FACE WITH A MAN-EATIN' APE APE IN THE FACE, THE APE LOOKS ME IN THE FACE, I LOOKS AT THE APE, THE APE LOOKS AT ME .. AND WHAT DO YOU KNOW, THE APE IS BETTER LOOKIN: THAN I AM.

MOORE:

The ape is better looking than I like that. your are!

DURANTE:

(MAD) WHAT ARE YOU LAUGHIN' AT? HE'S BETTER LOOKIN' THAN YOU TOO.

Never mind that, Jimmy. Do you realize there's a ma coming down here to buy our circus? And if we don't.

SOUND:

DOOR OPEN AND SHUT

PETRIE: Gentlement I've got a consoftened act for your circus. I'm the greatest elephant trainer that ever lived. Every two hours I give the elephant a whole bag of camphor balls.

MOORE: You give camphor balls to the elephant? What for?

PETRIE: TO KEEP THE MOTHS OUT OF HIS TRUNK.

#### SOUND: DOOR SLAMS

DURANTE: EVERYBODY WANTS TO GET INTO THE ACT.

SOUND: PHONE RINGS. PHONE UP

MOORE: Hello, What? they goodbye...Jimmy, we're in trouble.

The half woman half man is now half woman and no man.

DURANTE: WHAT HAPPENED TO THE ...AN?

MOORE: He's been put in one half "A". Jenny we'd better check up on our other acts. We you push over and take a look at the tatooed. lady.

DURANTE: I DON'T WANNA! YOU GO LOOK AT THE TATOOED LADY!

MOORE: Why Me?

DURANTE: I'VE ALREADY SEEN THE PICTURES.

I better hurry over there before the prices change. Now

let me see ... melo gouna get

SOUND:

KNOCK ON DOOR

DURANTE:

ONTRAY-VOO --- AND COME IN, TOO!
