Barbara Jean Wong: A Delightful Voice From Christmas Past James R. Stewart Jr.

For over 53 years millions have put up with Boris Karloff as the Grinch. They have cheered the late Peter Robbins as Charlie Brown, the boy who seeks more meaning at Christmas time. After 58 years viewers still listen to Billie Mae Richards' Rudolph as he leads Santa's sleigh back to the Island of Misfit Toys. Every December familiar voice actors bring back generations of cherished memories of childhood and Christmases long ago.

Standing above these and other TV classics is one very special voice that has broadcast on the radio every Christmas season for 86 consecutive years. That is the voice of Barbara Jean Wong.

Barbara Jean Wong (1924-1999) was a versatile actress, singer, dancer, <u>drum</u> <u>majorette</u>, acrobat(!), and later a teacher. She was known as "The Chinese Shirley Temple" as a child. As a multi-talented and adorable little girl with curls the comparison to America's little sweetheart was very accurate, but it still could not fully describe her specialty as a voice chameleon who played children of all races on the radio well into her adulthood.

She had leading roles in two enduring Christmas classics from the Golden Age of Radio. Wong was the voice of Judy, one of the Barton Twins, on *The Cinnamon Bear* (1937), a captivating Christmas serial that is still broadcast on many stations today. On *Amos 'n' Andy* she was Amos' daughter Arbadella who No. 123

famously listened as her daddy recited the meaning of the Lord's Prayer. Considering her association with these and *other* radio Christmas stories, as a performer Wong is comparable to Lionel Barrymore as an essential figure in what made Christmas in Radio's Golden Age so truly special.

Born in Los Angeles on March 3, 1924, to parents Thomas and Maye Wong, she made front page news in the *Los Angeles Evening Post-Record* at the age of five (the press wrongly said four) for her dancing and singing abilities. She was soon acting on local radio stations. In her own words for a 1954 interview, "It all started back in 1932. I was [5] years old and couldn't read, but the director liked my voice so well he let me memorize the scripts". For station KFAC she was a cast member of the "Whoa Bill" Club. Wong acted in the radio skit "Billy and Betty" with actor Dorian Thompson on KFAC. Wong is believed to have been the first Asian American to work in radio comedy or drama.





As a child she attended the Mar-Ken School of Professional Children in Hollywood. Her most famous classmate was Mickey Rooney who also appeared on the *Whoa Bill* radio series. Young Barbara also studied theater in the famous Fachon and Marco School. Lesser known to OTR fans is that Wong was also trained as a performing acrobat by Sam Mintz and in tap dancing by Paul Dinus of the Mintz and Dinus Studios. Wong also had time for dancing under Mlle. Gita Rayera. A foreshadowing of her life-long association with Christmas entertainment were her acrobatic dancing performances that received top billing in kids Christmas shows in 1934 and 1935 at the Los Angeles Paramount Theatre. Another interesting foreshadowing event from 1934 was Barbara's first foray into films. She was one of several children to have a bit part in *Kid Millions*, a musical comedy starring Eddie Cantor. Another kid who also had a small uncredited part in this film was Bobby La Manche.

Wong was a regular on several West Coast series as a child, most prominently John Hix's *Strange as It Seems* radio series. She portrayed Alice (in Wonderland), a young boy genius, and a young Mariana Yurlova. News of Wong portraying George Washington as a 10-year-old boy was widely circulated in newspaper radio sections. It was suggested by quite a few radio chat columns that having a Chinese girl play so many parts of "American" children would itself make an appealing episode of *Strange as It Seems*.

By 1937 Barbara had become widely known as radio's "Chinese Wonder" when she was cast in *The Cinnamon Bear. The Cinnamon Bear* was a whimsical Christmas time radio serial for children written by Glanville and Elizabeth Heisch. In 26, 15minute episodes, it told the story of twins Judy and Jimmy Barton as they are guided by the Cinnamon Bear on the search for the Silver Star from the top of their Christmas Tree in the world of Maybeland. It has reportedly aired on radio every holiday season since 1937. Not only is that 27 years longer than the annual broadcast of TV's *Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer* (1964) but it is also 14 years longer than TV's annual *Hallmark Hall of Fame* Christmas movies (1951).

Although Wong has a lot of recognition in OTR history for her role of Judy Barton on *The Cinnamon Bear* today, the cast was initially uncredited and unknown for decades. In the case of child actor Bobby La Manche (1924 - ?) who played her brother Jimmy, his identity was a mystery until discovered and revealed by researcher Karl Schadow in 2021.

For most of her lifetime Barbara Jean Wong was more well known for her annual performance as Arbadella Jones on the *The Amos 'n' Andy Show*. In a short description, if that's even possible, *Amos 'n' Andy* (1929-1960) was initially a phenomenally popular nightly serial drama (1929-1943) with multiple African-American characters written and portrayed by White series creators Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll.

Christmas was always a special time on the Amos 'n' Andy series. It was Christmas Day 1935 that cab driver Amos Jones (Freeman Gosden) married his sweetheart Ruby Taylor (Elinor Harriot). The happy couple would have three children, the eldest being Arbadella. Arbadella was voiced for the first time. and for many years to come, by Barbara Jean Wong on the very special 1940 Christmas episode. Written from a suggestion by a minister, this Christmas Day episode depicts Amos explaining the meaning of the Lord's Prayer to his daughter as the scripture was sung by the Paul Taylor Chorus over her bedroom radio by a choir. The Amos 'n' Andy version of the Lord's Prayer may be the most famous interpretation of the prayer taught by Jesus in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Both the radio and TV versions (the latter performed by Black American actor Alvin Childress and child actress Patti Marie Ellis in 1952) remain Christmas classics.

Wong reprised her role as Arbadella annually, a role that she looked forward to each year. She continued the role into adulthood as a mother herself while Arbadella remained about eight years old. The tradition continued even when the series morphed into the *Amos 'n' Andy Music Hall* (1955-1960)\*\*. Her 20th and last time as Arbadella in an annual broadcast was Christmas Eve 1959.

Freeman Gosden was famously very emotional when listening to the initial broadcast in 1940. That changed very little over the years when the cast for the Christmas play expanded. In a 1954 interview with Wong, she described how emotional the cast, especially Gosden, could be when performing the Lord's Prayer, saying "You really have to be there to appreciate how much it affects the cast".

When Amos 'n' Andy changed into a half hour series in 1943, the Amos 'n' Andy Christmas show was performed live in front of a studio audience for the first time in 1944. The audience had to be informed in advance of the broadcast of Wong's performance as Arbadella so they would not be surprised her voice was not coming from one of the black children in the cast. "People are usually startled to find that a Chinese girl plays the part." said Wong "But I'm so accustomed to playing all kinds of nationalities nothing surprised me anymore." With Gosden and Correll, Wong as Arbadella, and scores of African-American entertainers in the cast, the 30-minute version of the *Amos 'n' Andy Show* may have had the most racially diverse cast of radio's golden age.

To expand the Christmas story to a half-hour series Wong's dialogue was expanded with the additional plot of Andy buying a talking doll for Arbadella by playing Santa Claus in a department store. Each Christmas story would begin with Arbadella telling her godfather "Uncle Andy" how much she wanted the talking doll in the Christmas store window. Her father Amos had explained to her that she wrote her letter to Santa Claus too late. Later in the broadcast Andy is dismayed at the box of crayons that he has for Arbadella's gift. Realizing that he does know what she wants, he gets a job as Santa to buy the talking doll. Arbadella's desire for a Christmas doll is interesting, coming a few years before the creation of the Amosandra doll in 1949.

Wong was far too talented to only appear in two Christmas productions. Since she also played boys as much as girls, it isn't surprising that she was also heard in one adaptation of *A Christmas Carol* as Tiny Tim. In an interview, Wong considered Tiny Tim as one of her best roles. Her performance was for the 1941 Decca Records adaptation with Ronald Coleman as Scrooge. Rounding out the cast of this recording were Eric Snowden as Bob Cratchit, Lou Merrill as Jacob Marley, Hans Conried as the Ghost of Christmas Past, Cy Kendall as the Present Ghost, and Gale Gordon as The Ghost of Christmas Future.



While researching Wong's tenure in California radio, it was discovered that she was advertised to have a lead role as a boy named Jimmy in the 1942 broadcast of *The Little Stranger*, an annual Christmas play from KFI Los Angeles. Written by Forrest Barnes and sponsored by the Bullocks' Department Store, it was the story of an orphan boy who is invited to his local church by a friend where he watched the Christmas Story enacted. In the initial broadcast in 1939, the role of Jimmy was played by child actor Billy Cook.

The 1942 production of *The Little Stranger* had many striking coincidences with *The Cinnamon Bear* and the Lord's Prayer. Wong played a boy named "Jimmy", which was the name of Judy's brother. Also, her co-star was Walter Tetley who was a prime suspect for decades as the voice of Jimmy Barton. Like the *Amos 'n' Andy* Christmas Show, the music was provided by the Paul Taylor Chorus. *The Little Stranger* is not known to exist as of this writing, and beyond press notices for the 1942 version, it is not known if Wong performed this role for another broadcast.

Wong retreated from radio and film acting after her marriage to Robert Wah Lee in 1950. With rebroadcasts of *The Cinnamon Bear*, and recurring performances on *Amos 'n' Andy*, some audiences through 1959 could unknowingly hear Barbara Jean Wong in two Christmas classics on the same day.

Radio was the theater of the imagination, and to Wong there was no color or race. Also in her case, no age. In the new medium of television, a 30-yearold Wong commented that she now found herself typecast as Asian women. The closest the medium came to featuring her in a Christmas special were those mysterious *Cinnamon Bear* puppet shows that aired from Chicago beginning in 1951. Also, in 1977, one of Wong's last feature films *The Man From Button Willow* (1965), an animated tale in which she played a little Asian girl, was syndicated to the television market for Christmas-time viewing.

Barbara Jean Wong Lee passed away <u>November</u> <u>13, 1999 at the age of 75</u>, just a few weeks before Judy and Jimmy Barton's 63rd annual return to Maybeland. Today via radio and the internet, she remains an enduring voice of Christmas past. This article was not possible without the research and writings of Ivan G. Shreve Jr., Karl Schadow, John Dunning, Elizabeth McLeod and many others. Materials on the life of Barbara Jean Wong Lee were also consulted from various California press articles, radio magazines, and the online collections of the Ken-Mar School, The Los Angeles Public Library, and the Museum of Chinese American History in Los Angeles.

# Favorite Christmas Episodes

We put out a call on the Old Time Radio Researchers groups.io for favorite Christmas-themed episodes and got several responses. Maybe some of these will add to your holiday season!

Steven Morris: "Lum and Abner's Christmas show. As they travel to an old barn where a young couple are about to have a baby. Any of the many versions of Dickens' A Christmas Carol. Fibber's Christmas shows are always good for a laugh."

Dan: "I have several that I love, but at the top of the list is *Amos 'n' Andy* where the Lord's Prayer is recited with meaning. It's been way too long since I dug it out."

Bob Stepno: "You just inspired me to do a quick search back through my online archive to see what Thanksgiving and Christmas programs written about in the past. I especially liked Superman's in-character message for the first Christmas after Germany and Japan surrendered, in keeping with the post-war brotherhood and anti-intolerance theme of the program. Of my newspaper friends, Casey and the cast of *Big Town* and *Night Beat* caught the holiday spirit, probably more than once. And, of course, having lived in Connecticut for about a third of my life, the radio adaptation of 'Christmas in Connecticut' is one I thought of on my list of newspaper movie adaptations."

Patrick Andre: "As a fan of police drama and detective shows, many did not lend themselves well to Christmas-themed episodes. Attempts to tie in the holiday often seem flat, as if they were forced to fit Christmas into the show.

However a few shows found success in their stories. Interestingly, two I find the best are based on true stories. In *Dragnet*, when Jack Webb was brought the script of "The Big Little Jesus," he was so taken by the story that it became the permanent replacement for their previous show, ".22 Caliber Rifle" for Christmas. In *Tales of the Texas Rangers*, the December 24, 1950 episode "Christmas Present" has a rather moving conclusion when a down and out man with children is accused of a crime, and nearly loses what little he had, including his children. The ending has him blessed with his lights turned back on, children home, food in the fridge, presents for the kids, and a job on Monday.

In a more fictional dramatic show, *Grand Central Station*, which has very few surviving stories, has one which was played annually – "Miracle for Christmas." In the December 24, 1949 rendition, the troubled ambulance driver, Mac, was played by Mason Adams with Ralph Platten as Dr. Mason."

Brian West: "I would love to give you comments, but I am terrible with remembering the name of some show and specific titles. I certainly love any Jack Benny shopping episode, "A Christmas Carol" with Lionel Barrymore, *Gunsmoke* and *Six Shooter* have excellent Christmas shows as do several other regular shows. I must have a list of 20-25 shows that I make sure to listen to during the holidays. One show that I particularly like but can't remember the name of stars Raymond Burr as an ex-con who finds out that his ex-wife married the cop who arrested him and how the season changes his ideas for revenge. I wish I could be more useful."

Jackie: "I liked the Dragnet episode where the local church to say someone had stolen the Baby Jesus from their creche. They had to go back to the priest and tell him that they could not find it and then a small boy comes in with the Baby Jesus. He told the priest that he had prayed to Jesus that if he would get a wagon for Christmas Jesus would get the first ride in it."

John Nicholson: "This is one of my favorite Christmas stories: *Hallmark Playhouse* 481223 The Story of Silent Night."

Rodney Bowcock: "I can help with a couple of shows that I like to listen to often. Offhand, the Archie Andrews Christmas shopping episode comes to mind."

#### CBS Radio Workshop (CBS Network / Sustained) This series was an experimental drama -- actually a revival of the earlier Columbia Workshop. The Workshop enjoyed a level of success, in spite of the fact that television was rapidly taking over the public's attention during the 1950s. Some outstanding talent made for an excellent series. In the early days of old-time radio collecting, some sources were incorrectly cataloging"The Enormous Radio" as a Suspense show because at that time, the open and closing of the show was missing. That was quickly corrected as collectors began researching logs and complete and superior recordings have since become available. 



# Messáge from Bob...

Jay Hickerson passed away this month. For 50 years, he published "Hello, Again" the longest running old-time radio publication, and was the center of the the old-time radio universe for many of us. He was beloved by both celebrities and fans. It's how many of us "found" each other, but a brief OTR history overview is in order at this time.

Let's start by describing the pioneer OTR collectors -- those who were active in the early 1960s perhaps airchecking the last **Johnny Dollar** and **Suspense** episodes broadcast, as well as those who found the transcription discs of the shows broadcast in the years before.

Then there was the second generation of OTR folks as the 1970s happened! Some of those people may have started, having heard re-broadcasts and purchased shows from the earliest dealers like **Dave Goldin** of **Radio Yesteryear** (and "Radiola Records") or **Rex Bills** of **Golden Age Radio**,

Dick Ayers, Don Maris, Larry Kiner, Bob Joseph (to name a few) -- there were a lot of dealers back then offering both cassettes and reel to reel tapes (not so much now!).

Clubs also sprung up with lending libraries like **SPERDVAC** and the **Old Time Radio Club of Buffalo**, **North American Radio Archives** ("NARA") and several others came into existence. The trading circuit among private collectors was also hot! Who had what? Who had the best sound? Who was writing columns in OTR club newsletters or self-publishing? Jay always knew and he supported them all and would give them a mention in his publication.

All this was happening before the internet as we know it today even existed or the audio formats existed on computers.

At the center of it all was the mild mannered and always friendly and generous Jay Hickerson, and his publication "Hello Again."

Jay had a "New Friends" section in his publication and his friends would return the favor. You could find Jay's publication and address in the back pages of the handsomely printed **Golden Age Radio** catalog. He later also supported early internet endeavors Lou Genco's like old-time.com where Jay had a web page of his own.

But that wasn't enough! Jay headed an organization called **The Friends of Old Time Radio** whose annual conventions served to honor radio celebrities who were still with us. It was also especially suited to unite all of US who were fans and **Friends of Old Time Radio**!

Recreations of shows and the dealers rooms basically took over an entire hotel 3-4 days each October. I was also a part of some of the after-hours gatherings lasting until 3 or 4:00 AM, despite the regular convention activities generally resuming at 9:00 AM! I would spend a year just preparing for these conventions!

Starting in the 1990s, Jay published **The Ultimate History of Network Programming & Guide to All Circulating Shows.** The main purpose, he wrote, was to list and date shows correctly. Several updates and expanded versions numbering over 500 pages were issued over the years. Prior to that, Jay was also the first to offer complete Jack Benny and Suspense logs (his favorite shows) among many others.

As I have often said, the thousands of shows offered here and on the website would not be here, were it not for a lot of people who are named in catalogs. **BRC Broadcast** has always been focused on finding the best quality, fine tuning, polishing and organizing the shows plus making them affordable for the general public. That motivation continues with these mailings.

Thanks Jay, and as always, we thank YOU for your support!
